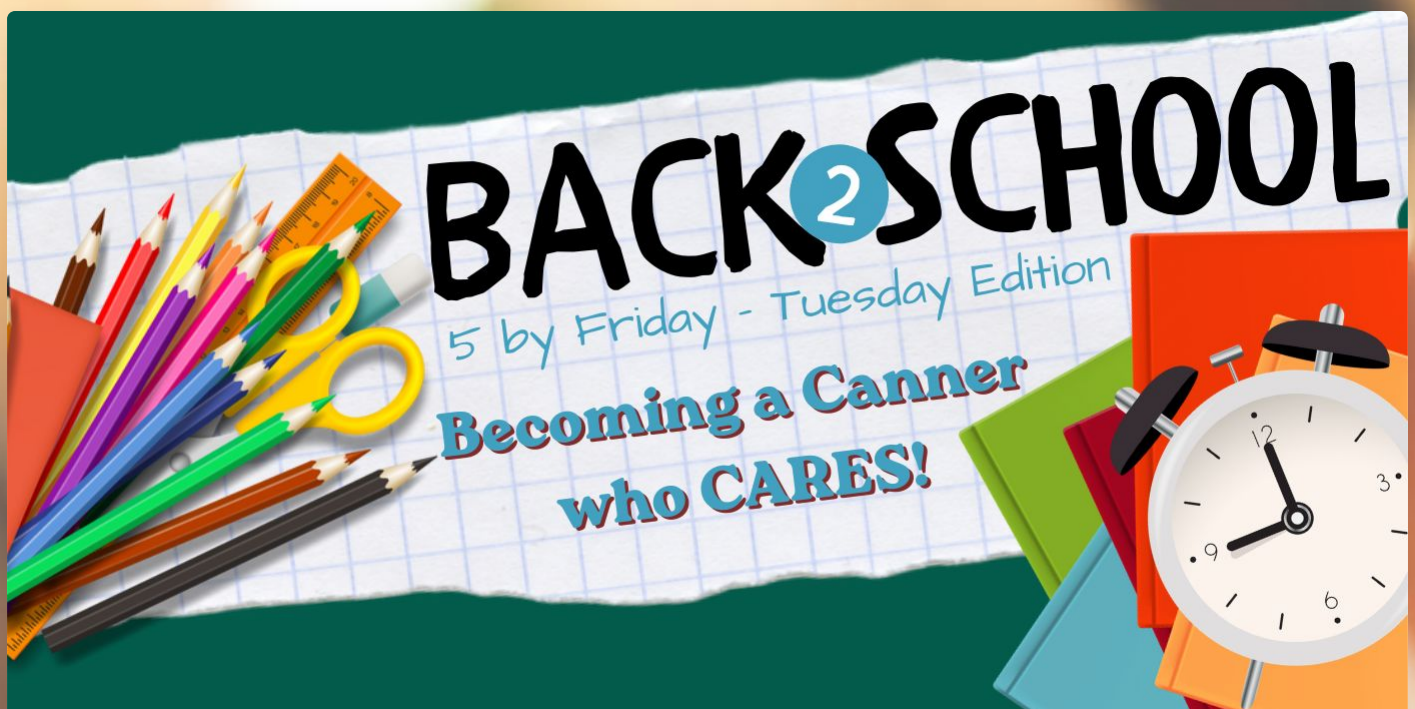




Growing Into a Canner Who CARES!

Upper Adams Intermediate School has adopted a comprehensive behavior management plan called **Canner CARES**. The goal of this program is to teach students how to participate in all educational opportunities while maintaining a safe school environment. Likewise, it empowers students to be responsible, productive, and ethical individuals at school and in the community, ultimately molding them into students who are college and career ready. At the heart of the program are five expectations that apply to all areas of the school, on the school grounds, and on the school bus . . . all the time, every day.



The expectations of our Canner CARES Program are: **Cooperation, Accountability, Respect, Effective Learner and Citizen, and Self-Control**. To give you a better idea of how the program works, we have listed below several examples of the actions within each area that we insist upon from our students.



COOPERATION

- Look for opportunities to include others and take turns.
- Be considerate of other students' learning.
- Pay attention and respond appropriately to your teacher, bus driver, and/or other adults on duty.
- When a bell or whistle sounds, get where you need to go without delay and listen quietly for instructions to be given.
- Follow school rules and encourage your friends to do the same.



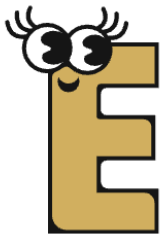
ACCOUNTABILITY

- Use kind words and actions toward other students and adults.
- Play in a safe and orderly manner and when finished, return equipment to its proper place.
- Keep hallways clean and free of marks on the floor.
- Respect others' privacy and refrain from vandalizing bathrooms.
- Be an active learner by participating in class and maintaining organization for yourself and the classroom.



RESPECT

- Use words like 'please' and 'thank you' and maintain school-appropriate conversations.
- Follow directions of adults on duty and treat adults with respect.
- Speak to others without name calling, arguing, or teasing.
- Stay on task, follow instructions, and respect how other students learn.
- Be quiet and attentive to those who are speaking.



EFFECTIVE Learner & Citizen

- Report unsafe behaviors to an adult immediately.
- Use playground equipment properly, show good sportsmanship, and apologize for accidents.
- Use the restroom at the appropriate time and for the appropriate reasons.
- Follow directions given the first time, always try your best, turn in work on time, and when absent,



SELF-CONTROL

- Stop, think, and make good decisions.
- Keep hands and feet to yourself and respect the space of others.
- Use supplies and equipment appropriately.
- Never throw things out of the school bus window.
- Be considerate of students' learning when moving in the hallways by staying in line and moving quietly.



Teachers will review and discuss all aspects of the program with their students during the first several weeks of school. Together they will work to develop classroom indicators that help explain each of the key points of the plan. Signs are posted throughout the building as reminders for all. The goal of our C.A.R.E.S. program is to equip your child with the necessary tools to be successful at school, at home, and in the community!

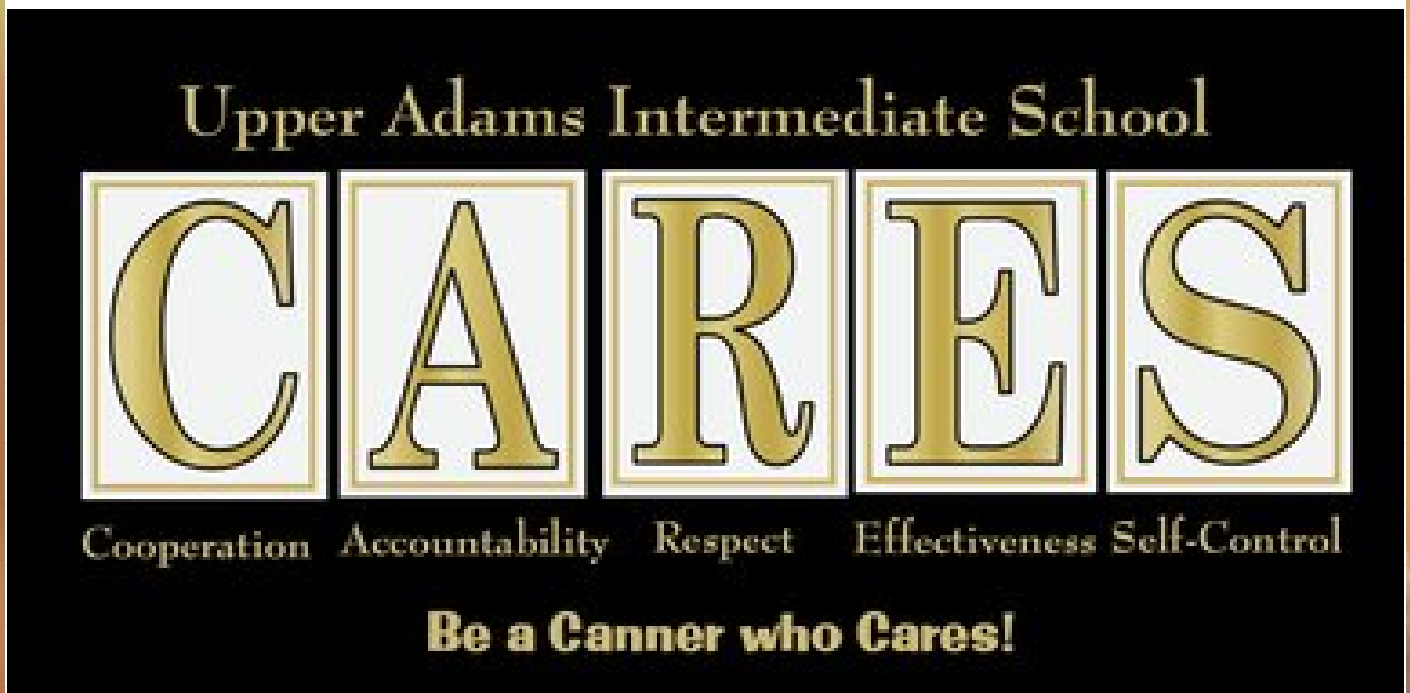
- Be respectful, polite and responsible while on the school bus ... no horseplay ... sit in your seat, face forward, and speak quietly to your seat partner.

Keep in Mind . . .

This plan does not replace the rules as printed in the [Parent/Student Handbook](#). Instead, it provides a framework for students to more easily understand the rules and their importance.

This framework also allows teachers to address inappropriate behavior by relating it to one or more of the expectations. Students are expected to act in a manner consistent with the school's behavior expectations. When a student's behavior causes a disruption, injury, or continuous annoyance, an infraction is assigned and recorded to document the inappropriate behavior. Consequences for infractions are based on the frequency and severity of the student's misbehavior.

Recognition for a Job Well Done!

Everyone loves to be recognized for a job well done. The C.A.R.E.S. program allows for several levels of student recognition:

Daily Rewards - Canner Apples - Apples are given to students to acknowledge positive behaviors. Students turn their apples in at the office. Names of recipients will be announced during morning announcements. Students come to the office to get their apple to take home. They are also given a smaller Apple Bingo 'button' which they are encouraged to place on our C.A.R.E.S. Bingo board.

Canner C.A.R.E.S. Bingo - Any student who is awarded an apple will be invited to play Canner C.A.R.E.S. BINGO. Every time someone receives an apple, they will be able to add an Apple Bingo Button to the Bingo board. When the board is filled with student buttons, Mrs. Buckley will draw several Bingo numbers to see who wins a prize from her prize cart. Afterwards, the Bingo board will be cleared and the fun will start again.

Student Certificates / Monthly Gold Stars: At the start of the new school year, a Canner C.A.R.E.S. certificate will be printed for every student. At the end of the month, students will be awarded for appropriate behavior by placing a star on their certificate.

Monthly Rewards: Students who earn their star for the month will be rewarded with a special activity within their grade level.

End of Year Rewards - As the school year ends, students will be rewarded for the number of stars they were able to earn throughout the school year.
