A Note From Your Principal:

Greetings Roadrunner Families,

It was so nice to see so many of you at our Open House! Thank you for showing up for your child(ren), for your smiles and kind words, and for supporting our Funky Frostwich and Prince Street Pizza fundraisers, which we'll use to support future family engagement and student incentives! I'm looking forward to a year of partnering with you all!

Now that it's September, we've completed our baseline diagnostic and your students all have their iReady goals and lesson pathways on the computer program for reading and math (K-5). We're working hard to plan engaging and challenging lessons for them, and we're hoping you're supporting the teachers, such as by keeping up with our posts on Class Dojo, helping your child(ren) work toward their goals behaviorally and academically, and promoting reading and writing at home, whenever possible! This month, each of our grade levels will be sharing their Monthly Homework Menus. We have designed our homework system in this way to give you flexibility to work on what you can at home, when you can, while still giving your child(ren) extra practice on the skills and problems that support classroom learning. Please ensure that your child(ren) complete about one or two squares a day on the Homework Menu, as best meets your schedule.

Lastly, September is also the beginning of budget season. Count Day was Friday 8/28/26, and unfortunately, our enrollment was substantially under what we were projected, and therefore, I do anticipate budget cuts. Over the next couple of weeks, I'll be engaging with staff and families as transparently as possible while working toward solutions that will be the best for our students. We've been in this deficit before, and our staff continues to give their best for our students while taking on additional roles. If you're interested, I will be presenting our budget and a tentative plan to our School Organizational Team on Wednesday 9/16, and you are welcome to attend. It is virtual, and the link is on our school website.
