

Grade 12 Choice Ready Checklist

- ☐ Show up - aim for 95% attendance (don't miss class more than 3x/semester)
- ☐ 23 credits are required for graduation. Finish strong – every class counts! If you are not on track, come up with a credit recovery plan with your counselor!
- ☐ Work hard to maintain a 2.8+ GPA (this means you try to get at least an A or B in most classes)
 - Don't slack Semester 2! Many post-secondary acceptance agreements are contingent on Semester 2 performance.
- ☐ Update your 4-year plan (you will do this in your advisory class!)
- ☐ Document your involvement and accomplishments in your Choice Ready Dashboard (you will do this in your advisory class!)
- ☐ Retake tests as necessary to earn qualifying scores (ACT, ASVAB, etc.)
- ☐ Take on leadership roles in sports and activities. If you aren't a part of any school activity, join something!
- ☐ Take a THIRD CTE class to explore a field or area of interest! The goal is to have completed at least 3 CTE courses before you graduate!
- ☐ If you haven't yet, finish a third year of fine arts OR world languages with a C or above!
- ☐ Get a job on weekends, after school, or in the summertime

- ☐ Serve AT LEAST TEN MORE volunteer hours (for a total of 25)

- ☐ Maintain quality citizenship (no suspensions)
- ☐ Take the Civics Exam (will be coordinated by the school)
- ☐ Complete a capstone project and presentation in your advisory class
 - Develop your own resume to use in college and job applications!
- ☐ Finalize your plans for after graduation
- ☐ Take the Senior Survey (will be coordinated by the school in the spring)
- ☐ Attend every class meeting to make sure you don't miss out on important information and deadlines
- ☐ Challenge yourself with an Advanced Placement or Dual Credit course! Strive to earn a C or above or score at least a 3 on the AP exam! ([what's the difference between AP and DC courses?](#))
- ☐ If you are interested in attending a college or university:
 - Research and visit different institutions to find the best fit
 - Apply! (WFHS will host a Choice Ready Day on Monday, October 12) featuring college applications
 - Complete the FAFSA
 - Request recommendation letters from staff at least 2 weeks in advance of the deadline
