PSAT: October 14th - 8:00AM (\$60) This test is aimed at 10th and 11th grades, but all grades can attend.

SAT: October 28th - 8:00AM (\$20) This test is aimed at 11th and 12th grades, but 10th graders can attend. Seniors will receive priority.

Important New Law

[New Law](#)

SB19 – Effective Jan. 1, 2026

- What is illegal? Making a threat to kill or seriously hurt someone at a school, university, daycare, workplace, medical facility, or house of worship.
- Does “online” count? Yes. This includes social media posts, images, or texts, as well as things said in person.
- The “Just Kidding” Rule: It is still a crime even if you don’t actually plan to carry it out. If the threat is specific enough to make people feel reasonably and continuously afraid for their safety, it is against the law.
- Consequences for Students: Possible MISDEMEANOR charge on your record. School consequences could range and include a possible suspension and possible recommendation for expulsion.
- Interventions for Students: May include a referral to counseling or wellness, and a referral to the Behavior Threat Assessment process.

-Senior Isabella Roberts represented team USA in the U19 Women's Eight rowing race in Bulgaria this summer. Well done Isabella! ([see photo](#))

-Isabella Roberts, Junior Emily Geluk and Junior Maya Royer represented their rowing team at the Junior Nationals competition in Sarasota Florida over the summer. Emily raced in the single, and Maya and Isabella with their respective crews. They all did great!

-Senior Amy Geluk, Sophomore Miles Guth and Freshman Sophia Sierra competed at the Nike Nationals meet in Eugene Oregon. Amy came home with a PR of 5'5" and a medal in the high jump, a 12th place finish in the 100m hurdles and 20th in the 400m hurdles. Miles ran his best time ever in the 800m... a 2:00.54! He finished 23rd out of 94 competitors. Sophia ran in the middle school mile. She ran a time of 5:31 and finished 10th in her heat and 89th overall. Attention All Drivers!

Unauthorized Parking Will Result in Tickets and Towing!

To ensure safety and convenience of everyone we are strictly enforcing parking regulations.

Please be aware that parking in the following designated areas without proper authorization will result in a parking ticket AND your vehicle being towed at your expense. Possible revocation of parking privileges.

- Senior Spots - Painted parking spot and must include OHS parking pass. (Seniors Only)
- Staff Parking - Designated for authorized staff member's only. Clearly marked as STAFF in the parking spot. (Must have New OHS STAFF DECAL)
- Visitor Parking - Reserved for **Visitors only**. (Clearly marked Visitor)
- Handicap Parking - Must have a handicap placard.
- Other open spots - Must have a current OHS Parking Pass.
