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Parent and Family Engagement Plan

What is Title I?

Stonewall Tell Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. The Title I program must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP).

What is it?

The plan describes how Stonewall Tell Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. We value the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the diverse ways that Stonewall Tell Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can participate in the planning of activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Parents of Stonewall Tell Elementary are invited to attend Input Meetings, held annually in the spring, to review and revise this Parent and Family Engagement Plan, as well as the schoolwide plan, our School-Family Compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online platform. Parents can access this plan on our school's website to view and give feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. An annual survey is also given to ask for parents' suggestions on the plan and how to use funds for family engagement support.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Stonewall Tell Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

District Goals 2026-2027

Increase the percentage of all students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Reading Milestones.

Increase the percentage of all students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Math Milestones.

School Goals 2026-2027

Reading

Seventy percent (70%) of **K-5** students will score at Tier I as measured by i-Ready Reading Final Diagnostic by May 2027.

The percentage of **3rd-5th** students performing at Developing and above on the Reading Georgia Milestones will increase by 3-5% for the 2026-2027 school year.

Math

Sixty percent (60%) of **K-5** students will score at Tier I as measured by i-Ready Math Final Diagnostic by May 2027.

The percentage of **3rd-5th** students performing at Developing and above on the Math Georgia Milestones will increase by 3% for the 2026-2027 school year.

Focus Areas

(K-2): Apply phonics to decode more difficult words. Build math fluency with addition and subtraction while solving multistep word problems.
(3-5): Develop vocabulary by using root words, prefixes, and suffixes to determine word meanings. Build math fluency with multiplication and division while solving multistep word problems.

School-Family Compact

Stonewall Tell Elementary and our families, as part of this plan, will develop a School-Family Compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how they will work together to ensure all our students reach *grade-level standards**.
