CLASSICAL DISTINCTIVES

HUMANITIES Humanities courses at Westminster cover texts ranging from Homer's *Odyssey* to Shakespeare's *Hamlet*. Classes emphasize a conversational methodology, in which the primary object is not victory over an opponent, but the discovery of truth. At Westminster we believe that the art of discussion, like reading or writing, is a skill that must be honed and refined.

RHETORIC Rhetoric is a foundational subject reinforced throughout students' Upper School experience. Because the value of these skills goes beyond academic pursuits, students practice and apply it to other forms of communication. Their studies culminate in a thesis experience that is not merely an exercise but a capstone of academic progress, spiritual and moral development, life skills, and natural aptitudes and interests.

FINE ARTS Fine Arts courses include visual art, music, and theater and cover artistic movements from ancient to modern as they relate to the Humanities curriculum. Students realize the integration of all art forms in the development of mankind and culture throughout the curriculum.

AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Members of the Class of 2026 were awarded \$8,037,720 in academic, athletic, and special achievement scholarships and awards. These forty-seven graduates accepted packages totaling \$3,125,664.

Since 2009, Westminster has had 20 students recognized as National Merit Scholars, 23 as Semifinalists, and 14 as Commended Scholars through the National Merit Scholarship Program.
