Get ready for a milestone year-the 2026-2027 school year marks 30 incredible years of learning and growing at Aggie Roberts Elementary! The staff and I have been busy all summer preparing to make this year our best yet. We haven't received our new star ranking yet. We know we were stable in math and ELA, and that our English Learners showed impressive growth, so we hope these factors will help us Level Up to 2 stars. We have analyzed our data (both student assessment and parent perception data) to help us determine our path this year. In alignment with the District's strategic plan, we'll be focusing on Academic Excellence, and we look forward to using our new computer program and assessment, i-Ready, to help your child(ren) grow and achieve. As in the last few years, we'll use our Diamond Award-winning PBIS systems to promote a Safe and Supportive school, which is also a District priority. As returning families know, we have a matrix called our Roadmap to Success that defines expected behaviors throughout the school. We give points in Class Dojo to students who demonstrate the expected behaviors, and students can use those points to purchase items of their choice in the Dojo store. Career Connected Learning and Durable Skills is another priority for the District this year, and at Aggie Roberts, each student will have a Portrait of a Learner Folder. They'll take a survey at the beginning of the year to help us understand their interests and aptitudes, and that data will help us plan learning experiences that both build durable skills like communication and resilience while exposing them to careers they might be interested in. They'll also track their progress toward their goals in their Portrait folder. Our theme of the year is "Grow Here, Go Anywhere," and we truly believe that in partnership with families to help students grow, students will be successful wherever they go.

Tucker's Corner



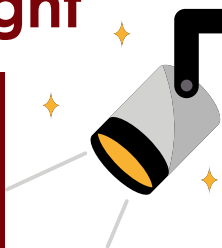
Welcome, Roadrunner families!
