Back-to-School Information



2026-2027 Registration Open!

Registration is open for Lincoln Academy. This is a required process for Lincoln families and all steps must be completed for all students before they return to school.

Step 1: Complete required annual registration in [Infinite Campus](#)

- Forgot your username and/or password? [Personal Account Manager](#) can help you reset your account
- Before you get started, we encourage you to read these [directions](#) to guide you in completing registration.
- This is the one time of year where you can adjust your FERPA opt-in/out options. Please remember to **OPT IN** to Jeffco publications if you would like your student to

appear in the yearbook.

- You will be asked to update emergency contacts for your student(s). These contacts are any adults who the school can reach out to if there is an emergency and the parents/guardians cannot be reached. Please ensure phone numbers are accurate. They are also how the school knows who is allowed to pick up your student(s) at the end of the day.

Step 2: While on Infinite Campus, click on “More” to see Quick Links. Here you can:

- **Complete the [Student Benefits Application](#)**
 - Families are not required to complete this form, however **all** families are **strongly encouraged** to apply as it will help with additional education funding for the school and may allow families to **waive school-related fees**
- **Pay student fees** - please note the school yearbook is listed as an “optional fee” that can be added to your student account. This option will drop off the fee list in October and you will need to order it from the school website after that occurs.

Step 3: Complete Lincoln Academy’s [Registration Checklist](#)

Back-to-School BBQ and Supply Drop Off

Our schoolwide Back-to-School BBQ and Supply Drop Off will be Tuesday, August 18. This is an open house event where parents/guardians and students are welcome to come, meet their teachers, see their classrooms and drop off supplies. Our middle school students will also be hosting a BBQ as a fundraiser so families are welcome to have dinner on campus as well.

Our suggested schedule for the evening to help with traffic/parking flow is:

- 4:00-5:00 Families with last names A-I
- 5:00-6:00 Families with last names J-R
- 6:00-7:00 Families with last names S-Z

We developed this schedule to help with traffic congestion but recognize that it may not work for all families. Please come as you are able. If parking is full on campus, please park in the neighborhood in appropriate parking places and walk in.

Make sure you stop by the courtyard in front of the main lobby. Families will be able to pick up their Driveline number, the schedules for 5th-8th grade students, and meet with the school clinic to drop off medications. PTO will be present with Spirit Wear, school calendars and information on upcoming events. The Board of Directors will be present to welcome you as well.

Students in grades **PreK-6th** should bring all of their school and community supplies with them to drop off in their classrooms.

Students in **7th and 8th** grade can bring their community supplies to drop off, but should keep their individual supplies to bring in their backpacks the first day of school. They will also have the chance to see their classrooms and meet their teachers.



Arrival and Dismissal

At 7:35 am, students wanting breakfast can enter through the blue roof doors by the turf field. Staff will be there to help them in the Student Center. After eating, students will be asked to head to the normal entry door for their grade level.

Doors open for K-4th grade students at 7:40 am for a soft start. 5th-8th grade doors open at 7:50 am. Students will enter through these doors when they arrive:

- K-1st: South door of building B
- 2nd-4th: West door outside the main office (near the ALP room)
- 5th/6th: West building C doors
- 7th/8th: East doors outside, behind the gym

Dismissal

Dismissal starts at 3 pm for grades K-4 and 3:15 pm for grades 5-8. We ask that families with **any** 5th-8th grade students **not** arrive on campus for pick up until 3:15 pm; if you have younger students, they will wait safely in their classroom until you arrive.

Students are dismissed by their Driveline Number. All families are encouraged to pick up their Driveline Number from the office table at Back to School night. Any remaining

numbers will be sent home with the youngest student in the family on the first day of school. Your driveline number is unique to each family and tells teachers when they can dismiss each student. Please share your number only with those who are allowed to pick up your student(s).

Students Walking for Dismissal

Students may be released to walk off campus at **3:15pm only with guardian permission**. Parents need to [complete this form](#) each year to give their permission to walk. The information from last year will not rollover. Please do not utilize the Walker designation if you plan to come onto campus to meet your students, this is **only** for students who will walk off campus by themselves.

Walkers may not be left unsupervised after school on the playground.

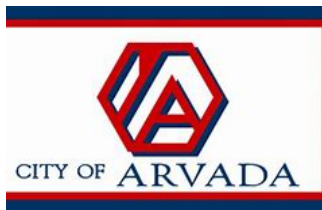


Outdoor Classroom Update

Traffic Update



Oak to Kipling Restoration Work Update

The 72nd Avenue Restoration Project was approved by the City Council in July. Construction is scheduled to begin in late August and is expected to be completed in November.

Planned Work

Work is expected to take 4 to 5 months to complete including:

- Water line replacement
- Oak intersection improvements
- ADA curb ramps
- Sidewalk and bike lane connections on the east side
- Sidewalk repairs on the north side of W 72nd
- Repaving the existing two-lane road (Oak to Lee Ct.)
- Repaving side streets via the Pavement Program (72nd Pl., 71st Pl., 70th Dr.)
- Replace street light bulbs to correct brightness issues
- North entrance improvements at Lincoln Academy
- Sidewalk connections
- W 72nd Ave left turn lane
- Miscellaneous repairs and clean up throughout the corridor

Project Changes Reminder

Early this year, and due to considerable cost escalation, the City decided not to proceed with construction of the underpass at the railroad for the W. 72nd Avenue widening project. More information about this decision remains available on the W. 72nd Project webpage. The City remains committed to the initial intent of the 2018 ballot measure to improve safety and traffic flow through the corridor. Restoration work is planned from Kipling to Oak streets. For the long term, the City will continue to evaluate the feasibility and associated costs of an at-grade crossing and widening.
