<i>Bletchley Riddle, The</i>	Sepetys	In the summer of 1940, siblings Jakob and Lizzie Novis find themselves at Bletchley Park, where Jakob works to crack Nazi codes while Lizzie investigates the mysterious disappearance of their mother, only to discover that the two mysteries are intertwined.
<i>Bridge to Terabithia</i>	Paterson	The life of a ten-year-old boy in rural Virginia expands when he becomes friends with a newcomer who subsequently meets an untimely death trying to reach their hideaway, Terabithia, during a storm.
<i>Bunnicaula</i>	Howe	Though scoffed at by Harold the dog, Chester the cat tries to warn his human family that their founding baby bunny must be a vampire.
<i>Burning Season, The</i>	Rose	When a wildfire breaks out on her watch, twelve-year-old Opal, a fourth-generation fire lookout-in-training, must face her fears in order to save the forest she loves and her family.
<i>Calliope Callisto Clark and the Search for Wisdom</i>	Mills	"Difficult" student Callie joins a philosophy club seeking the wisdom she needs to keep her beloved but equally difficult dog.
<i>Dragon's Apprentice, The</i>	Riley	In this fantasy adventure, a girl strikes a deal with the ancient, cranky dragon she accidentally summoned to teach her the forbidden magic she needs to save her mother.
<i>Experiment, The</i>	Stead	Eleven-year-old Nathan and his parents have a mission to blend in with humans on Earth, but when Nathan starts growing a tail, he begins to question the true purpose of their alien experiment.
<i>Ferris</i>	DiCamillo	During the summer before fifth grade, Ferris Wilkey has her hands full with her little sister terrorizing the town, her Aunt Shirley moving into their basement and her grandmother seeing a ghost—one who has wild, impractical and illuminating plans.
<i>From the Mixed Up Files of Mrs. Basil E Frankweiler</i>	Konigsburg	Having run away with her younger brother to live in the Metropolitan Museum of Art, twelve-year-old Claudia strives to keep things in order in their new home and to become a changed person and a heroine to herself.
<i>Great Zoodini, The</i>	Gardner	When his latest escape goes wrong, the Great Zoodini—a fennec fox—winds up at an animal sanctuary/drive-in movie theater where he gets the chance to become world-famous but wonders if fame is worth losing his newfound family—the only ones who've ever accepted him.
<i>Growing Home</i>	Ferry	A motley crew of talkative plants, a curious spider, and a grumpy goldfish use their newfound magical abilities to defend their family from a greedy human.
<i>Gus and Glory</i>	Guillory	While spending the summer with her grandparents, twelve-year-old mystery-loving Glory and her newfound bloodhound friend Gus attempt to track down her missing mom.
<i>Harriet the Spy</i>	Fitzhugh	Eleven-year-old Harriet keeps notes on her classmates and neighbors in a secret notebook, but when some of the students read the notebook, they seek revenge.
<i>Library of Curiosities, The</i>	Lundquist	After being sent to live with her estranged grandfather, eleven-year-old Rowan discovers his magical library, where she must clear her name, outwit a vengeful enemy, and uncover a long-lost artifact that holds the key to her family's mysterious past.
<i>Light and Air</i>	Wendell	In the 1930s, Halle and her mother are diagnosed with TB and sent to a hospital in upstate New York where she discovers joy, family and friendship, until a setback throws their entire future into question.
<i>Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe, The</i>	Lewis	Four English school children enter the magic land of Narnia through the back of a wardrobe and assist Aslan, the golden lion, in defeating the White Witch who has cursed the land with eternal winter.
<i>Marjory's River of Grass</i>	James	A picture book biography about Marjory Stoneman Douglas, the remarkable conservationist and naturalist who worked tirelessly to protect the Florida Everglades.
<i>Medusa</i>	Marsh	A descendant of Medusa, Ava is sent to the Accademia del Forte in Venice after an altercation with a classmate, where she must learn to control her emotions, especially when she unearths a terrible secret that could change the world forever.
<i>Ms. Pennypickle's Puzzle Quest</i>	Grabenstein	Twelve-year-old Ben and his polar opposite, eighteen-year-old brother Ethan, embark on a road trip race across Route 66 for a chance to win a million-dollar prize as they solve puzzles and bond with each other.
<i>My Side of the Mountain</i>	George	A young boy relates his adventures during the year he spends living alone in the Catskill Mountains including his struggle for survival, his dependence on nature, his animal friends, and his ultimate realization that he needs human companionship.
<i>Mystery of Locked Rooms, The</i>	Currie	With her family on the verge of losing their home, Sarah searches for a rumored treasure inside an abandoned funhouse which is unlike any escape room she's ever attempted, and when things take a dangerous turn, she refuses to turn back—not when her future is at stake.
<i>Octopus Moon</i>	Pyron	Recently diagnosed with depression, fifth-grader Pearl struggles with self-care and self-love amidst a sea of changes.
<i>Old School</i>	Korman	Twelve-year-old Dexter Foreman has lived at The Pines Retirement Village with his grandmother since he was 6 years old, homeschooled by the residents until he's forced to attend middle school, where he sticks out like a sore thumb.
<i>Old Yeller</i>	Gipson	While his father drives the herd from Texas to the Kansas market in the late 1860's, Travis and his dog "Old Yeller" live through a hard summer and form a close bond.
<i>Olivetti</i>	Millington	Witty typewriter Olivetti and twelve-year-old introvert Ernest embark on a mission to find Ernest's missing mother that takes them across San Francisco.
<i>Pocket Bear</i>	Applegate	Pocket serves as unofficial mayor of Second Chances Home for the Tossed and Treasured, where stuffed toy animals are refurbished and given a fresh opportunity to be loved. When an ancient-looking stuffed bear named Berwin arrives at Second Chances, their lives are changed forever.
<i>Popcorn</i>	Harrell	Seventh grader Andrew tries to get through Picture Day where everything goes wrong while grappling with his anxiety and OCD.
<i>Safe Harbor</i>	Venkatraman	Moving from India to the US is difficult for Geetha, but things start to get better when she and a new friend help rescue a stranded seal.
<i>Sarah, Plain and Tall</i>	MacLachlan	When their father invites a mail-order bride to come live with them in their prairie home, Caleb and Anna are captivated by their new mother and hope that she will stay.
<i>Secret of Honeycake, The</i>	Fusco	In 1930, eleven-year-old Hurricane struggles to adapt to life in the city after her mother's death and her sister's illness, but through new friendships and her love for writing, she learns to embrace change and find her voice.
<i>Secret of Moonrise Manor, The</i>	Bearce	Twelve-year-old Raven Galloway, a budding detective and mortician, investigates a mysterious death linked to her mother when a mummified body discovered in a haunted hotel holds crucial clues, leading her and her friends to uncover a hidden stash of stolen art and a secret society.
<i>Sherlock Society, The</i>	Ponti	Alex Sherlock, his sister Zoe, and their friends Lina and Yadi decide to spend their summer in Miami investigating the many "cold cases" their grandfather accumulated during his years as a reporter—first up, Al Capone and a buried treasure.
<i>Snow Treasure</i>	McSwigan	In 1940, when the Nazi invasion of Norway reaches their village in the far north, twelve-year-old Peter and his friends use their sleds to transport nine million dollars worth of gold bullion past the German soldiers to the secret harbor where Peter's uncle keeps his ship ready to take the gold for safekeeping in the United States.
<i>Spider Lady</i>	Klostermann	The story of Nan Songer, a little-known hero of World War II, who collected and bred spiders in her home and found new ways to use their silk to help the United States win the war.
<i>Trouble with Heroes, The</i>	Messner	Caught on camera vandalizing a cemetery, Finn's in big trouble for knocking down some dead old lady's headstone. Turns out that grave belongs to a legendary local mountain climber, and her daughter makes Finn an unusual offer: she'll drop all the charges if he agrees to climb all forty-six Adirondack High Peaks in a single summer. And there's just one more thing—he has to bring along the dead woman's dog.
<i>Tuck Everlasting</i>	Babbitt	The Tuck family is confronted with an agonizing situation when they discover that a ten-year-old girl and a malicious stranger now share their secret about a spring whose water prevents one from ever growing old.
<i>Will's Race for Home</i>	Rhodes	During the land rush of 1889, African American Will and his father journey from Texas to Oklahoma, racing thousands of others to stake their claim.
<i>Witching Wind, The</i>	Lloyd	Roxie and Grayson share a problem, the adults they depend on have vanished, taken by the Witching Wind that "steals" what people love most, and together they must find a way to overcome it.
<i>X Marks the Haunt</i>	Currie	When a lost crypt key awakens a dark force at Graceland Cemetery, twelve-year-old Will, armed with his graveyard know-how, teams up with his friends to uncover the spirit's identity and end the haunting for good.
<i>Zarina Divided</i>	Faruqi	A coming-of-age story about a Muslim girl who, during the Partition of India, must learn to cope with loss, guilt, and change in order to grow.
