

4. **Monitor progress** through reassessment and ongoing classroom observations.
5. **Adjust support** or recommend further action based on student response to intervention.
Possible have an SBLC meeting about student progression in the program.

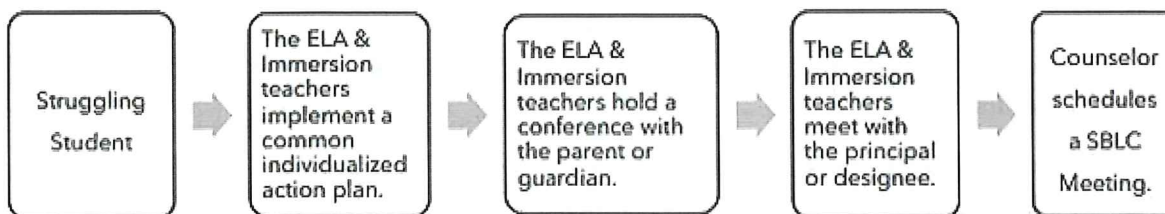


FIGURE 1.3: Coordinated Action Plan to Help Struggling Students

Additional Supports

- Mandatory parent meetings (e.g., **Open House**) to explain immersion benefits and literacy strategies at home.
- Bilingual communication about assessments, goals, and progress.
- Targeted **English-language support** for students flagged by DIBELS results.
- Access to online **World Language tools** (based on LDOE recommendations).
- **Tutoring services** are available through district programs.

3. Probation Criteria

Students may be placed on **probation** if academic or language development concerns arise. The goal is to provide early, focused intervention while maintaining immersion program integrity.

***Note:** Students cannot be withdrawn or exited from the immersion program without a formal **School Building Level Committee (SBLC) meeting** and **completed documentation** approved by Administration and the World Languages Department.

A. English Reading Proficiency (DIBELS)

- Students scoring **below benchmark on DIBELS** for **two consecutive screenings** are placed on **probation** and provided with targeted English intervention.
- If scores **do not improve** to benchmark after **two additional screenings** (with intervention), the student may be recommended for **exiting from the immersion program**.

B. Spanish Language Proficiency

- Teachers assess Spanish language growth through formative/summative assessments aligned with WL Proficiency Benchmarks.
- Students who **do not demonstrate grade-level Spanish proficiency** may:
 - Be placed on probation and/or an academic improvement plan.
 - Receive additional support and possibly an opportunity for reassessment, when deemed appropriate.
 - **If progress is not made despite interventions**, a conference will be held, and the student will be considered for an exit from the program.
