Serving a 50-square-mile area in St. Clair County, O'Fallon Township High School District 203 operates one comprehensive high school across multiple locations. Freshmen attend the Milburn Campus, while students in grades 10-12 attend the Smiley Campus, which also houses district offices. Additional district locations include OTHS South, serving special and alternative education students, and the OTHS Transition House, providing transition services. The district serves approximately 2,500 students and employs more than 300 full-time faculty and staff.

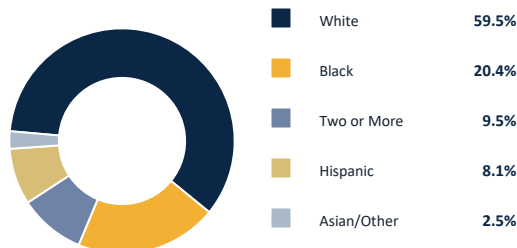

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

OTHs offers more than 220 courses across general, enriched, honors, Advanced Placement, dual-credit, career and technical education, AFJROTC, and specialized student-support pathways. Sixty-four percent of teachers hold a master's degree or higher, and teacher retention is 95.9%.
