Our Mission

San Miguel High School, a Catholic, Lasallian learning community, empowers youth from underserved families through the integration of Christian values, rigorous academics and practical work experience, educating the whole student for college, career and a fulfilling life.

Our School

San Miguel High School was founded in 2004 as a co-educational college and career preparatory high school. Students come primarily from Tucson's South Side and most are members of the Latino community and various Native American tribes. Established for students from families of limited financial means, the average family income of San Miguel students is \$68,635 a year for a family of four. As a Catholic School sponsored by the Brothers of the Christian Schools, San Miguel strives to advance each student's human and Christian education.

Most San Miguel students are the first in their family to attend college.

Corporate Work Study Program

San Miguel utilizes the corporate work-study model of the Cristo Rey Network. Consistent with this model, all San Miguel students take a full college preparatory course load while simultaneously participating in professional work-study positions, working in corporations and earning approximately 45% of the cost of their education. Every student works five days a month at entry-level professional positions all four years of high school. Their schedules ensure that they do not miss any scheduled classes. Students gain practical experience and marketable skills working in a variety of professional fields, including banking, law, medicine, finance, energy, insurance agencies, automotive companies and other professional fields. On average, 75-100 companies partner with San Miguel and are hosting students. By the end of four years at San Miguel, our graduates are ready to enter a university environment with confidence in their educational preparedness and a determination to succeed in their chosen field. Since 2008, 99% of students have graduated and 99% of graduates have either been accepted to college or joined the military.
