

Dress Code Policy 2026-2027

IAA has a dress code for all students. All students must wear the official school uniform; school logo is optional. Refusal to adhere to the school dress code, will result in the student being sent home. The student's parent/guardian will be notified of the student not complying with the dress code and will need to be picked up. Failure to comply will result in the following:

- Students will not be admitted to class until a parent or guardian has reported to school and has provided their child with appropriate clothes identified in IAA's dress code policy.
- The student will remain in the refocus room until the parent/guardian arrives.
- If the school has items the student is missing, the student may sign out the items needed and return them at the end of 8th period that day so they can be washed.
- If not returned, the parent or guardian will receive an invoice for the amount to replace the item or items loaned out to the student. If the student still doesn't comply, the student will have to go home for the day.

High School

Shirts/Tops: must be a solid, heather gray colored collared shirt.

Pants/Bottoms: must be khaki or navy or black colored chino pants, shorts, or skirts. Skirts and shorts should fall two inches above the knee or longer.

Sweaters/Pullover: solid heather gray hoodie, sweater, cardigan, or fleece.

Shoes: Any color sturdy sneakers or dress shoes. No open toe shoes, steel tip boots, sandals, slides, flip flops, or slippers.

Dress Down Days: the shoe requirement remains intact every day. No leggings, yoga pants, stretch pants, ripped / torn clothing, belly shirts, clothing with inappropriate content for a school, and hats / wave caps.

Middle School

Shirt/Tops: Must be a solid, navy blue colored collared shirt.

Pants/Bottoms: Must be khaki or navy or black colored chino fabric pants, shorts, or skirts. Skirts and shorts should fall two inches above the knee or longer.

Sweaters/Pullovers: Solid, navy blue hoodie, sweater, cardigan, or fleece.

Shoes: Any color sturdy sneakers or dress shoes. No open toes, steel toed shoes, sandals, flip flops, slides, or slippers.

Dress Down Days: the shoe requirement remains intact every day. No leggings, yoga pants, stretch pants, ripped / torn clothing, belly shirts, clothing with inappropriate content for a school, and hats / wave caps.

Consequence for Dress Code Violations

- **1st Offense:** If a student refuses to comply with the dress code policy, the parent or guardian will be notified to pick the student up and the student will be sent home, unless the parent can get the student to agree to wear the appropriate dress code item.
- **2nd Offense and subsequent offenses:** Will result in being assigned to the reflection, refocus room, and/or suspended out of school. A parent meeting will need to be scheduled to resolve the issue. If a student consistently doesn't follow the dress code policy, a referral for expulsion will be sent to the CAO/Principal and the Board of Trustees.

Students will be allowed to wear hoodies and or jackets, as long as they are a plain Navy for MS and Gray for HS, in school hallways and or in class. All other colors or clothing items must be kept in school lockers at the beginning of the school day. If seen wearing non dress code items throughout the day, they will be confiscated. If a student continues to have issues with these items, a parent will be requested to come to the school to address the issue. Items confiscated will be returned to the student at the end of the day. These items will be stored in either the Refocus Room or the Main Office.

Clothing Prohibited: Do Rags, Hoodies, Bandanas, Hats, Blankets, Sunglasses inside the building, Slides, Clothes with holes / rips / tears, any pant color other than Khaki, Black, or Navy, yoga pants, sweatpants and Crop shirts (overly exposed clothing). These items are not permitted on the school bus and/or the school premises at any time.
