WHAT IS ADR?

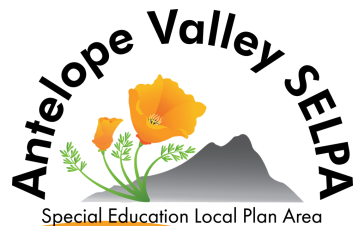
State and federal law provides that all children with disabilities are entitled to a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE). Eligible students and their parents are entitled to procedural safeguards when it comes to disagreements concerning decisions about your child.

ADR is a voluntary process for resolving disputes early with a focus on:

- clear communication
- collaboration, and
- mutual agreed upon outcomes
- that meet the interests of all parties involved, especially *the student*.

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AV SELPA Supported ADR Strategies

NEUTRAL IEP FACILITATION

- Guides both the **IEP meeting** and the **overall process**
- Follows the **IEP agenda and process**
- Ensures team members feel **valued** and **heard**
- Maintains a **productive, meaningful, and student-centered** meeting

COLLABORATIVE CONFERENCING

- **Collaboration** with families and district staff to **address disagreements**
- Serves as a **proactive** strategy to resolve concerns
- Focus on **improving** communication and collaboration

NEUTRAL MEDIATION

- Used when parents and school districts have a disagreement.
- **Voluntary** process
- A SELPA facilitator helps guide a **collaborative** discussion
- The goal is for both parties to reach a **solution** that benefits the **student**.

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
