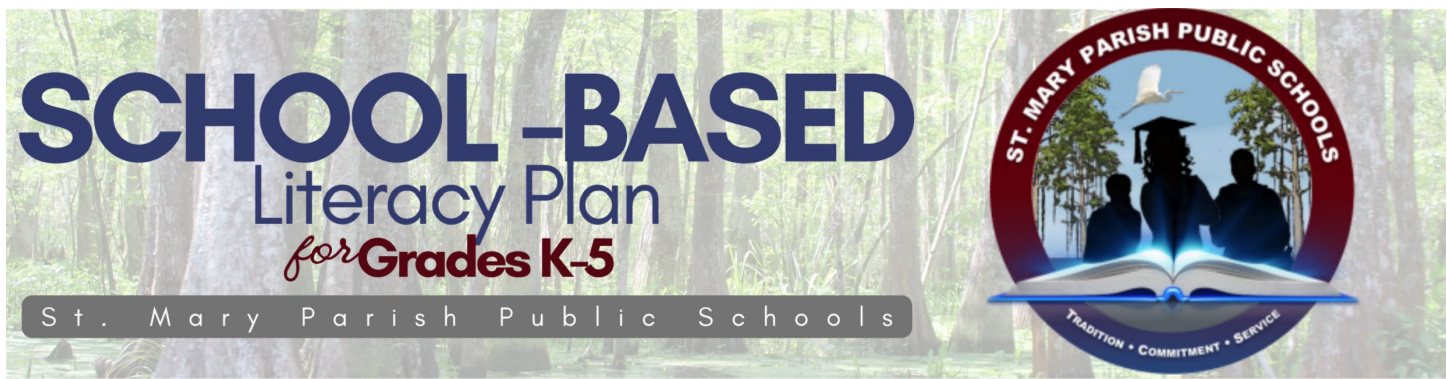




Introduction	Our district is committed to ensuring that all students from Pre-K through 12th grade achieve or surpass their individual literacy goals through the delivery of high-quality core instruction, as evaluated by multiple data sources. Educators will use benchmark assessment data to inform and guide their instructional choices. Regular collaboration with school leaders and colleagues will support efforts to track student progress and plan targeted instructional support, ensuring every student has the opportunity to reach grade-level literacy standards. Ongoing, embedded professional development will be provided to support teachers in implementing the curriculum, delivering effective interventions, and strengthening writing instruction.
Amount of time devoted to literacy skills instruction in Grades K-5	Grades K-2 have 135 dedicated minutes to foundational literacy skills through Tier 1 core instruction, per day. - Sixty minutes are spent on learning the English sound code through systematic phonics. - Sixty minutes are spent on vocabulary development, the building of background knowledge, and standards associated with speaking and listening. - Fifteen minutes are spent on phonemic awareness. Students in Grade 3 receive approximately 120 minutes, while students in Grades 4–5 receive approximately 90 minutes of Tier 1 core literacy instruction each day. - This time is spent on reading, writing, speaking, and listening, and language.
ELA Textbooks and instructional materials for Grades K-5	The school uses Core Knowledge Language Arts published by Amplify Education in Grades K-2 - both the Skills and Knowledge strands - as its Tier 1 curriculum. - The Skills curriculum provides students with instruction in phonemic awareness, decoding, and spelling. It grows in complexity from kindergarten through 2nd grade. The Knowledge strand uses read-alouds and writing activities to build students’ knowledge of science, social studies, and literature. It also provides students with the opportunity to learn and use diverse academic vocabulary. Grades K-2 classrooms also utilize the Heggerty program. Grades 3-5 also use the Core Knowledge Language Arts published by Amplify Education as its Tier 1 curriculum. - The CKLA Curriculum focuses on the following principals of instruction: - Analysis and expression in reading and writing - Fostering “wonderful conversationalists” - Explicit language instruction - Rich variety of text and contexts

	○ Maximizing vocabulary acquisition through contextualized, content-based, and constant exposure. ○ Continuing to build background knowledge for strong comprehension Literacy benchmark assessments are given at BOY, MOY, and EOY. All data from literacy and curriculum benchmarks are analyzed at the end of every window and used to make future instructional decisions. Data is also analyzed at the district level to identify trends across the parish. School support is designed based on these trends and individual school performance. Grades 3-5 students also take district common assessments to track progress toward mastery in ELA curriculum based on LEAP standards.
Interventions provided for K-5 students	Grades K-5 students are provided with an additional 30-45 minutes outside of core instruction to review and practice ELA skills. During this time, students are provided: • Small group teacher-led instruction is based on data from benchmark assessments, and progress monitoring. • Lexia instruction on specific skills in a systematic way. The program is designed to be a blended learning model. Students work on their prescribed lessons, and teachers can also provide small group instruction using Lexia printed lessons that correlate to student need.
Professional Development in foundational skills provided to teachers	All teachers who teach cores subjects in Grades K-3 have or are completing science of reading training provided by the LDOE (or completed through previous vendors). School-based professional development is provided in weekly PLCs focusing on data analysis, interventions, curriculum unpacking, planning, etc. The district provides beginning-of-the-year Initial Trainings on CKLA, Lexia, and Heggerty to all new teachers. During the year, district instructional specialists provide embedded professional development during on-site PLCs.
School literacy screener results	Based on May 2026 EOY data, 74% of students are performing at or above grade level. The school anticipates an annual increase of 5-10% in student proficiency, with the goal of reaching 79% of students performing at or above benchmark by May 2027.
Family Engagement and Communication	Family Engagement at the district-level includes two Family Engagement nights that will focus on curriculum, safety, and community outreach. Family Engagement and Communication at our school level includes: • Sending home literacy screener results after each benchmark testing • Posting school literacy plan on the school website. • Hosting a family literacy night (fall). • Hosting a family/math workshop for the 100th Day of School. • Provide monthly Family Ties Workshop for parents covering a variety of topics (DIBELS & LEAP Testing, learning in everyday situations, early literacy, summer reading programs, etc.) • Providing resources and check-out materials for parents to assist at home (upon request). • Provide books to students from the book machine to begin a home library. • Provide a variety of reading opportunities through the library (weekly book check-outs and Accelerated Reader). Students and parents can read these books at home each week. • Provide support to EL families by having bilingual books available for at-home use.
