Mathematics: By May 2027, Pine Hill Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring Developing and Above on the GMAS Mathematics assessment by 5% through standards-based mathematics instruction, mathematical discourse, problem-solving, targeted intervention, and data-driven instructional practices.

School Climate: By May 2027, Pine Hill Middle School will increase student attendance by 3% and reduce out-of-school suspension discipline referrals by 5% through data-driven intervention systems, PBIS support, and stakeholder collaboration.

In the School

Pine Hill Middle School will work with students and their families to support students' success in mastering the standards in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Holding parent nights that will include interactive learning for parents as well.
- Keep parents informed about academic progress utilizing various methods such as Newsletters, Infinite Campus, Weekly Shout points, Emails, Flyers, Remind, and DOJO.
- Share links to family-friendly web sites from our school and class web pages to aid in building vocabulary and math skills.
- Provide parents with materials from the learning kit full of fun materials.

At Home

Pine Hill Middle School parents joined

staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

- Attend Parent Nights highlighting various academic and district initiatives. Topics may include I-Ready, Georgia Milestones, Infinite Campus training, Canvas, Zoom, Microsoft Applications, and content area focus.
- Look for the class newsletter, weekly shout points, flyers, emails, Remind and class Dojo messages, check infinite campus parent portal, and check out the school's website.
- Use the shared links to reinforce math skills and learn new vocabulary words and find ways to use these words in family conversations.
- Have fun with materials from the learning kit. For example, have students calculate the tip at a restaurant or the actual price of something on sale.

Pine Hill Middle School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach the stars in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Demonstrate their acquired skills and knowledge learned and share it with parents and teachers during Parent Nights.
- Bring a class newsletter, and flyers home about Family Fun academic activities and encourage parents and family to participate. Remind parents to check Remind, Class Dojo, and Infinite Campus parent portal.
- Use shared links to review learned vocabulary words and practice math skills.
- Take home materials from the learning kit for parents to view and assist students with learning.
