1st Quarter Progress Reports

The grading period for 1st Quarter Progress Reports ends on September 3rd. Eligibility will be determined for all freshmen playing a Fall Sport from 1st Quarter Progress Reports. Any freshmen athlete in a Fall Sport who does not meet eligibility will not be able to continue playing/practicing.

Eligibility (Please refer to the [LHS Student Handbook](#) for more details.)

Academic Criteria: The student must be maintaining minimum progress toward meeting the high school graduation requirements as prescribed by the governing board. Student must maintain at least a 2.00 GPA and have no F's.

Attendance Criteria: A student may not have more 7 unexcused single-period absences and no more than 10 unexcused tardies.

Other Criteria: Any student suspended for more than 3 days for a single incident will become immediately ineligible for extracurricular activities and athletics for 30 calendar days from the day the student returns to school

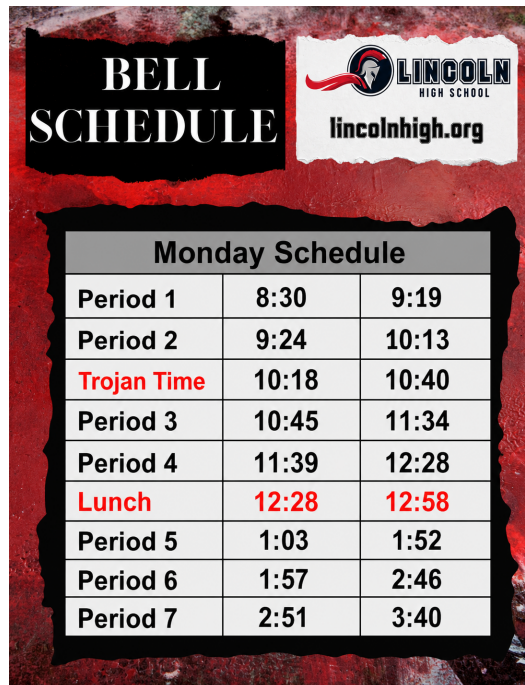
Trojan Time (Monday Homeroom)

Off Campus Pass (Juniors and Seniors)

Please make note of the following requirements below, and discuss these requirements with your students before signing the permission slip.

Lincoln High School students in grades 11 and 12 will be permitted to leave campus only if the following criteria are met:

- A GPA of 2.0 or greater in the most recent progress report/quarter, no F's
- No more than 7 unexcused (single period) absences from last quarter
- A signed parent/guardian permission slip
- No outstanding bills or fines
- No unserved Saturday Schools

*Students who are returning late from lunch with an Off Campus Pass can have their pass revoked for the semester.

Parking Permit

*Parking Sticker Enforcement: Starting **September 14th**, our Public Safety Officers will be issuing citations to all students and staff without a current parking sticker.*

Parking Permit applications are available in the Student Service Center M-Z side for students who wish to park in the front main parking lot as well as the fenced-in parking lot between the Sierra gym and Sture Larsen classrooms on

Harrisburg. **Students are not allowed to park on Stanton at any time during 7:00 am – 3:00 pm, or they will be cited. Citations will also be issued to any student parked in a designated staff or visitor space.**

To be issued a Parking Permit, they will need to provide a Valid California Driver's License, current vehicle registration and current proof of insurance along with the completed application. **Our Safety Officers will assign citations to any student or staff who does not have a Parking Permit.** Staff will need to go to the District Office; Human Resources to obtain a new Parking Pass. Citations will also be issued to any student parked in a designated staff or visitor space. Please read the form carefully so you are clear on the rules & regulations that are to be followed when being issued a Parking Permit. Thank you!

Cell Phone Policy: Cell phones are not to be used during class. When cell phones are taken away during class, you may pick them up in the Student Service Center AFTER school, at the END of the day, not after class.

Counselor's Corner

LHS Counselors are here to help your students navigate all aspects of high school whether it be academic, collegiate, career planning, and/or social emotional support. All counselors meet with each student at least once each semester.

Beginning September 1st - September 25th, counselors will conduct individual Senior meetings with each Senior. This meeting will consist of a social/emotional check in, transcript review, college application planning, career goals and planning, Financial Aid and Scholarships, and additional graduation information. Please help us encourage your Seniors to stay connected on campus and get involved with all of their final senior activities, as well as maintaining strong grades to ensure graduation status and eligibility for activities and events.

Schedule Change Requests:

If your student is struggling in a class, Counselors encourage you and your student to communicate directly with the teacher about any concerns. Often, misunderstandings or concerns can be resolved through a conversation. We understand that many of you have taken your first assessment and may be concerned with your current grade. Here are some steps to take :

1. Reach out to the teacher directly to get additional support
2. Attend tutoring
3. Form study groups or find one person to study with
4. Evaluate your study habits (do you use flashcards, take notes, use class time wisely, review on Quizziz, review material in shorter segments instead of cramming for a test all in one session, etc.)

Counselors are here to support your students, as well. If they need additional support, counselors are happy to meet with your student.
