PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Central Elementary School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

1. Central Elementary School will take the following actions to involve parents/families in the joint development of its school parent/family engagement plan under section 1112 of the ESEA:

- b) *Coordinate the annual parent/family meeting and other related Title I related events*

- 4. Central Elementary School will coordinate and integrate parent/family engagement strategies in Part A with parent/family engagement strategies under the following other programs: Glade Run, Prevention Project, Head Start and other local pre-school programs, and the SAP (Student Assistance Program) program by:
 - a) *Maintaining active communication with aforementioned locally established organizations (phone calls, e-mail, attending agency meetings, etc.)*
 - b) *Attempt to facilitate an annual meeting (on or off site) for district Title I staff and local agencies' representatives (Glade Run, Prevention Project, Head Start, etc.) to discuss and coordinate parent/family engagement processes*
- 5. Central Elementary School will take the following actions to conduct, with the engagement of parents/families, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parent/family engagement policy in improving the quality of its Title I, Part A schools. - a. The school will host an annual parent/family meeting
- b. The school will provide data review sessions at least twice yearly for parents to discuss assessment data and gain understanding of data and all above topics
- c. The school will disseminate information regarding parent/family workshops, trainings, conferences, etc., to all parents/family involved with the Title I program
- d. The school will maintain its involvement with the Beaver Valley Intermediate Unit's (IU27)

- b) The school will provide materials and training to help parents/families work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training, literacy events, and using technology, when appropriate, to foster parent/family engagement, by:

- 1) *Distributing flyers and/or notices for these types of activities to all parents/families engaged with the Title I program through weekly folders, the District website, and the District and Elementary social media, as appropriate*
- 2) *Offering school sponsored and district sponsored parent/family trainings that focus on literacy development*
- 3) *Providing district funded training opportunities for the Title I staff*

- c) The school will educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents/families as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents/families, and in how to implement and coordinate parent/family programs and build ties between parents/families and school, by:

- 1) *Providing district funded training opportunities for the Title I staff and other district staff involved with the Title I program*
- 2) *Offering school sponsored and district sponsored parent/family trainings that focus on mental health development and communication skills and methodologies (as needed)*

- d) The school will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parent/family engagement programs and activities with Glade Run, Prevention

Project and other programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent/family resource centers, that encourage and support parents/families in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:

1) Distribute outside agency meeting notifications (as available) to all parents/families engagement with the Title I program

- e) The school will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent/family programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents/families of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:

1) Disseminate all notices through students

2) Post notices in the school and on the district maintained website

3) List Title I staff and district contact information on all notices

- f) The school, in conjunction with parents, will develop a school-parent-student compact that outlines each participant's role in student academic learning, growth, and achievement by:

1) Distribute an annual invitation to participate in the compact's review and continued development

2) Modify and update the policy based, as needed, based on suggestions

3) Distribute the compact during Meet the Teacher Night

4) Encourage completion and return of signature page acknowledging roles and responsibilities

PART III. DISCRETIONARY SCHOOL PARENT/FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY COMPONENTS

Central Elementary School agrees to the following components:

- engaging parents/families in the development of training for teachers, principals, and other educators to improve the effectiveness of that training;
