What is Title I?

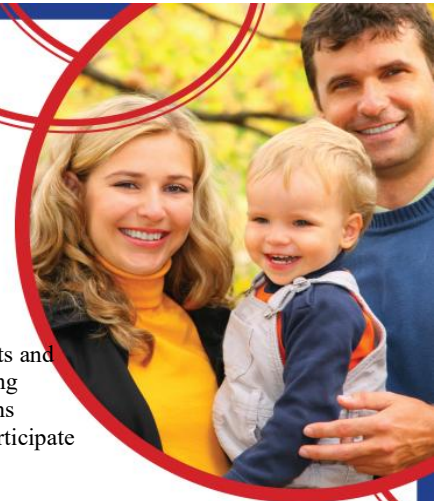
Oak Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Wilkinson Gardens Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Wilkinson Gardens Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Wilkinson Gardens Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Wilkinson Gardens Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual school forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year, including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Wilkinson Gardens Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will email the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2026-2027 District Goals

Student Achievement

During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

2025-2026 School Goals

Academic Achievement- Math

By May 2027, we will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner and above achievement levels in 3rd-5th grade level **Math** from 54% to 60% as measured by the GMAS. K-2 will increase the percentage of students scoring on grade level by 5% as measured by the iReady EOY **Math** Diagnostic.

Academic Achievement - Reading

By May 2027, the percentage of students scoring developing or above on the State EOG **Reading** Assessment will increase from 42% to 50%. K-2 will increase the percentage of students scoring on grade level by 5% as measured by the iReady EOY **Reading** Diagnostic.

Climate & Culture

By May 2027, the percentage of students absent less than 10% of the enrolled days will increase from 58.82% to 68.82%.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Wilkinson Gardens Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the

Community Cares event and the School Forum. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

Let's Get Together!

Wilkinson Gardens Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. All meetings for parents and family members will be held at 6:00 pm.

Annual Title I Meeting– September 10, 2026

Academic Parent Night (5th) iReady and GMAS Testing- February 25, 2027

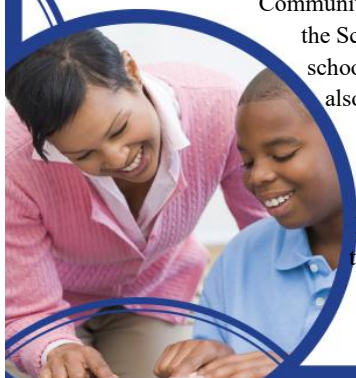
Parents will learn how to support their children as they prepare for the end-of-year diagnostic and state testing.

Wilkinson Gardens Elementary is Branching Out!

Wilkinson Gardens Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- ✓ Provide monthly training for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- ✓ Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career-ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish on the school blog and in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community regularly regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
