

Richmond County School System's Goals

During the 26-27 school year, we will increase content mastery for student groups in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.

Hornsby Goals:

During the 2026–2027 school year, the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner and above achievement levels in 3rd–5th grade ELA will increase by 3% as measured by the Georgia Milestones EOG assessment, and grades K–2 students scoring on grade level or above will increase by 3% from 38% to 39% as measured by i-Ready.

During the 2026–2027 school year, the percentage of students scoring at the Developing Learner and above achievement levels in 3rd–5th grade Math will increase by 3% from 42.7% to 43% as measured by the Georgia Milestones EOG assessment, and grades K–2 students scoring on grade level or above will increase by 3% from 28% to 29% as measured by i-Ready.

During the 2026–2027 school year, we will decrease chronic absenteeism by 3% from 26.68% to 25%.

Jointly Developed

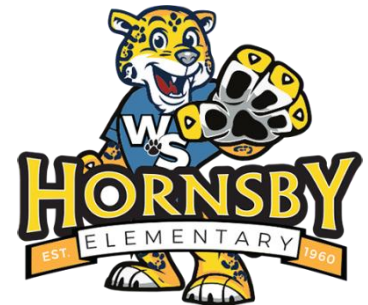
What is Title I?
