

Taking a college-level course while you're still in high school is a great opportunity! If you have a **504 Plan, IEP/FIE, or other disability-related accommodations**, there is an important step you need to take if you wish to receive accommodations.

**Your high school accommodations do not automatically transfer to your college courses.** You must request accommodations directly through the college or program offering your course.

### **Weatherford College Dual Credit**

If you are taking a **Weatherford College Dual Credit** course and need accommodations, you must apply for accommodations through **Weatherford College's Office of Disabilities and Accommodations**.

What do I need to do?

#### **1. Complete the Weatherford College accommodation forms.**

Weatherford College has specific forms for Dual Credit students, including:

- Application for Services
- Reasonable Accommodation Request Form

#### **2. Provide documentation of your accommodations.**

Students should submit their current **FIE and/or 504 accommodations**, including the disability for which accommodations are being provided.

#### **3. Submit your paperwork to Weatherford College.**

Weatherford College will review the information and determine the appropriate accommodations for your college course(s). Approved accommodations will be shared with the student and the appropriate school personnel/instructors. ([Weatherford College](#))

 Important!

Weatherford College accommodations must be **renewed each semester**. Once you are enrolled in your courses, you will need to complete the Reasonable Accommodation Request Form for that semester. ([Weatherford College](#))

### **McMurry University Dual Credit**

If you are taking a **McMurry University** course and need accommodations, you must contact **McMurry's Student Accessibility Services** to set up your college accommodation plan.

 **Student Accessibility Services: 325-793-4880**

Be sure to contact them as early as possible. Your high school 504 accommodations do not automatically become your college accommodations.

## **UT OnRamps**

If you are taking a **UT OnRamps** course and need college-level accommodations, you must request them directly through the **OnRamps Student Portal**.

You can submit your request:

- **During registration**, or
- By clicking the "**Additional Information**" button on the **Current Enrollments** page in the OnRamps Student Portal.

Remember: Your high school 504 accommodations do not automatically transfer to the UT course. You must complete the OnRamps accommodation request process.

## Student Tip

**Don't wait until you have a test or assignment coming up!** Start the accommodation process as soon as possible. College disability services offices need time to review your documentation and put your accommodations in place.

Your high school counselor can help you gather the documentation you need, but **the student is responsible for requesting accommodations through the college or program.**
