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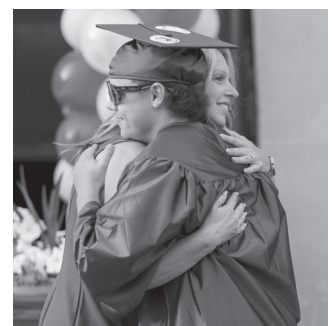

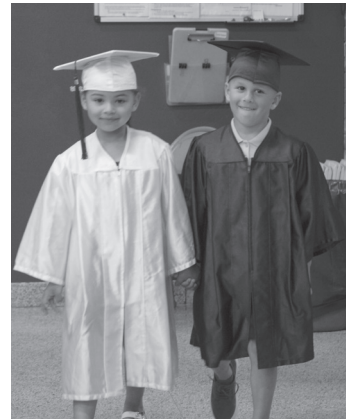


Pre-K Students Celebrate Graduation

BIOLOGY STUDENTS INVESTIGATE BIRD COLLISIONS DURING MIGRATION

This past spring, Oriskany Jr./Sr. High School biology students participated in a hands-on STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) investigation focused on preventing bird collisions during migration.

In January, Mrs. Sciorilli attended a New York State Master Teacher workshop at the Cornell University Lab of Ornithology to gather materials and participate in a pilot program to implement the NYS Life Science: Biology "For the Birds" lab investigation. The multi-phase program included analyzing data and information set in "nest" stations around the classroom to engage and

generate a real-world connection and understanding of the importance of birds as pollinators, seed dispersers, nutrient cyclers and pest regulators in the ecosystem.

In phase two, students simulated and then engineered solutions. Stage three had the added complication that some windows, such as those in office buildings, cannot protect birds with screens. Students were tasked with designing solutions for office buildings using patterns, then they made models to prevent birds from window collisions.

As part of the "Birds in the Anthropocene" crowdsourcing project, under the direction of artist Holly Greenberg, students then researched bird species and created models of the birds that are most often killed by collisions in Chicago, the deadliest city in the United States for migratory birds.

The final phase had students analyze their models and identify trade-offs involved in maintaining ecosystem stability. Using STEAM, students were able to create solutions to real-world problems!

The goal of the project is to make 10,836 bird replicas to raise awareness and prevent bird collisions. There are currently just over 4,000 birds made for this project and Mrs. Sciorilli plans to continue this innovative lab in the future.





JR./SR. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS LEARN ABOUT CAREER OPTIONS

Oriskany Jr./Sr. High School hosted a Career Day on May 20, bringing in more than 25 local businesses and organizations to connect with students.

The successful event was structured into two unique, engaging formats tailored to the students' grade levels. Juniors and seniors participated in three targeted, 20-minute, classroom-style sessions, while students in grades 7-10 engaged in an expo-style career fair in the gymnasium.

Oneida County Envirothon



Two teams of Oriskany students competed in the annual Oneida County Envirothon held at the Utica Zoo in the spring.

Preparation for the event included studying aquatics, forestry, wildlife, soils and the current events topic of non-point source pollution. Teams were invited to bring artwork depicting an invasive species, and part of the competition included gathering information from around the zoo and the NY Energy Zone to complete a "passport."

The annual event provides students with the opportunity to apply their environmental science knowledge through hands-on, team-based challenges while building problem-solving skills and competing for the chance to advance to the New York State Envirothon.

Awards from Oneida County

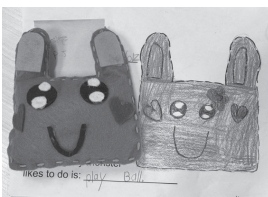

Our varsity baseball team has achieved a remarkable milestone by winning its fourth consecutive league and sectional titles. They also secured their third regional championship and advanced to the Final Four in the state tournament, finishing the season with an impressive record of 20 wins and one loss. Congratulations to our student-athletes and coaching staff for their outstanding and continued success!

We would like to extend our gratitude to the Oriskany Fire Department, Oriskany Police Department, Whitestown Police Department and Oneida

County Sheriff's Office for continuously escorting our team home after their significant victories and giving them a great send-off to the Final Four tournament.

The Skyhawks baseball team was honored by the Oneida County Board of Legislators during their July meeting for these accomplishments.

Our Oriskany/Westmoreland golf team once again earned the opportunity to advance to the round before the state competition, with Ashton Ricci representing Oriskany-Westmoreland. Congratulations to our student-athlete and coaching staff for their remarkable achievements!

This year, several school records were broken. In track, Brayden LaGasse set a new school record in the weight throw with a distance of 37 feet and 1/2 inch. In baseball, Dean Koenig broke the record for stolen bases with 33, and Eddie Wright set the record for career pitching wins with 28.

Oriskany Skyhawks will be recognized as a School of Excellence by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) in August. This award is granted when 90% of a school's varsity teams earn the Scholar-Athlete Award. Most recently, Oriskany held the School of Distinction Award for four consecutive years, an honor given to schools whose varsity teams consistently earn the Scholar-Athlete Award. We continue to achieve recognition as student-athletes, both on the playing field and in the classroom.

Oriskany Jr./Sr. High School has been honored by NYSPHSAA for the second consecutive year for its commitment to sportsmanship. Skyhawks Athletics continues to set a high standard for sportsmanship and character education across all levels of its athletic programs, and the award recognized Oriskany's ongoing efforts in promoting sportsmanship.

Throughout each athletic season, student-athletes at all levels are acknowledged for their exemplary conduct through the school's Sportsmanship Award. Honorees receive a commemorative plaque, a pin to display on their varsity letter, and permanent recognition on a dedicated

plaque proudly displayed within the school. Coaches play a vital role in this initiative by consistently emphasizing sportsmanship and game knowledge as core pillars of team development.

We encourage our student-athletes to exceed expectations by demonstrating respect, courtesy and gratitude, and by putting in hard work in all areas. Whether on the playing field, in the classroom or within the community, sportsmanship is at the forefront of our athletic programs. In case of a game expulsion, Oriskany requires student-athletes to complete a National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) course related to the nature of the infraction. Additionally, all coaches and event staff are mandated to complete the NFHS Implicit Bias course annually, reinforcing the District's commitment to fostering an inclusive and respectful athletic environment.

The Skyhawks have also submitted an application for the NYSPHSAA Community Service Award.

As we move into the 2026-27 athletic season, there are some changes. We will be switching to Arbiter Schedule for our scheduling platform. This will consolidate our scheduling and registration on a single platform. Arbiter Live will handle the scheduling, while FamilyID (Arbiter Student) will be used for registration. You can find the links for registration and schedules at oriskanycsd.org/athletics. This transition to a unified platform was a decision made by Section III athletics to help programs operate more efficiently.
