About the Board of Education

The Glen Cove Board of Education (BOE) is the governing body of the Glen Cove City School District. Its central role is governance. The Board sets policy, adopts the annual budget, works collaboratively to set the district's educational direction, holds the district accountable for student performance, and provides fiscal oversight on behalf of the community. The Board is comprised of seven trustees, each of whom must be a registered voter and have lived in Glen Cove for at least one year. Terms are staggered so that each year, at least two board seats are up for election. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, an elected student serves as a non-voting member of the Board.

A Board of Education meeting is a meeting of the Board to conduct its business in public. It takes place openly so the community can see its governance in action. Residents, staff members, and community members are welcome to attend. There are designated opportunities during each meeting for the public to comment. A livestream link is posted on the district website by GCTV. The decisions the Board makes shape the district's educational programs and the overall well-being of the Glen Cove community.

Board Meeting Information

Notices for all Board of Education meetings are posted on the district website, on the community digital bulletin board at Forest Avenue and Dosoris Lane, and at the entrance to Glen Cove High School. Regular business meetings generally begin at 6:00 PM during the school year unless otherwise noted, and they include a designated period for public comment on school-related matters. At times, the Board may hold an executive session, which is the portion of a meeting that is closed to the public and reserved for sensitive matters permitted under the law. When this is anticipated, the meeting notice will indicate that an executive session is expected, its expected duration, and the time the meeting will reconvene in public, which will be 7:30 PM.

Throughout the year, we will also host Community Forums in our school buildings. These gatherings are a chance for us to share information about our district and the work happening across our schools. We will offer a presentation, invite your questions, and have a conversation about what you heard. Community Forums are different from our Board of Education business meetings. Business meetings follow specific guidelines. The forums give us a dedicated space to talk with one another, hear your thoughts, and answer your questions in a setting built for that kind of exchange. Forums will begin at 7:30 PM. Dates are listed in the calendar and locations will be shared on the district website and through our regular communication channels. We hope you will join us. Scheduled meeting dates are listed on the last page of this calendar.

A Message from the Superintendent of Schools

Dear Glen Cove Families and Community,

Of everything the district sends home, the calendar is the one thing that survives. It gets pinned to the wall, marked up in three colors of pen, and consulted whenever somebody needs to know if there is school on a Tuesday in February. That is a lot of daily use, so I am grateful for the space to say hello and welcome back!

This is my second year as superintendent and my twelfth in Glen Cove. Twelve years is long enough to have watched some of the first students I met at Glen Cove High School move back to the community to raise their own children. I did not stay this long by accident. I stayed because of the people here, the students, the staff, and the community around us.

Last year gave us plenty of chances to prove the strength of that community. We grieved together and we held each other through it. We met storms, outages, construction, and a few things no plan fully prepares anyone for, and each time our staff kept students calm, safe, and learning. Most days our children never felt the busyness happening behind the scenes. We worked through a hard budget season honestly and in public, and this community stayed with us from the first workshop through the vote. That is not something every district can say, and I do not take your trust in our central administration lightly.

There was also a great deal to be proud of. Our elementary schools climbed in regional rankings. Our students earned recognition in the arts, in athletics, and in Advanced Placement coursework. On that last point, we have added a page to the district website, found under Find It Fast, that lists every post secondary institution where our seniors have been accepted. Scan the QR code on this page to see the full list. These accomplishments belong to all of us, and I am proud to be our district's champion throughout.

The second QR code on this page will take you to my weekly newsletter. It is publicly available to anyone on the district website under the Superintendent's Office page, and it goes out to families through ParentSquare every Tuesday. It is the easiest way to know what is happening in our schools and what we are consistently so proud to share about our students and staff.

So use the calendar. Come to the concert even if your own child is not in it. Show up for a game on a cold night. Ask a question at one of our new community forums. A district is only as strong as the number of adults engaged in support of the work of our staff and invested in the success of our students.

I am looking forward to the year with all of you.

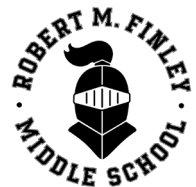

Pre-Kindergarten

The Glen Cove CSD offers a free, full-day Universal Pre-K standards-based program that aims to build strong foundational skills that help prepare students for kindergarten. The program is open to children who will be four years old on or before December 1 of the school year. Funded by New York State's UPK Grant Program, the Pre-K program includes classes within the district and at local community-based sites. Transportation is not provided.

Applications for the upcoming school year open in December, and available spots are filled through a lottery held in February. Registration must be completed online and include required documents such as proof of age, immunization records, proof of residency, and a parent/guardian photo ID. Placement is not guaranteed, and students not selected will be placed on a waitlist. For more information, visit the district website www.glencoveschools.org or contact the UPK office at 516-801-7008.



Eligibility for Kindergarten

A child who is five years of age on or before December 1 is eligible to enter kindergarten in the fall of that year. Kindergarten registration takes place in the preceding spring. At that time, parents must provide proof of residency and a birth certificate or other acceptable legal proof of age. A physical and dental examination is also required. Proof of the examinations, plus information concerning dates of immunization and any communicable disease the child has had, must also be submitted to the school district health office at the time of registration. Please scan the QR code to access our registration webpage.



First Year Primary Admission

A child six years of age on or before December 1 is eligible to enter first grade in the fall of that year. A child who turns six years of age after December 1 may be eligible for first grade if:

The child has attended and satisfactorily completed a full year's work at a registered nonpublic kindergarten;

The child has attended an unregistered nonpublic kindergarten, and:

Glen Cove School officials determine that the kindergarten attended provided a substantially equivalent instruction to that child as in a registered or public kindergarten. (Equivalency will be determined using the regulations of the commissioner for registration of nonpublic schools and kindergartens.)

The child satisfactorily completes a selection of tests chosen by school authorities.

The child demonstrates the physical, social and emotional maturity necessary for first-year primary success.



Transportation

Transportation to and from the Glen Cove Schools is provided for all children in kindergarten through grade 5 and to students in grades 6 through 12, who live more than one mile from the school they attend (as measured over the shortest available route). In compliance with New York State law, the district provides equal transportation services for Glen Cove children in grades K through 12 attending nonpublic schools up to 15 miles from their homes.

Please note: The deadline for submitting an application for transportation to nonpublic schools is on or before April 1, 2027 for the 2027-2028 school year. Although distances are measured from the student's home to the school, the law does not require a school bus to pick up a student at his or her front door. In most cases, students are required to walk to bus stops designated and approved by the Glen Cove Board of Education. Family Education Rights and Privacy Act

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act affords both parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the district receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

1. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.

Parents or eligible students may ask the Glen Cove School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the district decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the district will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment.

Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

2. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board; a person or company with whom the district has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant or therapist); or a parent or student serving on a special committee,

such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the district discloses education records without consent to officials

of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

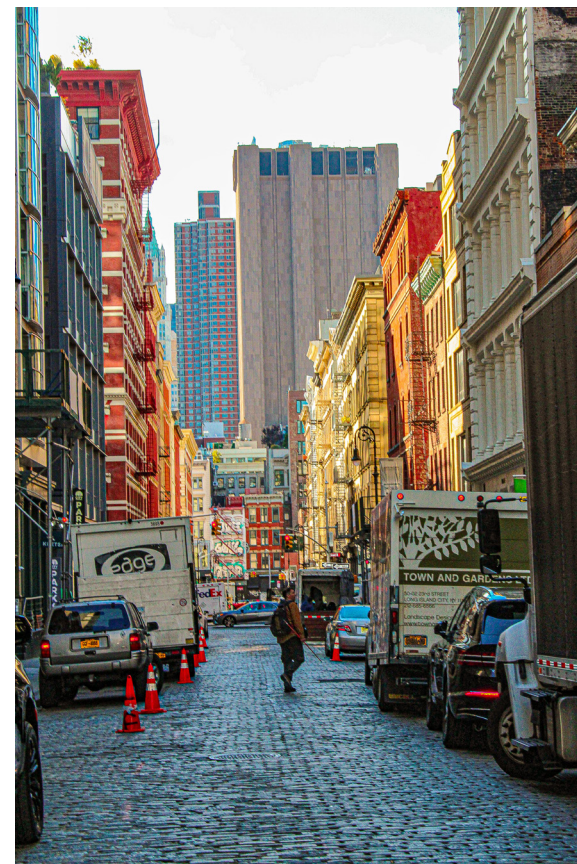
3. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failure by the district to comply with the requirements of FERPA. Title 45

Unless objection to any of the specific items of information following is submitted in writing by parents or legal guardians or by those students themselves who are over the age of 18 years, the Glen Cove School District herewith gives notice of intention to provide, release or publish in the newsletters, school or student newspapers, website and other social media platforms, magazines, yearbooks, or other publications, daily or weekly newspapers, athletic programs and/or news releases all of the following information pertaining to students as may be appropriate under the circumstances: name of student, names of parents, address, age, height, weight, grade, major field of study, participation in recognized school activities, extracurricular activities and sports programs, academic honors, achievements, awards, scholarships and similar information. Those objecting to such release must make specific requests to the Superintendent of Schools on or before October 1 of each school year. Failure to make such a request shall be deemed consent to release, provide or publish the directory information.

Title IX

Title IX is the portion of the Education amendments of 1972 which prohibits sex discrimination in federally assisted programs. On July 21, 1975, the final Title IX regulations went into effect. Specifically, Title IX states: No person in the United States, shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefit of, or be subjected to discrimination under an education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. The major policy areas include educational programs and athletics, physical education and employment. DASA - Dignity for All Students Act

The Dignity for All Students Act (DASA) was enacted by New York State in 2010 and took effect on July 1, 2012. This law protects students from harassment, discrimination, and bullying by other students or school employees. DASA ensures that no student shall be subjected to discrimination based on their actual or perceived race, color, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, weight (or other physical features), sexual orientation, gender identity, or biological sex. DASA explicitly states that bullying, taunting, and intimidation on the protected grounds listed above are all forms of harassment; however, it is not limited to those categories.

Harassment under DASA is defined as the creation of a hostile environment through:

- Repeated conduct or verbal threats; intimidation or abuse that has or would have the effect of unreasonably and substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities or benefits, or mental, emotional or physical well-being;
- Conduct, verbal threats, intimidation or abuse that reasonably causes or would reasonably be expected to cause a student to fear for their physical safety.

In response to this new law, and following the recommendation of the NYS School Boards Association, Glen Cove School District has reviewed its policies related to student conduct and social-emotional learning and has strong procedures in place to deal with these issues. The required updates have been made and are now included in the Board Policies as well as the Code of Conduct for students. These documents can be found on the school website on the Board of Education page at www.glencoveschools.org. The QR code provided will take you directly to our website's District Plans page, where these documents can be found.

Building principals will serve as Dignity Act Coordinators in each of our schools and the Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, and Technology will be serving as the District DASA Coordinator. All employees will continue to be provided with Dignity Act training during this school year. Instruction will be given to students regarding this act as well. The District will also continue to deliver its curriculum to promote respect and other age-appropriate resources. As is always the case, a partnership between home and school is essential.

Special Education

The Glen Cove School District runs a comprehensive special education program meeting the specific needs of students from primary grades up to age 22, with a full continuum of services to address the individual needs of the student identified with disabilities. For specific

Attendance

The state education law permits legal absence or tardiness for the following reasons only: sickness or death in family, impassable roads or weather making travel unsafe, religious observance, required presence in court. Parents are requested to advise the school by telephone early in the morning of the reason for a child's absence or lateness and to provide the student with a written excuse when they return to school.

Student Health

All students must have documented proof of immunity in accordance with the New York State Department of Health, Public Health Law 2164, to be admitted to school on the first day. Immunization requirements can be found on our website at www.glencoveschools.org under Families, Student Health.

Parents' Right To Know

In accordance with the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, the Glen Cove School District is required to notify parents of each student attending a Title I school that they may request information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's teacher(s) and paraprofessional staff. NCLB allows parents to ask for the following information about their child's classroom teacher(s):

- Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status, through which state qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived;
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications. Please contact the Superintendent's office in writing if you require this information.

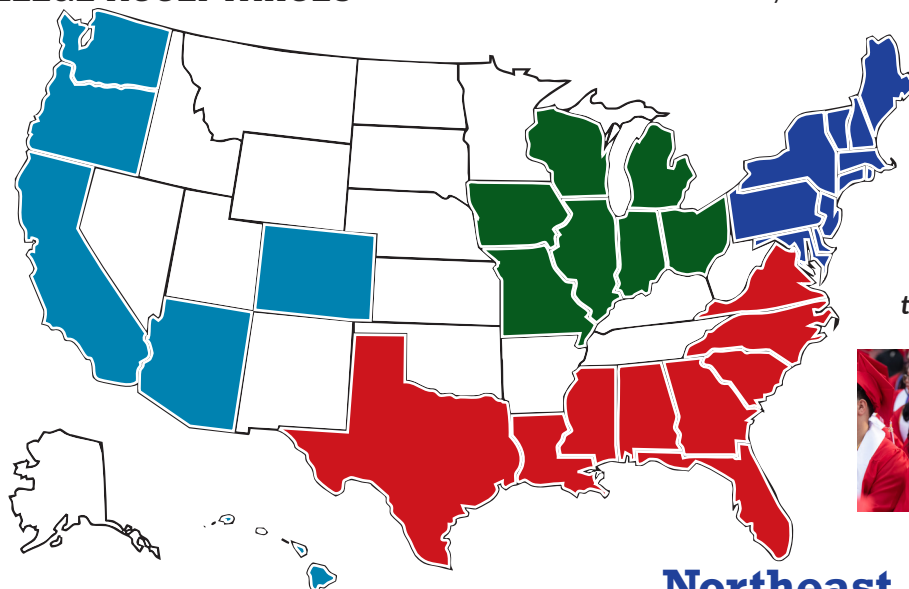

Code of Conduct Summary

This summary of the school district's **Code of Conduct** has been developed as required by the New York State SAVE Act and will be distributed to students and parents at the beginning of the school year. A complete copy of the Code of Conduct is available upon request by contacting the building where your child attends school or on the district website.

This code has been adopted by the School Board and submitted to the New York State Education Department as required by law. The Code applies to all students, school personnel, parents, and other visitors when on school property (including school buses and vehicles) or attending a school function

The Code contains the following provisions:

- Appropriate conduct, dress and language when on school property, including a school function.
- Acceptable civil and respectful treatment of teachers, administrators, other school personnel, students, and visitors on school property or at a school function.
- Appropriate range of disciplinary procedures that may be imposed for violations of the Code.
- Roles of teachers, administrators, other school personnel, the Board of Education and parents.
- Standards and procedures to ensure the security and safety of students and school personnel.
- Provisions for the removal from the classroom, school property (including school functions) of students or other persons who violate the Code.
- Disciplinary measures for possession or use of illegal substances or weapons, the use of physical force, vandalism, violation of another student's civil rights, and threats of violence.
- Provisions for detention, suspension and removal from the classroom of students including plans to ensure continued educational programming and activities for such students.
- Procedures by which violations are reported, determined, discipline measures imposed, and such measures carried out.
- Provisions which ensure that enforcement of the Code are in compliance with state and federal laws relating to students with disabilities.
- Procedures for notifying local law enforcement agencies of Code violations which constitute a crime.
- Provisions for notifying persons in a parental relation to the student of Code violations by the student.
- Provisions and procedures by which a complaint in criminal court, a juvenile delinquency petition or person in need of supervision petition as defined in article three and seven of the Family Court Act will be filed.
- Circumstances under and procedures by which referral to appropriate human services agencies will be made.
- A minimum suspension period, for students who repeatedly are substantially disruptive of the educational process or substantially interfere with the teacher's authority over the classroom, provided that the suspending authority may reduce such period on a case-by-case basis to be consistent with any other state or federal laws.

The **Code of Conduct** shall be developed in collaboration with students, teachers, administrators, parent organizations, school safety personnel and other school personnel and shall be approved by the Board of Education.
