

Student Wellness and Success Funds and Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid Plan

Purpose

Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) utilizes Student Wellness and Success Funds (SWSF) and Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid (DPIA) to remove barriers to learning by providing mental health and physical health services that support student well-being, engagement, attendance, and academic success.

Student Wellness and Success Funds

Initiative	Action Step
Mental Health Services	Provide school counselors to deliver academic, career, and social-emotional support, crisis response, and referrals to community resources.
Physical Health Services	Provide a full-time school nurse and contract with Fidelity Health to provide a clinic assistant who expands the capacity of the school health office and supports daily student health needs.

Funding Allocation: One hundred percent (100%) of Student Wellness and Success Funds are dedicated to mental health services and physical health services.

Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid

Initiative	Action Step
Mental Health Services	Contract with Samaritan Behavioral Health to provide on-site licensed mental health counseling, crisis intervention, behavioral health assessments, care coordination, and consultation that complements the district's comprehensive school counseling program.
Physical Health Services	Contract with Fidelity Health to provide a clinic assistant who supports the school nurse in delivering timely health services and reducing health-related barriers to learning.

Community Partnerships

To maximize direct student services, MVCTC leverages community partnerships that provide additional resources at little or no cost to the district. These partnerships supplement, but are not funded through, Student Wellness and Success Funds or Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid.

- **Montgomery County Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (MCADAMHS):** Prevention programming, mental health resources, and professional development.
- **Montgomery County Educational Service Center (MCESC):** Student wellness resources, prevention programming, and staff training.
- **Montgomery County Prosecutor's Victim Witness Division:** Dating violence and sexual violence prevention education.

By utilizing these partnerships, MVCTC is able to dedicate all Student Wellness and Success Funds and Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid to direct student mental health and physical health services.

Expected Outcomes

These funds increase student access to academic, behavioral, mental health, and physical health services while reducing barriers to learning. Effectiveness will be monitored through utilization data and stakeholder feedback.

During the 2025-2026 school year, these services supported:

- 139 students receiving more than 1,250 on-site mental health counseling sessions.
- More than 11,000 clinic visits, with 91% of students returning to class after receiving care.

DPIA is estimated to be \$175,553.92 and Student Wellness is estimated to be \$693,941.27 at this time.
