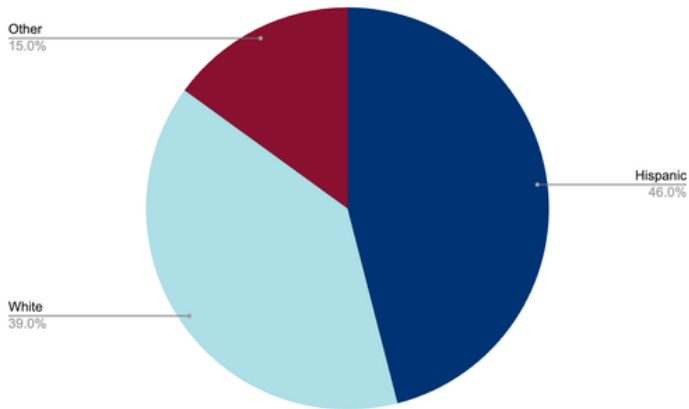

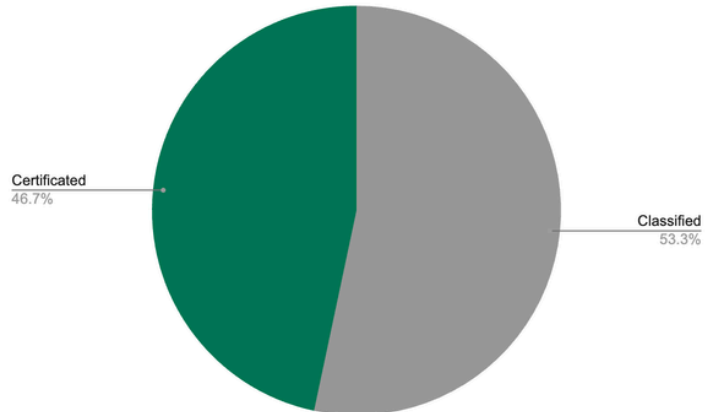

June 2025

Begin Strategic
Planning Process

With the support of F3 Law, the strategic planning process began. The process was designed to be collaborative, bringing together educators, staff, families, students, community partners, and local organizations to help shape the future of NMUSD.

A key component of this work included a 2-day Strategic Planning session, which fostered meaningful engagement and balanced representation from across the District. This process created space for thoughtful dialogue and collaboration, allowing participants to share perspectives and priorities while helping shape a plan that supports, challenges, and prepares every student for the future.

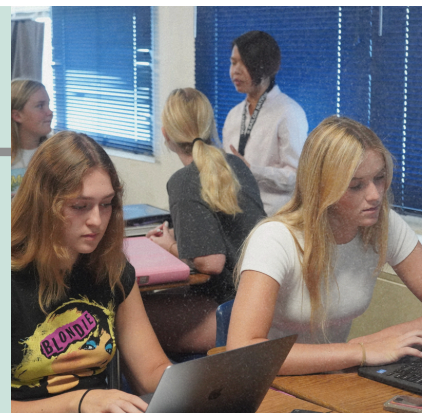


Rigorous, college-preparatory course offerings consistently provided across all schools.
