Bayvale Elementary Goals

- I. By the end of the 2026- 2027 school year, BES will increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring at the Developing Learner level and above on the GM Math End-of-Grade Assessment from 61.11% to at least 65.11%, as measured by CCRPI and district assessment data.
- II. By the end of the 2026-2027 school year, BES will increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring at the Developing Learner level and above on the GM ELA End-of-Grade Assessment from 44.44% to at least 48.44%, while also increasing the percentage of students meeting grade level Lexile expectations across grades 3-5, as measured by GM and Georgia Insights Dashboard data.
- III. By the end of the 2026-2027 school year, BES will increase its student attendance rate from 64.60% to at least 71.84%, as measured by CCRPI attendance data and district attendance reports.

In the School

BES will work with students and their families to support students' success in mastering the standards in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

Students in School
