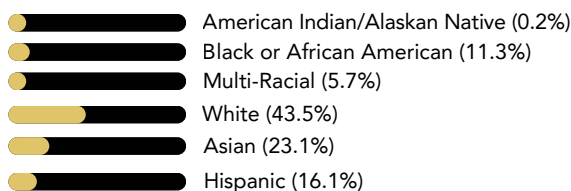

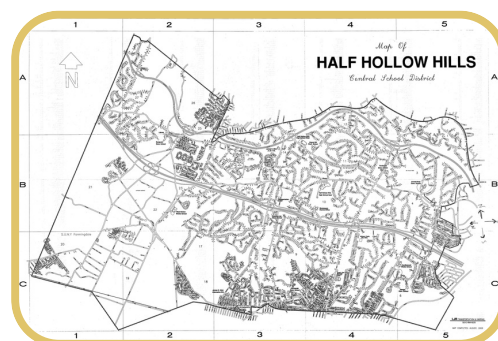

Academic Achievement

- The Half Hollow Hills K-12 program is designed to meet the individual needs of all students. Our diverse population includes many students at various levels of educational development.
- Our high schools offer strong academic programs, including 32 Advanced Placement courses, and 25 Honors and/or college-level courses.
- Students have an opportunity to earn the AP Capstone Diploma™ or the AP Seminar and Research Certificate™.
- Both high schools offer "Project Lead the Way" Engineering courses affiliated with Rochester Institute of Technology.
- They also offer a "Senior Experience" program for a select group of senior-year students that combines Honors English 12 and Honors Government/Economics into a Humanities-based curriculum. Incorporated into this program is a required year-long professional internship.

- More than 2,500 students participate yearly in performance ensembles that include concert bands, orchestras, choirs, wind ensemble, jazz bands, vocal jazz, a cappella groups, and guitar ensembles.

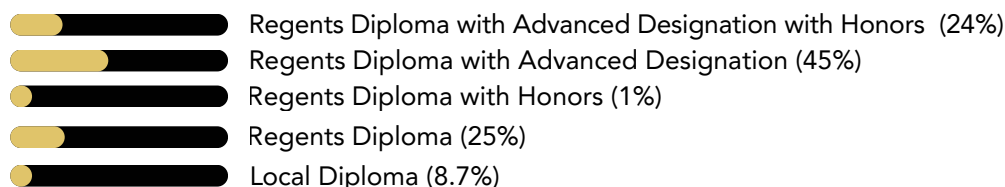

Opportunities for Every Learner

Half Hollow Hills Central School District provides a comprehensive continuum of special education programs and related services designed to meet the unique needs of students with disabilities from preschool through the day before a student's 22nd birthday. In accordance with the New York State Education Department Part 200 Regulations, services are determined by the Committee on Special Education (CSE) based on each student's individual needs and are provided in the least restrictive environment appropriate to enable the student to make meaningful educational progress. The District offers a continuum of services, including resource room, related services, integrated co-teaching (ICT), special class programs, and, when necessary, out-of-district placements. Through individualized supports, specialized instruction, and collaboration with families, Half Hollow Hills is committed to ensuring that students with disabilities have equitable access to the general education curriculum and opportunities to achieve their academic, social, emotional, and functional potential.

In Half Hollow Hills, approximately 40 home languages represent the diverse population in the ENL (English as a New Language) program. Our 20 ENL teachers service approximately 380 students in the district with varying proficiency levels of the English language.

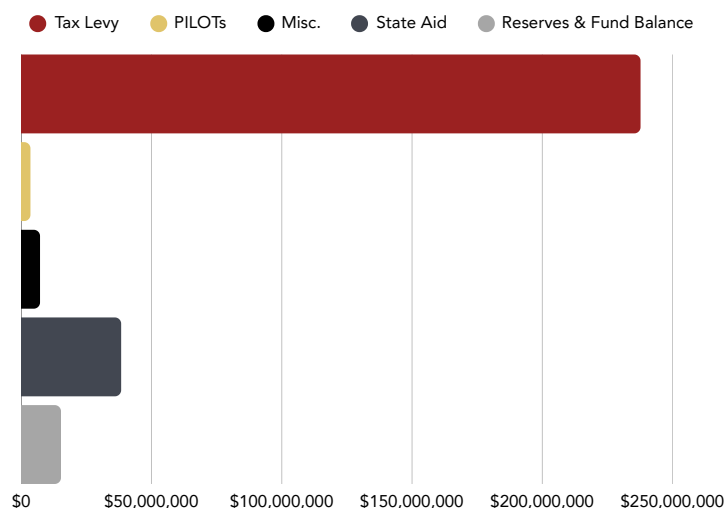
INVESTING IN STUDENT SUCCESS

The leadership of the Half Hollow Hills Central School District is committed to responsible stewardship of the funds it receives from all sources, including taxpayers, as it administers the annual budget.

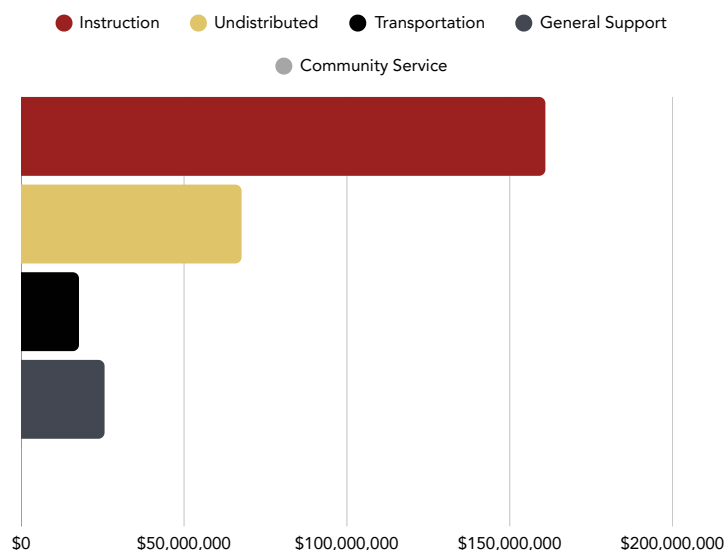
