During the 2025-26 school year, a diverse group of employees from across the district came together to grapple with hard, but necessary questions. **Where is Mapleton as a district? Where do we want to be? What will it take to get there?**

To find the answers, the team spent countless hours listening and learning. They interviewed students, staff, families, and community members, shadowed middle schoolers to better understand the learner experience, and pored over years of achievement data, survey results, and other performance measures.

The goal of this collaborative effort was to create Mapleton's new Strategic Plan. What emerged was more than a plan, but a map reflecting our shared hopes and collective wisdom. Rooted in a clear understanding of where we are and guided by purposeful way points, this map provides the direction and focus needed to reach our desired destination.

Our map leads us to a district where every student knows they don't just belong, but they matter. It also leads us to a district where high expectations and rigorous instruction are at the core of caring relationships, and every path leads to meaningful opportunities for students to learn, grow, and succeed.

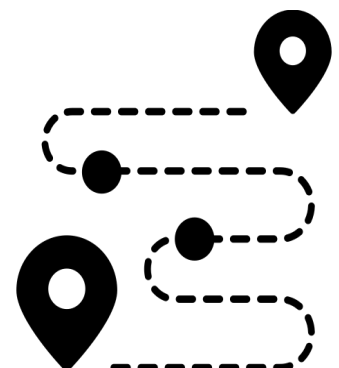

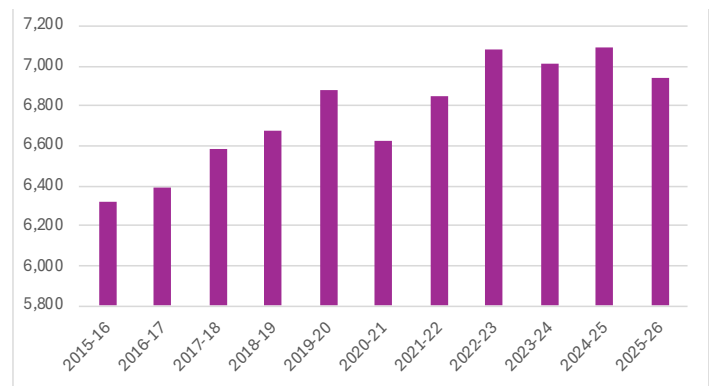


Enrollment

Enrollment in Mapleton has remained stable for more than a decade, however recent changes in birth rates, fertility rates and national and international migration into Colorado is starting to impact student counts.

A recent demographer report suggests enrollment in the district will continue to decline slightly for the next few years, but notes that trend is temporary. New housing developments as well as the opening of a new primary school in the northern most part of the district are expected to bring more families to Mapleton.

We are honest, real, and true to ourselves and others. We create a place where people can accept mistakes and celebrate success, while feeling safe to grow and do their best.



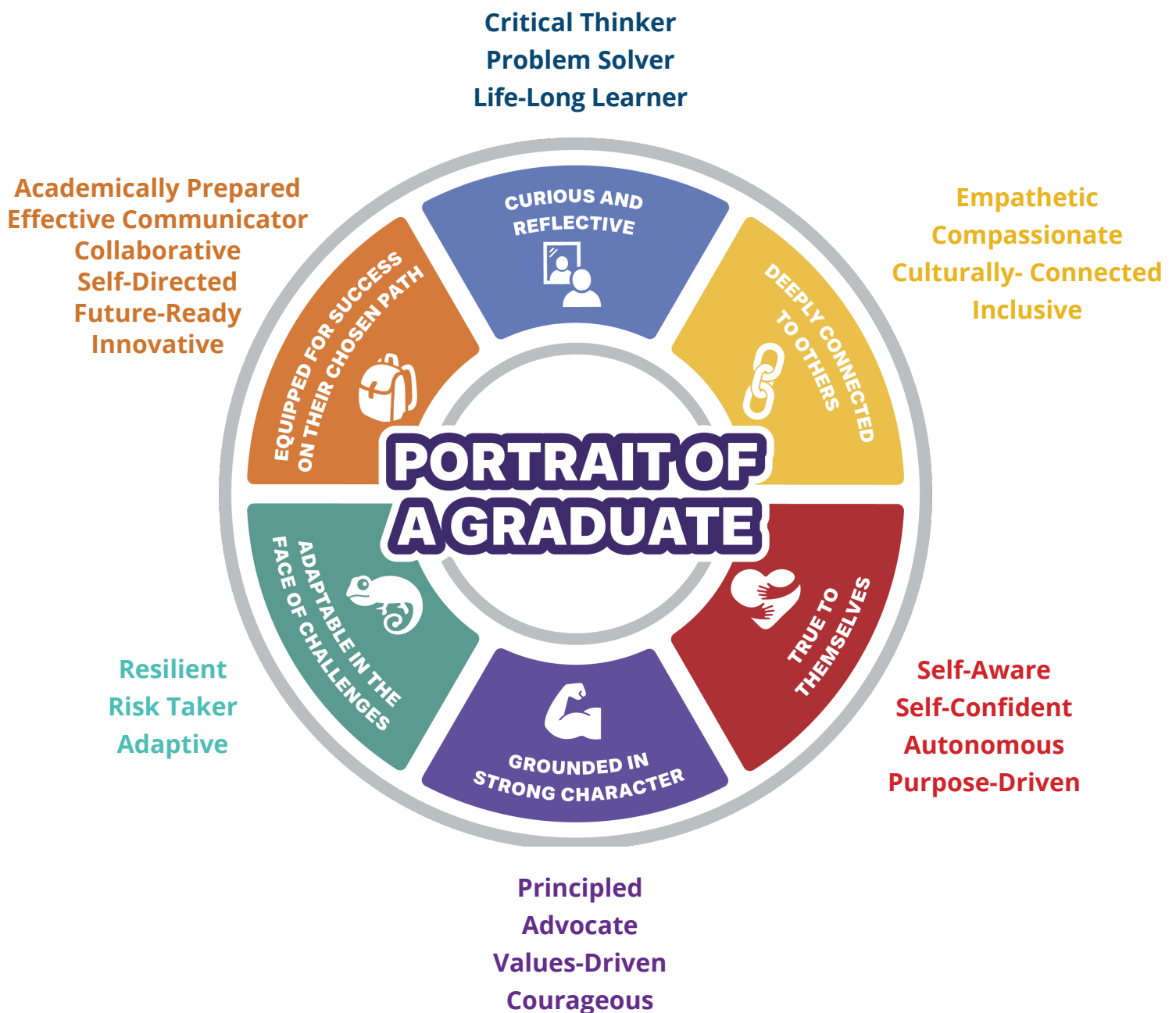
