STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

Of the approximate 2,112 students, 56% are white, 18% are African American, 3% are Asian, 2% are Hispanic, and 22% reported as other, with a free and reduced population of 41%.

ACADEMIC SCHEDULE

EHS has an academic year that is divided into two terms, consisting of four approximately 90 minute block periods each. Students earn one credit per block term, with the exception of half term courses, which earn ½ credit each. Some courses require a two-term commitment in order to participate, earning 1 credit per term. No partial credit is awarded. Students are enrolled in four classes for 18 weeks or one semester. Students may earn four Carnegie units per term, totaling eight per year.

GPA CALCULATION

Cumulative GPA is based on 18 week term grades from 9th grade through the second term of the 12th grade, and includes all subjects. Weighted averages are used, including additional weights for AP, Pre-AP and some dual enrollment courses. The student with the highest overall GPA at the end of the second semester of the 12th grade will be named valedictorian. The student with the 2nd highest weighted GPA will be named salutatorian.
