We are pleased to inform you that the Seaford Union Free School District will be offering meals at no cost to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs for the 2026/2027 School Year.

All students enrolled at the following schools are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2026/2027 school year.

Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submitting an application. No further action is required of you. **However, families are strongly encouraged to complete and submit the Household Income Eligibility Form. (This form is to determine eligibility for additional State and Federal program benefits your child(ren) may qualify for.** Only one application is needed for ALL children in the household. The application should be returned to your child(ren)'s school).

Nondiscrimination Statement: This explains what to do if you believe you have been treated unfairly.
