Materials:

Grading Policy:

Tests and Essays, Major Projects: 50%

Quizzes and Daily Assignments: 50%

Writing assignments including but not limited to paragraphs, essays, and research pieces may be broken into planning, drafting, and polished draft. Students may be required to complete each phase before submitting a polished draft.

Late Work Policy:

Description: This course involves the study of certain literary works, vocabulary, critical analysis skills, and writing mechanics.

Goals: Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Identify elements and characteristics of the novel, short story, drama, essay, and poem.
2. Analyze plot structure, characters, conflict, tone, and point of view in literary selections.
3. Recognize vocabulary words occurring in the literary selections.
4. Create multi-paragraph analysis essays, and identify and use rhetorical strategies.
5. Write using proper capitalization, punctuation, and usage.
6. Write compositions based on literary works read.
7. Research and write compositions with documented information.
8. Use close reading skills.



Workload/Homework:

As an Honors student, the curriculum is a bit more rigorous and fast-paced. You MUST keep up with your outside reading assignments. Poor grades on homework are the 'silent killers' of grade point averages—they sneak up on you and by the time grades roll out, it's too late to do anything about it.

Reading - American and World Literature including Poetry, Short Stories, Non fiction, Rhetoric, Drama, Novel studies, Media Literacy. Titles to be read may include, but are not limited to, *The Crucible*, *The Great Gatsby*, *The Shadow Riders* by Louis L'Amour, *Animal Farm*, *Fahrenheit 451*, a novel of choice, and excerpts from: *Gulliver's Travels*, *Frankenstein*, and *Les Miserables*.

Writing - Focus on Sentence Structure and Short Analytical Responses, Creating Literary Texts/Literary Analysis Essays, Analyzing Rhetoric and Persuasive Essays, and a research project.
