K-8 DRESS CODE

Students are expected to follow the Pinellas County Schools Code of Student Conduct and the Madeira Beach Fundamental dress code. Clothing must be clean, properly fitted, and worn as designed. The administration determines what is appropriate for school.



WHAT YOU CAN WEAR



Jeans, pants, slacks, sweatpants, or nylon jogging pants



Uniform shorts in khaki, navy, black, or grey (no more than 3 inches above the knee)



Dresses, skirts, and shorts no more than 3 inches above the knee (including with leggings/jeggings)



Shirts, blouses, and sweaters with **sleeves** that cover the shoulders and midriff at all times



Shoes must have a heel strap. Sneakers are required for P.E.



Hats may be worn outside for P.E. or with administrative approval



Decorative scarves



Clothing as outlined in special bulletins for spirit days and special events



WHAT YOU CANNOT WEAR



Cargo shorts



Crocs, flip-flops, slides, roller skates, skate shoes, or bedroom slippers



Tank tops, sleeveless tops, halter tops, off-the-shoulder, or clothing that exposes the midriff



Ripped, torn, or see-through clothing



Pajamas, loungewear, yoga pants, spandex, or sleepwear



Clothing that is see-through or resembles undergarments; undergarments must be covered



Clothing/jewelry with profanity, violence, sexual, gang, drug, alcohol, or tobacco messages or images



Sunglasses worn indoors (unless medically approved)



Visible body piercings (except ears)



Visible tattoos or writing/drawings on the body



Unnatural hair colors (blue, green, pink, purple, etc.)



Neck collars, dog collars, or heavy chains



CONSEQUENCES FOR VIOLATIONS

Students who violate the dress code may be required to change clothing, receive disciplinary consequences, or be referred to the Intervention and Appeal Committee for repeated violations.



PARENTS & VISITORS

Parents and visitors are expected to dress in a manner appropriate for a school setting.
