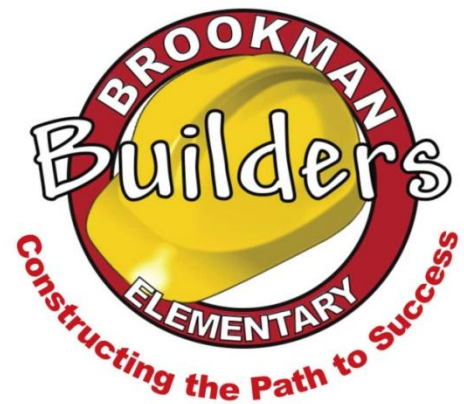

Brookman ES Parent Involvement Policy 2026-2027

The administration, staff, and parents of Brookman Elementary School believe that we must all work together to assist students in reaching the highest level of achievement possible. We expect students to master grade level standards using problem solving strategies as independent responsible citizens. Through various formative and summative assessments, students will demonstrate mastery of concepts and skills and be able to apply them to new academic experiences. By differentiating instruction, using actively engaging lessons and interventions, family involvement, collaborative efforts, appropriate resources, materials and opportunities for self-reflection (teacher/student), students will be supported in their learning experiences.

This policy has been developed and agreed upon by the administration, staff, and parents at Brookman Elementary School. The school will convene an annual meeting on August 27, 2026, at a convenient time for parents, to evaluate this policy. If needed, another meeting time will be provided. The policy will also be posted on the school's website.

Brookman Elementary School's Parent and Family Engagement Policy will be distributed to parents in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language that parents can understand. The policy will be distributed at the annual Title I Parent Meeting held on August 27, 2026.

The school will involve parents in the ongoing process of planning and writing the school's improvement plan and Parent and Family Engagement Policy by inviting parent representatives to planning meetings such as the monthly PTA and SOT meetings that occur after school.

The Clark County School District's annual survey of Brookman's parents, staff, and students showed that 185 people took the survey in the 2025-2026 school year. Survey participants feel that:

- Teachers care about the students
- Parents feel welcome at the school
- Parents feel informed about the current curriculum
- The school promptly responds to parent communication
- The school sees parents as a partner in their child's education
- The staff values parents input and opinions

- The school's administrators take prompt action when problems occur
- The school sets clear rules for behavior
- The school involves parents in events and activities
- The school building is clean and well-maintained and the equipment/facilities work well
- Teachers keep their classrooms clean and organized

The results will be shared with families during the annual Title I Parent Meeting held on August 27, 2026. During the meeting, parents will have an opportunity to analyze the survey results and give input on the Parent and Family Engagement Policy. We will use the data provided through the Districtwide Survey to modify our Parent and Family Engagement Policy as needed. A team of staff and parents at the school will look at the Districtwide Survey data to find trends/patterns/concerns that could then be addressed by actions outlined in the school's Title I plan. We plan to increase participation in the survey by making computers available at the school for parents to use in order to complete the survey. The school will also continue to encourage parents to participate by sending out Parentlink messages, and posting survey information. Additionally, a QR code will be sent home to make it easier for parents and families to access the survey.

The Educational Involvement Accords are integrated into the online registration process through Infinite Campus. Parents must review Accords prior to completing their child's registration. Administrators and teachers will have access to the Accords when needed for parent/student conferences or other occasions. Also, teachers discuss the Accords with parents during Open House and Parent/Teacher Conferences. Administration also discusses the Accords with parents during attendance and discipline conferences.

In order to build a strong partnership between parents and the school, the administration and staff will:

- Provide assistance to parents in understanding such topics as the state's academic content and achievement standards, state and local assessments, the requirements of Title I, how to monitor their students' academic progress and how to work with the school staff to improve the achievement of the student. This will occur at Open House, Parent/Teacher Conferences, and some PTA and SOT meetings.
- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment enabling students to meet the state academic standards.
- Offer parent involvement activities in the school that will include opportunities for parents to volunteer and be involved in school activities virtually and in person, when allowed:
 - Parent education
 - Parents to participate in school decision-making
 - Parents to provide home support for their children's education
 - Effective communication between the school and parents
 - Parents to attend school events and conferences
- Provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve the student's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, to foster

parental involvement. This will occur at events spread throughout the year such as Science Night, Literacy Night and Math Night.

- Provide access to educational resources for parents to use together with their children.

With the assistance of parents, the administration will educate teachers and other staff during weekly professional development sessions in:

- The value and utility of contributions of parents
- How to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners
- Implementing and coordinating parent programs
- Building ties between parents and the school

The school will ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings and other activities is sent to parents in an understandable format and, to the extent practicable, in a language that parents can understand included in Parentlink messages, the school website and fliers.

The administration will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parent involvement programs and activities with private and community resources, pre-kindergarten programs (KIDS, ECI) and other community family programs (PTA) that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children. Parents will be notified of these programs via Parentlink messages, fliers, and the school marquee.

The school will provide reasonable support for additional parental involvement activities as parents may request through evaluations from parent meetings to increase positive relationships between families and school personnel. Suggestions from parents will be taken to the leadership team to be determined if they meet the needs of our students.
