Community College Options

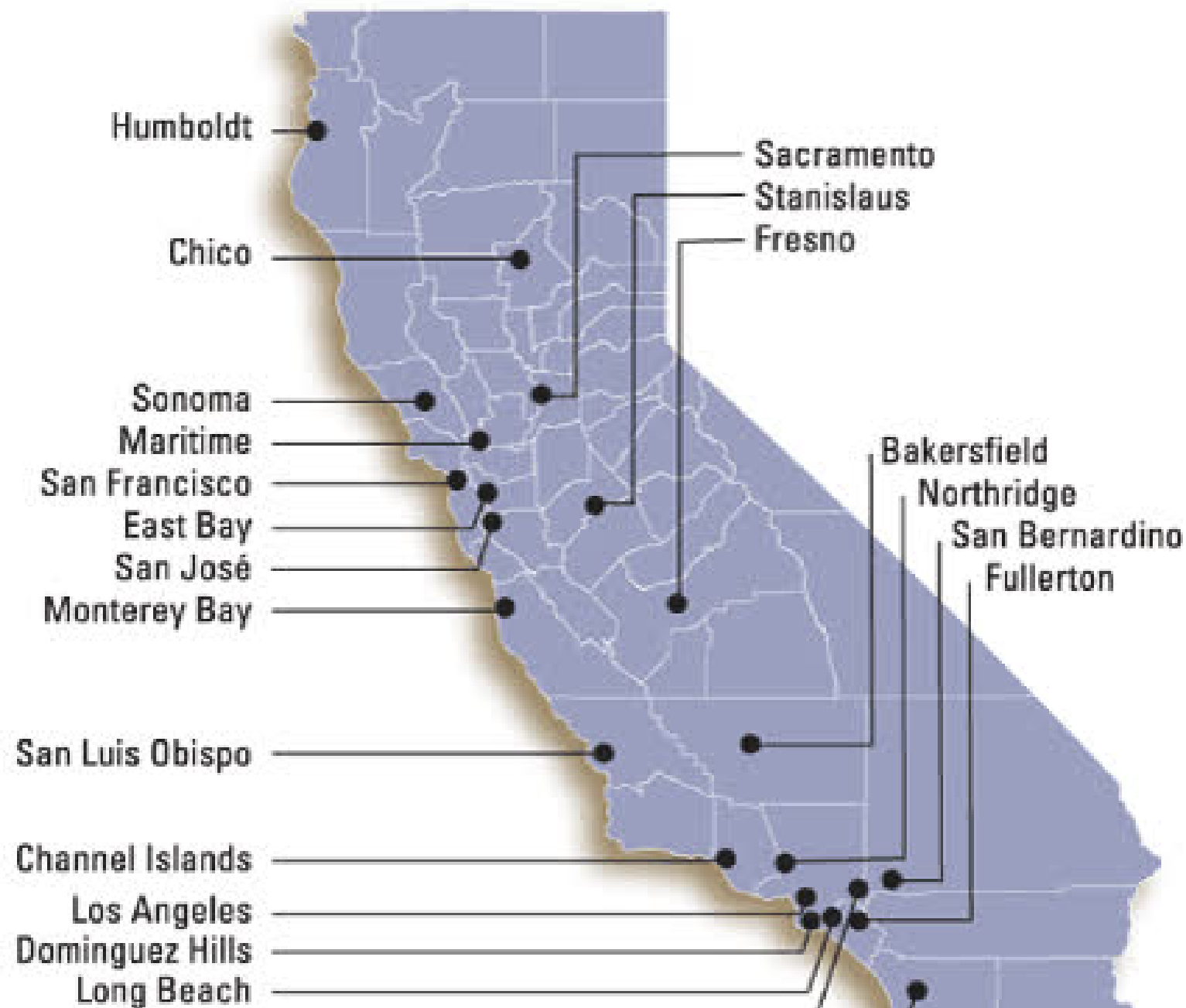
- Free for up to 2 Years **(Must complete FAFSA/CADAA)** and be enrolled full-time (12 units)
- **Transfer Admission Guarantee to 6 UCs (TAG) - Talk to a college counselor**
 - UC Davis, UC Irvine, UC Merced, UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara and UC Santa Cruz
- **Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)**
 - Students who earn a Degree for Transfer and meet the CSU minimum eligibility requirements are guaranteed admissions to a CSU



Public: CSU (California State University)

- 23 Campuses, ranging in size and competitiveness
- A-G courses **with C- or better**
- Minimum GPA 2.5*, however IMPACTED campuses will require higher GPA and will use supplemental factors

*For students with 2.0-2.49 GPA, supplemental factors may be used at non-impacted / local campuses.

Public: UC (University of California)



- 9 Campuses for undergraduate students, mostly large & competitive
- A-G courses with C- or better
- **Minimum GPA 3.0**
- Holistic review including GPA / Grades, level of coursework, extracurricular activities, leadership experience, personal circumstances
- Personal Insight Questions required

- SAT/ACT are **no longer required** for CSU/UC colleges but can be required for **private universities** or out of **state universities**

Preparing for the SCCCD Online Application

Step 1 – Gather your Personal Information

☐ **Basic Information: Legal Name, Address, Phone, and Email Address**

- It is important that you **do not use** your high school email address as you may not have access to it once you graduate. If you do not have a personal email, open an account on outlook.com, yahoo.com, gmail.com, etc.

☐ **Social Security Number (SSN) or other Residency Information**

- If you have an SSN, the college will need it to match the information on your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Applying without entering your SSN will affect your financial aid.
- If you are undocumented or do not have a SSN, you will follow the directions to submit without one.
- If you are not a US citizen and have a permanent resident card, you will need to know the number, date of issue and expiration of your card.

Step 3 – Retrieve your CCCApply Login Information

PETE P. PEteRS Honors Program

This pathway is for students from all majors and pathways. Students with a minimum 3.5 GPA (weighted or unweighted) and an intention to transfer to a four-year college or university are eligible.

Upon successful completion of the Honors Program, students will earn a Certificate in Honors.

Admissions Procedures:

Interested students who meet the eligibility requirements must submit an application to apply for the coming Fall semester during the application filing period for priority admission—**October 1 - February 1.**

If selected as a potential candidate for the Honors Program, students will be contacted about scheduling an interview. Final candidates will be selected based on their application and their interview. Students granted admission will become a part of an Honors Program cohort.

Pete P. Peters Honors Program Opportunities

- an opportunity to apply for a \$1500-\$2,000 scholarship upon successful completion of the Honors Program via the Certificate in Honors, contingent upon funding
- an opportunity to apply for a \$1,000-\$1500 scholarship each Spring semester upon successful matriculation in the Honors Program and contingent upon funding—only students enrolled in the RC Honors Program are eligible to apply for the Pete P. Peters Foundation Honors Scholarship.
- membership in the [Honors Transfer Council of California](#), which provides scholarship opportunities and opportunities for transfer to over thirty-five universities throughout the country
- membership in the [UCLA Transfer Alliance Program \(TAP\)](#), which provides priority admission consideration at UCLA for Reedley College Honors Program students who earn their Certificate in Honors and their transfer degree from Reedley College
- priority registration at Reedley College and choice of Honors courses each semester
- small classes taught by dedicated, research-minded instructors
- special transfer counseling
- opportunities to experience and present at interdisciplinary research forums, like the Central Valley Honors Symposium and other symposia

Summary:

Bulldog Bound is Fresno State's guaranteed admissions program. It provides high school students from partnering school districts who meet the minimum California State University requirements a guaranteed spot at Fresno State after graduation.

The program ensures qualified students have a clear, tangible path to college. Fresno State will support students and their families with admission preparation as early as ninth grade.

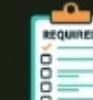

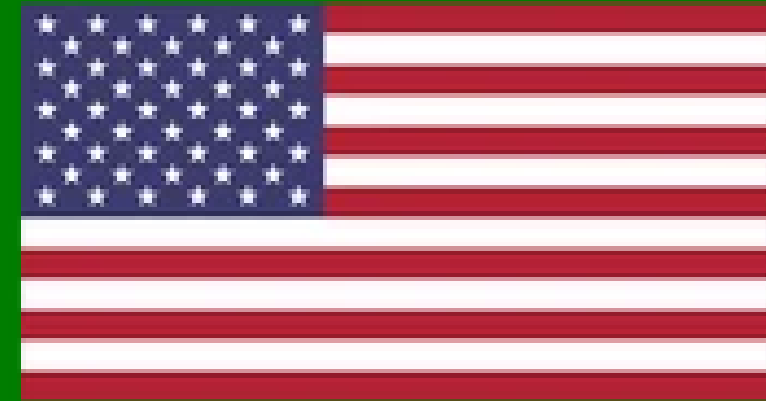

Now – Before October 1, 2026:

Step 1: Create FSA ID (both student & parent if applicable)

Ensure you have access to your email and can log in successfully

October 1, 2026:

FAFSA and CADAA applications officially open

Students can start filling out and submitting applications

October – December 2026:

Apply as early as possible to maximize financial aid opportunities

Gather all tax documents (2025 tax returns, W-2s, bank statements)

March 2, 2027:

Cal Grant priority deadline (for California students)

Spring 2027:

Colleges may request additional verification documents

- 1 Go to CalKIDS.org
 - 2 Click “Access My Account.”
 - 3 Enter your Statewide Student ID (SSID) (find it on your report card or ask the counseling office) + your date of birth.
- If you qualify, the money will be sent directly to your college or training school after graduation—no repayment required. (Students need to notify where to send the money in the Spring)

Created by the State of California, CalKIDS provides **up to \$1,500** in free money for eligible school-aged children to help kickstart their savings for future college and career training expenses.*

Your child may already have an account established in their name. Claiming your child's college savings account is quick and easy! Visit CalKIDS.org and have the information listed below handy.



What you'll need to claim your account:

- ✓ **Statewide Student Identifier (SSID)**—contact your school for assistance
- ✓ Student's **date of birth**
- ✓ The **county** where the student was enrolled on the applicable Fall Academic Census Day

Fall Academic Census Day is a day within the Academic Year on which an official count is taken. The Fall Census Day is the first Wednesday in October. Students identified in 1st – 12th grade in 2021-22 should use the county as of their school attendance on October 6, 2021. Students identified in 1st grade in subsequent years should use the county as of the applicable Fall Academic Census Day.

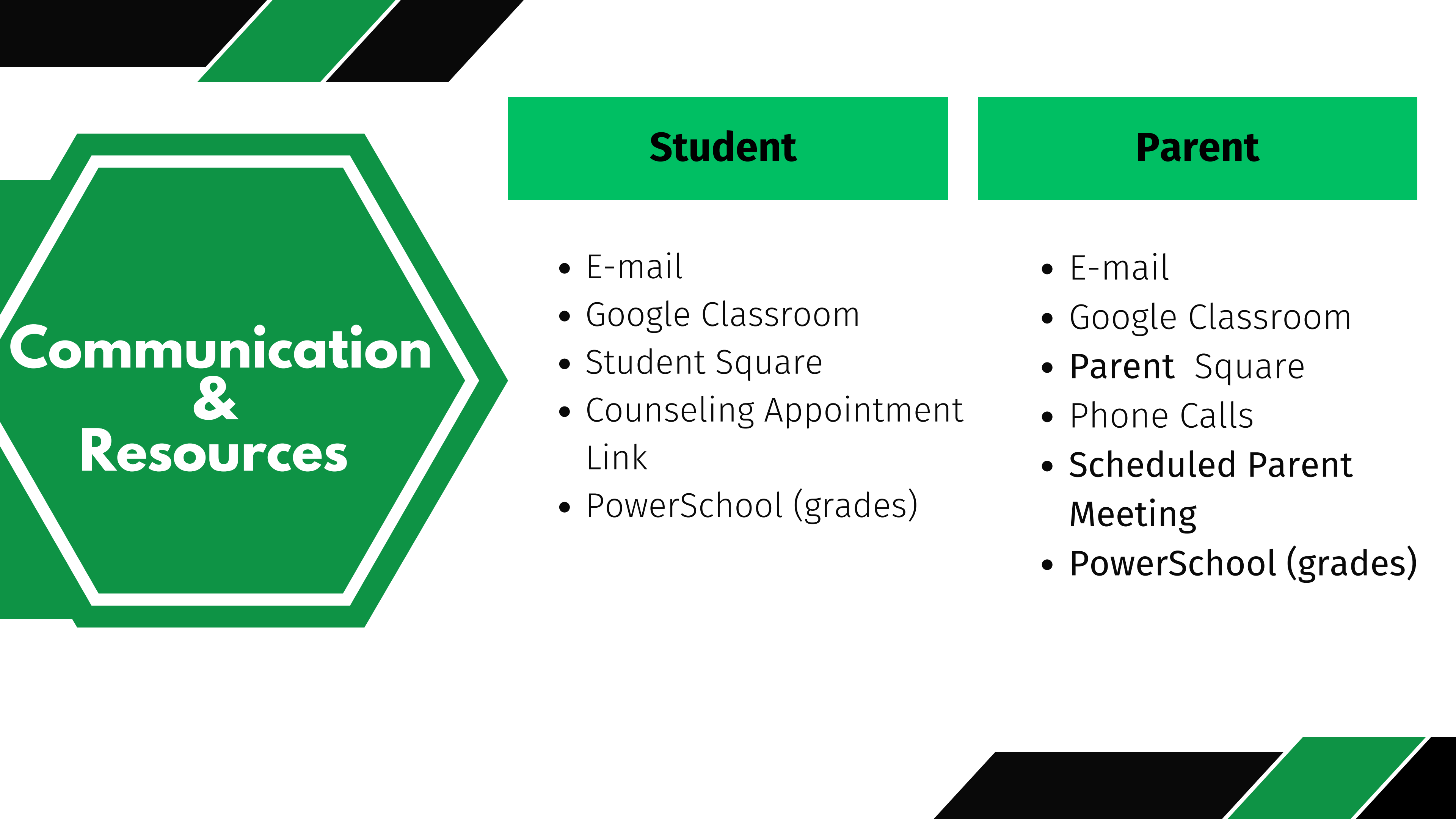
