Aging and Disability Resource Centers are the first place to go with your aging and disability questions. Aging and Disability Resource Centers are “information stations” where individuals can obtain accurate, unbiased information related to aging or living with a disability.

Our goal is to connect older adults and people with disabilities with the most effective services, supports, and community resources that enhance safety, well-being, and quality of life.

Who does the Aging and Disability Resource Center serve?

- Adults aged 60 and older
- Adults with disabilities
- Youth aged 17 and 6 months with disabilities as they transition into adult services
- Caregivers, concerned family members, friends and guardians



What services does the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Dodge County offer?

- Information, assistance and referrals for local community services
- Counseling on options to meet immediate or future care needs
- Assistance to apply for public benefit programs such as Medicare and Medicaid
- Advocacy to cut through problems with benefit programs, health insurance, housing or consumer issues
- Links to help when someone is being abused (physically, verbally or financially) or when someone is neglecting their own care
- Prevention and health promotion programs
- Determine eligibility for publicly funded long-term care programs such as:
 - Family Care
 - Partnership or
 - IRIS
