What is Title I?

Westside High is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Westside High will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Westside High values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Westside High will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Last spring, Westside High School invited all parents to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school-wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. If the plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the school will submit any comments to the district office.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Westside High will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the Richmond County Parent and Family Engagement Plan is included in the student code of conduct book that is given to all students. The Parent and Family Engagement Plan will also be posted on the school website and distributed at the Title I Annual Meeting. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2026-2027 District Goals

Student Achievement

- During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

2026-2027 School Goals

Goal 1: Westside High School will strengthen school culture and climate through consistent cohort monitoring, Early Warning Indicators (EWI) reviews, and tiered academic and non-academic supports to increase the graduation rate by 5% by the end of the 2026-2027 academic year.

Goal 2: Westside High School will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course Assessment in Algebra: Concepts and Connections and Biology by at least five percentage points through implementation of targeted small-group instruction focused on mathematical reasoning and problem solving during the 2026-2027 school year.

Goal 3: Westside High School will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner level or above on the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course Assessments in American Literature and U.S. History by at least five percentage points through implementation of targeted small-group instruction focused on literacy, critical thinking, and analytical writing during the 2026-2027 school year.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Westside High and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compact will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, teachers and all other stakeholders. The school-parent compacts are shared with parents during open house, the Title I Annual Meeting, online, during parent-teacher conferences and in the parent resource center.

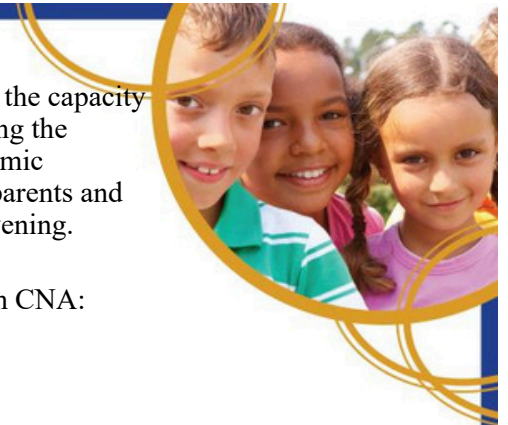
Annual Title I Meeting – 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM

Come visit the Parent Resource Center to check out books, study materials, and activities to use at home with your child. Computers are available for parents to explore the Parent Portal and educational resources.

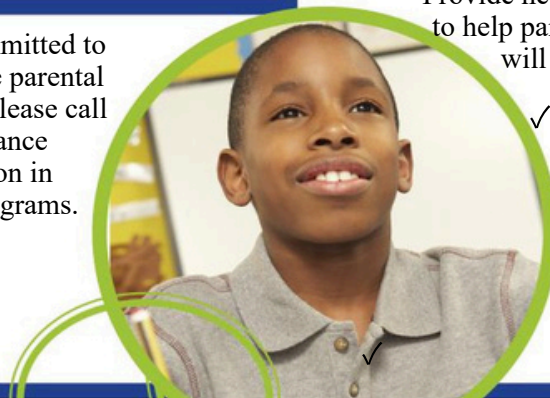
