What is Title I?

Richmond Hill Middle is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Richmond Hill Middle will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Richmond Hill Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Richmond Hill Middle will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Richmond Hill Middle School invited all parents to attend our annual School Revision Forum last Spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. If the plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the school will submit any comments to the district office.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Richmond Hill Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the Richmond County Parent and Family Engagement Plan is included in the student code of conduct book that is given to all students. The Richmond Hill Middle School Parent and Family Engagement Plan will also be posted on the school website and distributed at the Title I Annual Meeting. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

District Goals

- During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

School Goals

- By the end of the 2026–2027 school year, Richmond Hill Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System (GMAS) in Math by at least 10 percentage points through rigorous Tier I instruction, targeted remediation, and consistent progress monitoring.
- By the end of the 2026–2027 school year, Richmond Hill Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones Assessment System (GMAS) in Math by at least 10 percentage points through rigorous Tier I instruction, targeted remediation, and consistent progress monitoring.
- By the end of the school year, Richmond Hill Middle School will reduce student discipline referrals, suspensions, and behavioral incidents by 20%. Also, student attendance rates will improve by 5%, and chronic absenteeism will decrease by 10%.

School-Parent Compacts

The compact will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from

Richmond Hill Middle will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:
