23 different events that range from engineering challenges like bridge building and rocketry to academic tests in astronomy and hands-on lab work in forensics. As a team, we emphasize collaboration and high-level problem solving. This approach has proven successful: in the past few years, we won the Nassau County Title and placed in the top 5 at the New York State Level. We are looking for dedicated students to join our teams this year. Try-outs will be announced in the early fall.

## MORNING
