Hudson is a suburb located 15 miles north of Akron and 20 miles southeast of Cleveland. The Hudson City School District is comprised of the city of Hudson and small parts of Boston Heights Village, Boston Township and Cuyahoga Falls. Approximately 4,560 students attend the six Hudson schools. This highly competitive institution is a four-year comprehensive high school that offers a challenging college preparatory program. The school has an enrollment of 1405 students in grades 9 through 12.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- #9 ranked public high school in Ohio, #1 in Akron Metro area, #1 in Summit County and #310 in the US according to *US News & World Report*.
- 6 Hudson High School students have posted perfect 36 composite score on the ACT in the past 2 years.
- 27 Advanced Placement courses are offered. All AP students must take the Advanced Placement test.
- Hudson High School is designated AP Honor Roll Platinum Tier, the highest level of recognition from College Board. 80% of the graduating class of 2025 took at least one AP exam during high school; 75% scored a 3 or higher on at least one exam.
- 178 Hudson High School students were inducted into membership in the National Honor Society in the 2025-2026 school year.
- 159 Hudson High School graduates in the class of 2026 earned the State of Ohio Honors Diploma.
- 262 seniors graduated with designated honors in 2026: 86 earned Cum Laude honors (3.67-3.99); 83 earned Magna Cum Laude honors (4.00-4.32); 93 earned Summa Cum Laude honors (4.33 and above).

NATIONAL MERIT QUALIFYING TEST

16 seniors in the class of 2026 have been recognized as National Merit Scholars: 1 as a finalist and 15 as commended.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

27 Advanced Placement courses offered; Hudson High School is designated AP Honor Roll Platinum Tier, the highest level of recognition from College Board.

725 students took 1747 AP tests in May 2026 with 92% scoring a 3 and above. All students enrolled in AP classes are required to take the AP examinations. Courses offered: English Language, English Literature, US History, US Government, European History, Economics: Micro and Macro, Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics C, Environmental Science, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Precalculus, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, French, Spanish, German, Mandarin, Music Theory, Studio Art, Cybersecurity and Business with Personal Finance.

New Dimensions

New Dimensions is a rigorous interdisciplinary Humanities course that consists of Psychology, Philosophy, Anthropology, and Sociology. This highly selective program, team-taught by Social Studies and English faculty, is composed of seniors chosen through application and interview. The coursework stresses critical thinking and debate, primary research, study trips, and the attendance of cultural events. Students complete a 50-60 page research paper through both primary and secondary research.

Service Learning

Service Learning was recognized by the Ohio Department of Education as a “model program” in 2009 as a highly selective interdisciplinary approach to American Government, Contemporary Issues, and British Literature with an emphasis on learning through service. Each student completes approximately 200 service hours per year and participates in the USA Freedom Corps. The Service Learning program logs an average of an impressive 18,000 total hours of community service each year.

H2BE

This co-taught Honors Biology and Honors English 9 is a research-based course focused on critical thinking and application. The course integrates biological concepts with literature that complements these topics and meets state standards. An outdoor component of the class utilizes Hudson High’s land lab and nearby parks, and includes an overnight trip in the fall and a backpacking trip in the spring.

Geometric Design

This course is a project-driven curriculum combining Geometry and Industrial Design. Students will use various types of software, in conjunction with construction techniques to design, create and appreciate graphic and visual art projects while developing and applying Geometric concepts in accordance with state standards. This course can also be taken as an Honors Geometry credit.

Career Programs

30 Six District Compact career programs include work experience in skilled and technical occupations through cooperation with five other area school districts.

Peer Collaboration

The role of a Peer Collaborator is to support fellow students in the classroom as an advocate and role model, as well as to develop a better understanding of students’ academic diversity of needs. Peer Collaborators earn .5 credit per semester.
