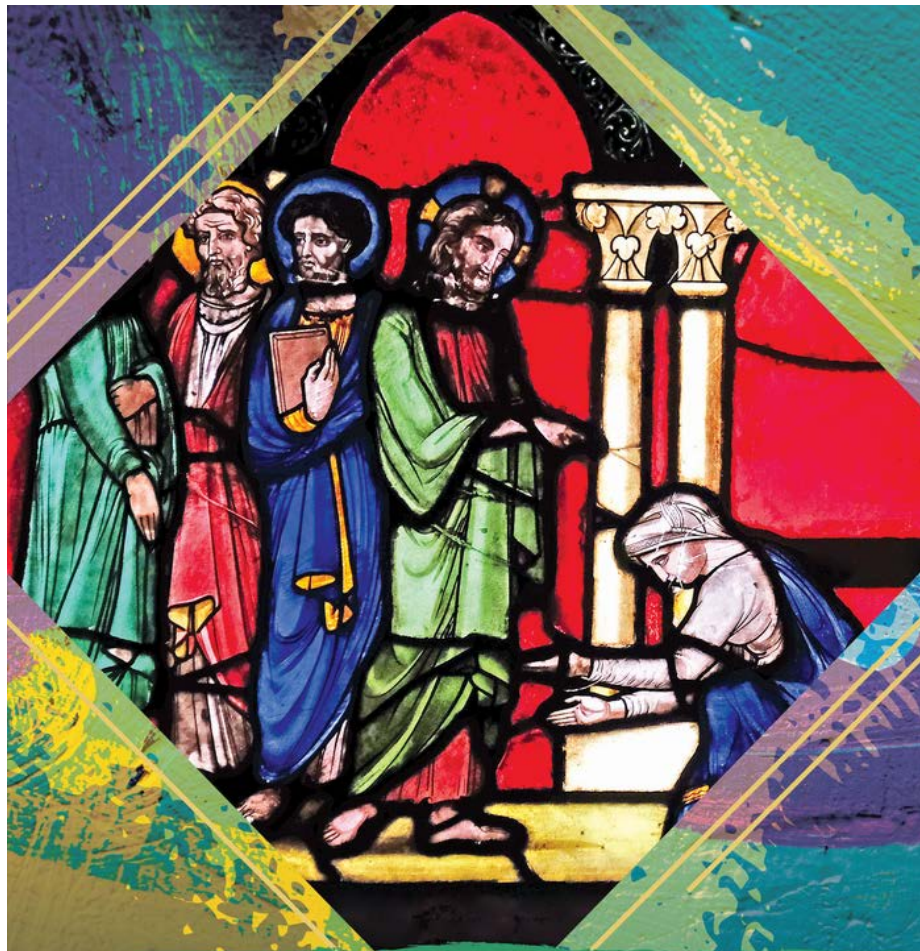

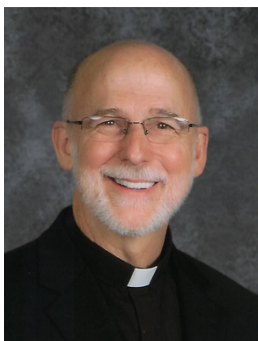

This Saturday, August 15, we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. (It is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year.) We believe that Mary, the Mother of God, was taken to heaven, body and soul, after her earthly life. This took place because of Mary's unique role in salvation history. Mary is not only the Mother of God, she is the spiritual mother of all the redeemed. The Church has

always seen in the Blessed Mother a foreshadowing, a preview, of our future glory. We look to the day when we will enter heaven, body and soul, when Our Lord returns in glory at the end of time.

Throughout the ages, holy men and women have looked to Mary for her powerful intercession and her motherly care. I have never come across a saint who has not held Mary in high esteem.

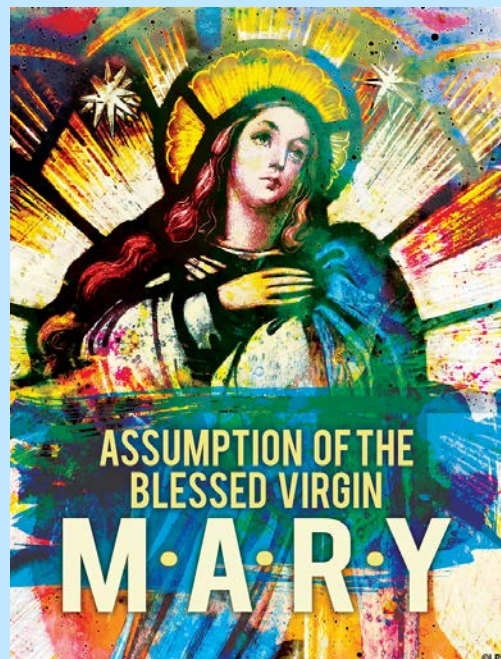

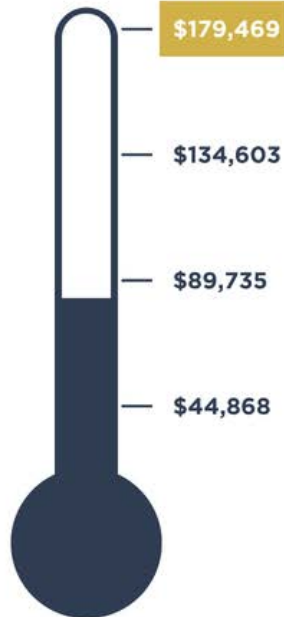

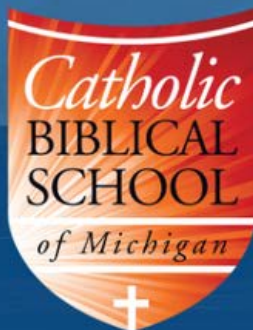

CALLING FIRST-TIME BLOOD DONORS....

Many people are hesitant about donating blood. Fear of needles, eligibility, and not having the right blood type are common concerns. Fear not, don't let these concerns prevent you from sharing the gift of life.

Fear of needles:

People ask if it will hurt when they insert the needle in your arm. The short answer, only for a moment. Pinch the fleshy, soft underside of your arm. That pinch is like what you will feel when the needle is inserted. Once inserted, you can relax, listen to music, talk to other donors or read while you donate. The actual donation of one pint of blood takes an average of about 8 to 10 minutes. If you're willing to spend a few minutes facing your fears, you may find that the satisfaction you feel makes it worth it.

I'm not sure I'm eligible:

For most donations, basic requirements include general overall good health, be at least 17 years old and minimal weight of 110 lbs. You are given a mini physical at your appointment to ensure you are healthy enough to donate.

What if I don't have the right blood type?

You may have heard that there is currently a shortage of Type O blood. Whether you are blood type A, B, AB or unknown, all types of blood are valuable and can help save lives. The most important thing is that you are willing to make this generous, life-saving donation.

Important Tip:

Make sure you eat healthy foods and drink extra liquids (water) the day of your donation. This will help improve your blood donation experience.

BLOOD: THE GIFT OF LIFE

Did you know that there are two types of blood donations collected by the Red Cross at our upcoming parish blood drive?

- **Whole blood** is the blood that flows through your veins. Whole blood can be transfused in its original form or used to help multiple people when separated into red cells, plasma, and platelets. Whole blood donations help save the lives of children and adults fighting cancer, blood disorders such as sickle cell and traumatic injuries.
- Double red cell donation, what the Red Cross calls **"Power Red,"** allows you to safely give nearly twice the amount of red cells and help more patients. Red blood cells are the most frequently used blood component and are needed by almost every type of patient. **Critical blood types that are eligible for Power Red donation include Type O, A negative and B negative.** Power Red donation takes about 30 minutes longer than a whole blood donation.

For further information on donating blood, go to redcross.org. **Don't delay, make that appointment today.** What better way to love one another as Christ asks us to do.

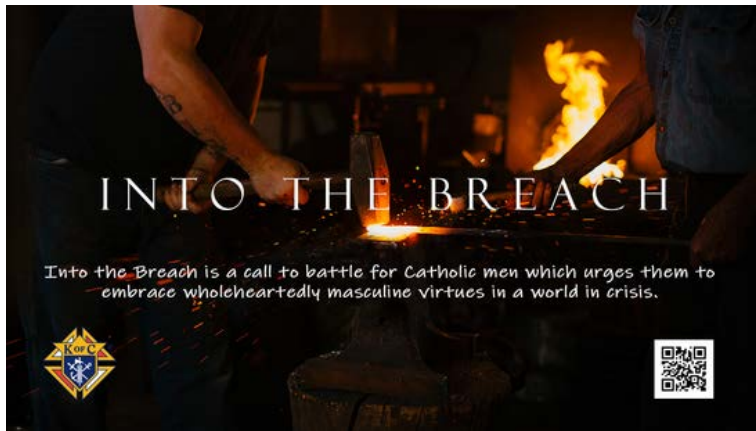

Prior to voting, Catholics are called to form their conscience in accordance with Church teaching.

This begins with living a life rooted in **Prayer, Scripture, Sacraments, and Study**. Ahead of researching the candidates and learning the issues, consider the following:

- Prayer: How often do I pray? How might the Lord be calling me to deepen my prayer life with Him?
- Scripture: How often do I pray with or read Sacred Scripture? How might the Lord be calling me to spend more time with His Word?
- Sacraments: How often do I frequent the Sacraments? How might the Lord be calling me to encounter Him more often in the Sacraments, particularly in Holy Communion and Confession?
- Study: In what ways do I seek to grow in my understanding of the Catholic faith and what I profess to believe? How might the Lord be calling me to deepen my understanding of the faith, and in what ways can I do that?

From conscience to concrete action: How Catholic social teaching illuminates the issues:

Forming one's conscience includes understanding and embracing the Church's social doctrine. Catholic social teaching flows from the same authority and Tradition as its teachings on faith and morals. It offers a refreshing, hope-filled perspective on current affairs because it is founded on God.

The themes presented in Catholic social teaching, originating in Scripture and further articulated through Church Tradition, are represented across the nine advocacy principles that guide Michigan Catholic Conference's public policy advocacy. These principles are useful to help Catholic voters understand current public policy issues through the lens of Church teaching.

- Upholding the dignity of human life
- Providing for the poor and vulnerable
- Welcoming immigrants and refugees
- Protecting religious liberty
- Supporting students, schools, and parents
- Strengthening marriages and families
- Improving access to healthcare
- Pursuing restorative justice
- Caring for creation and preserving natural resources

Catholic voters should evaluate the extent to which candidates promote these principles, with a particular emphasis on the protection of human life and the dignity that must be afforded to all people, especially those on the margins or are otherwise vulnerable in our society.
