ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

Students are required to complete 230 credits. Students earn 5 credits per course, per semester. Students in grades 9-11 must enroll in six courses per term. Students in grade 12 must enroll in at least five courses. Students are required to take 3 years of math and 4 years of English on campus in our classrooms.

C: 70-79%

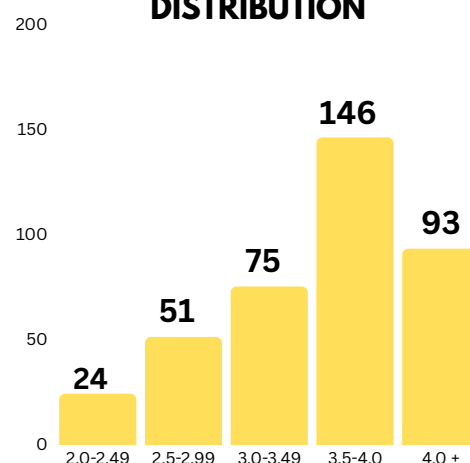

SCHOOL DAY

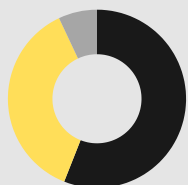
Our school day is a modified block

- 7 periods/day - students take 6 classes
- *Monday:* Six 47-minute periods
- *Tuesday-Wednesday:* Three 80-minute rotating periods with a 47-minute mandatory support period.
- *Thursday - Friday:* Three 93-minute rotating periods
- *Period 7:* Tuesday/Wednesday 51-minute periods, Thursday/Friday 59-minute periods.

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Career Technical Education (CTE) programs involve multiyear sequences of courses that provide students with a pathway to postsecondary education and careers. Careers such as computer technology, cybersecurity, investments, culinary arts, and engineering/robotics skills are explored. Entertainment industry specific coursework includes stagecraft, performance, broadcasting, film/video production and costume design. All CTE courses have been approved by the University of California A-G system to satisfy subject requirements.

AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA

The AP Capstone Certificate is offered at CHS as a two-year elective program. Students gain experience conducting academic research. In year one, students explore real-world issues of their choosing, create research-based arguments, and evaluate potential solutions. This work culminates in year two with a student selected research project on a topic that is meaningful to them. If students pass four additional AP Exams, they will graduate with an AP Capstone Diploma.
