What is a GrandPad?

A GrandPad is a tablet that is designed with seniors in mind, featuring simple navigation, large buttons, and enhanced sound. The user-friendly interface makes the GrandPad perfect for older adults to connect with family and friends worldwide.

GrandPads are safe for seniors, with an encrypted private network of approved contacts uploaded by the Caregiver Program Coordinator. Everyone can securely share photos, emails, and make video calls without worrying about spam, telemarketers, or scams.

The Aging and Disability Resource Center of Dodge County offers no-cost programs that bring personalized support directly to caregivers at home. Services may include access to caregiver grants, GrandPads to help loved ones stay connected, and a variety of helpful classes designed to strengthen caregiving skills.

The Music & Memory program helps individuals with cognitive or physical challenges reconnect with meaningful memories, ease anxiety, and enhance their quality of life through personalized music.

Certified in this program, the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Dodge County will work with you to create a customized playlist for your loved one. Their personalized music is loaded onto an iPod and loaned to you for use at home.

Support Grants for Family Caregivers

Qualified caregivers may receive respite assistance through limited available funds. Support is tailored to what will be most helpful for the caregiver. Services can include companionship for a loved one, household tasks, personal care, adult day care, caregiver training, and additional supports.

National Family Caregiver Support Program:

- Individuals age 60 and older who need help with activities of daily living
- Grandparents caring for grandchildren
- A diagnosis of dementia, regardless of age
- Individuals with disabilities

Alzheimer's Family Caregiver, Support Program:

- A diagnosis of any type of dementia is required



Powerful Tools FOR Caregivers

Powerful Tools for Caregivers is an evidence-based educational series designed to help caregivers maintain their own well-being while caring for a relative or friend. The class is valuable for anyone supporting a parent, spouse, or friend.

- Reduce stress — build skills to manage daily pressures
- Improve self-confidence — feel more capable in the caregiving role
- Communicate feelings — express needs and emotions more effectively
- Make tough decisions — strengthen problem-solving abilities
- Locate helpful resources— find support and services that make caregiving easier

Classes are held once a week for six weeks, with each session lasting 90 minutes. Contact us to find out when the next class starts.
