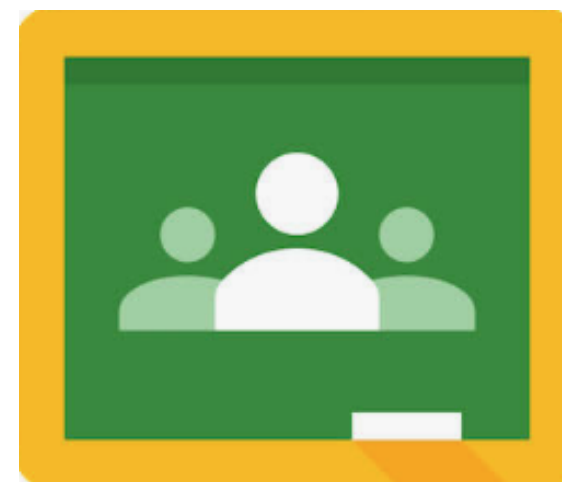

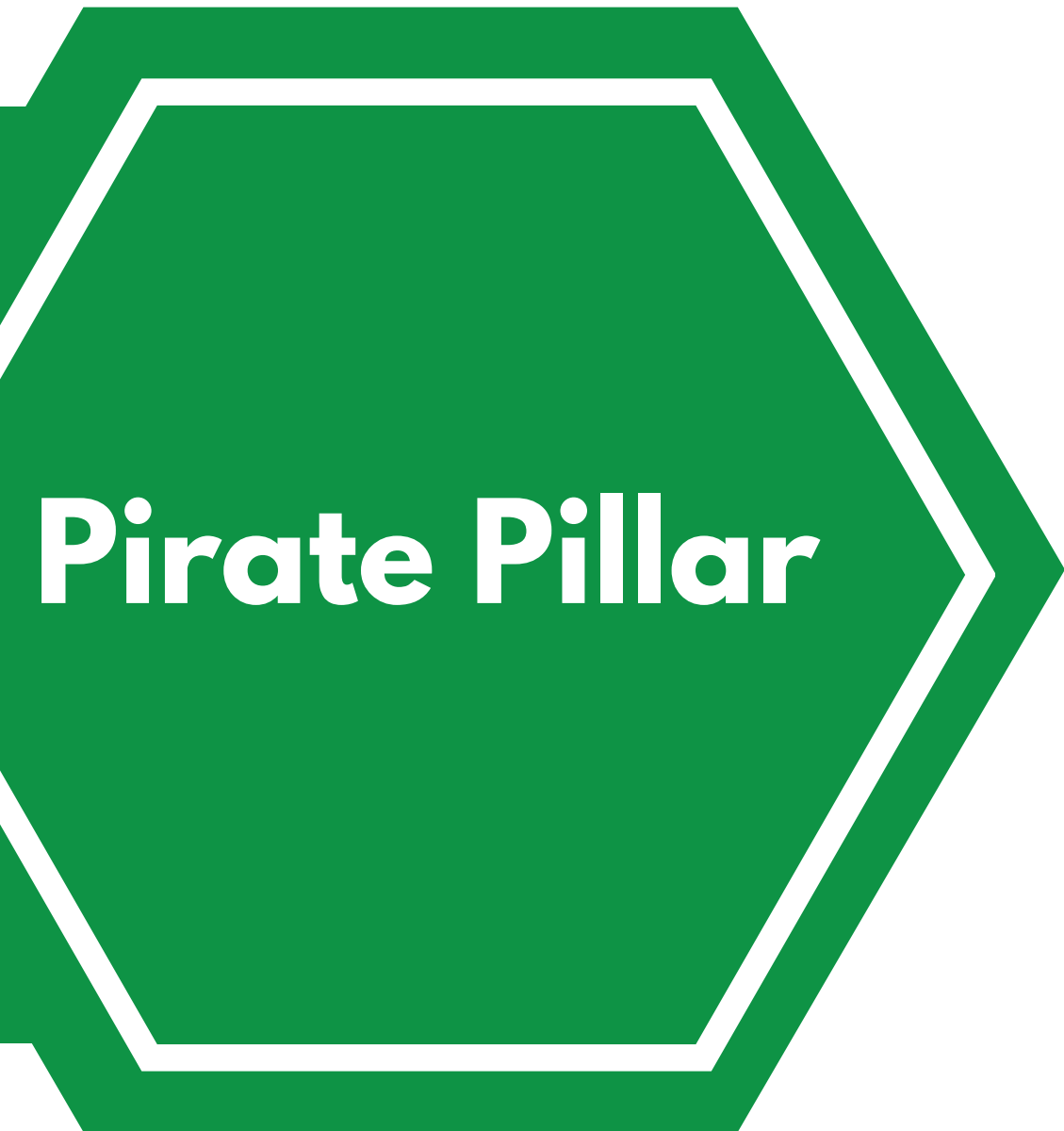

UNDERSTANDING A-G REQUIREMENTS



WHAT ARE A-G COURSES?

- A-G courses are classes you take in high school. Each A-G letter stands for a subject.
- Courses must be completed with a C or better.

You must complete your A-G courses to be eligible to apply to CSUs, UCs, and some private colleges.

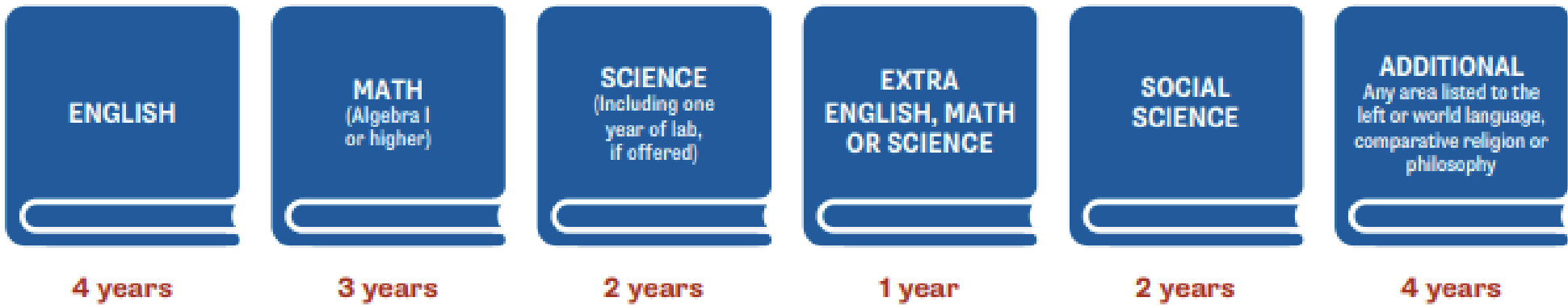

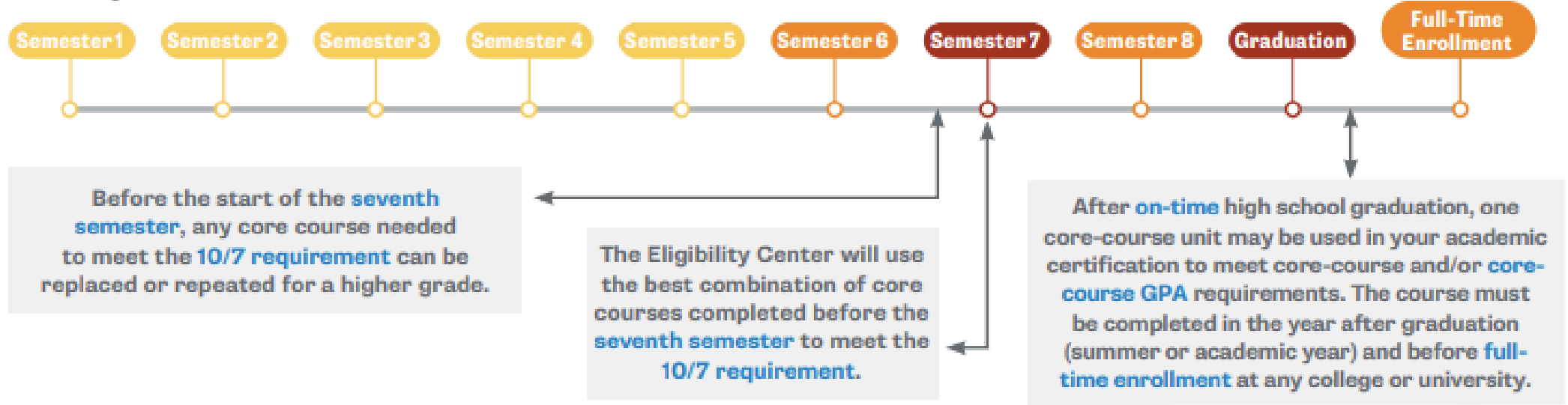
Division I Academic Standards

Division I schools require you to meet academic standards. To be eligible to practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship in your first year of full-time enrollment, you must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Register for an Academic and Athletics Certification account.
- 2. Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the following areas:



- 3. Complete 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in four consecutive academic years (eight semesters) from your initial start of ninth grade. If you graduate from high school early, you still must meet core-course requirements.
- 4. Meet the 10/7 requirement by completing 10 of your 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits, including seven in English, math and science, before the start of the seventh semester.

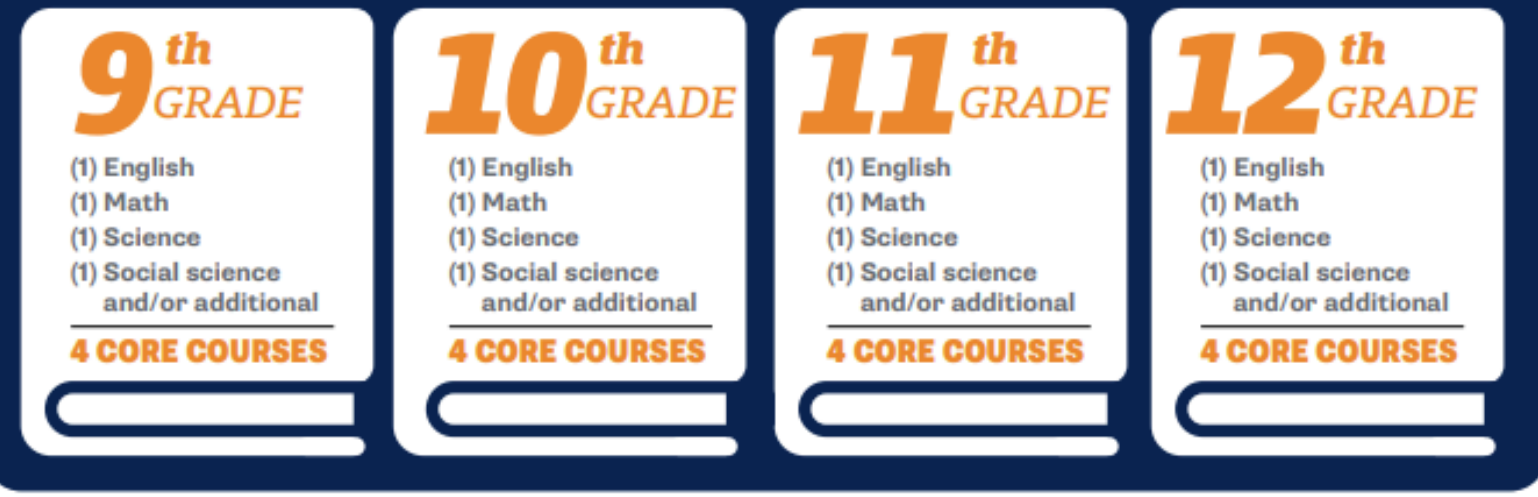


- » Students with solely international academic credentials are not required to meet the 10/7 requirement.
- 5. Earn a minimum 2.3 core-course GPA.
- 6. Ask your high school counselor to upload your final official high school transcript with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.
- 7. Receive academic and athletics certifications from the Eligibility Center.

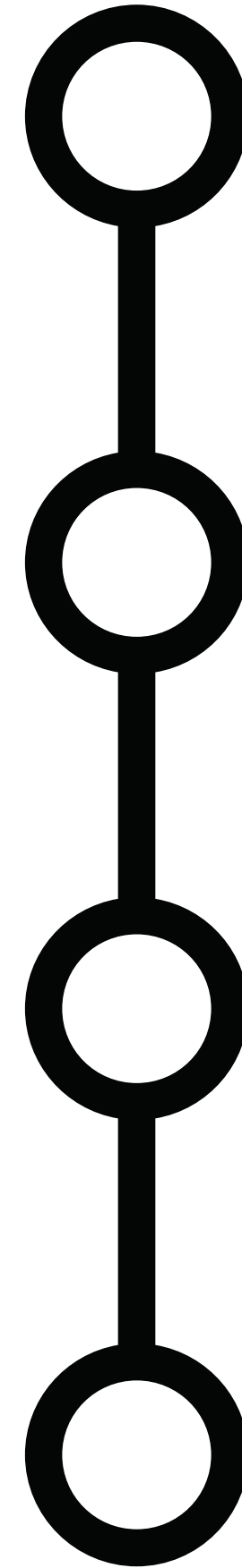
Example Schedule

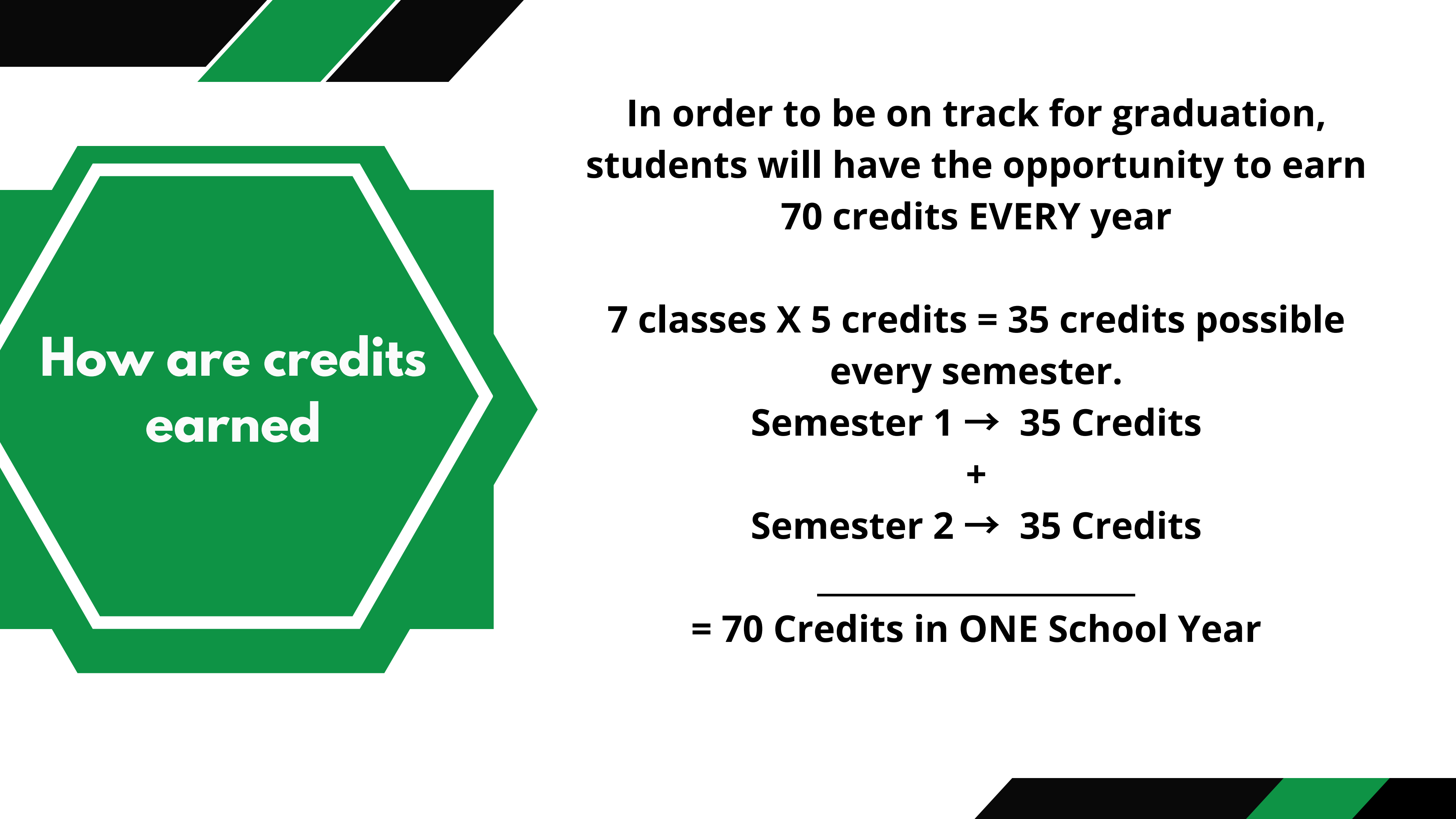

Credit Recovery

- **What is Credit Recovery?**

- It is an opportunity to retake a course you failed or earned a "D" grade in order to earn credit or for A-G purposes

- **When can I retake a course?**

- **After School Credit Recovery:** Days and times vary (52 Hours Total)
- **Winter Intersession:** Retake 1 class (semester 1 only) 5 Credits
- **Summer School:**
 - 2 Sessions (Session 1= Semester 1, Session 2= Semester 2)
 - Ex) Failed English 1 Semester 1 - attend S1 Class
 - Ex) Failed Math 1 Semester 2 - attend S2 Class

**Courses taken for credit recovery need to match the semester you originally took the class in*

*****IMPORTANT - The courses your student may need to retake may not always be offered.
It is CRUCIAL your student passes all their courses throughout the semester**

PETE P. PETERS HONORS PROGRAM

This pathway is for students from all majors and pathways. Students with a minimum 3.5 GPA (weighted or unweighted) and an intention to transfer to a four-year college or university are eligible.

Upon successful completion of the Honors Program, students will earn a Certificate in Honors.

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES:

Interested students who meet the eligibility requirements must submit an application to apply for the coming Fall semester during the application filing period for priority admission—**October 1 - February 1.**

If selected as a potential candidate for the Honors Program, students will be contacted about scheduling an interview. Final candidates will be selected based on their application and their interview. Students granted admission will become a part of an Honors Program cohort.

PETE P. PETERS HONORS PROGRAM OPPORTUNITIES

- an opportunity to apply for a \$1500-\$2,000 scholarship upon successful completion of the Honors Program via the Certificate in Honors, contingent upon funding
- an opportunity to apply for a \$1,000-\$1500 scholarship each Spring semester upon successful matriculation in the Honors Program and contingent upon funding—only students enrolled in the RC Honors Program are eligible to apply for the Pete P. Peters Foundation Honors Scholarship.
- membership in the Honors Transfer Council of California, which provides scholarship opportunities and opportunities for transfer to over thirty-five universities throughout the country
- membership in the UCLA Transfer Alliance Program (TAP), which provides priority admission consideration at UCLA for Reedley College Honors Program students who earn their Certificate in Honors and their transfer degree from Reedley College
- priority registration at Reedley College and choice of Honors courses each semester
- small classes taught by dedicated, research-minded instructors
- special transfer counseling
- opportunities to experience and present at interdisciplinary research forums, like the Central Valley Honors Symposium and other symposia

Bulldog Bound is Fresno State's guaranteed admissions program. It provides high school students from partnering school districts who meet the minimum California State University requirements a guaranteed spot at Fresno State after graduation.

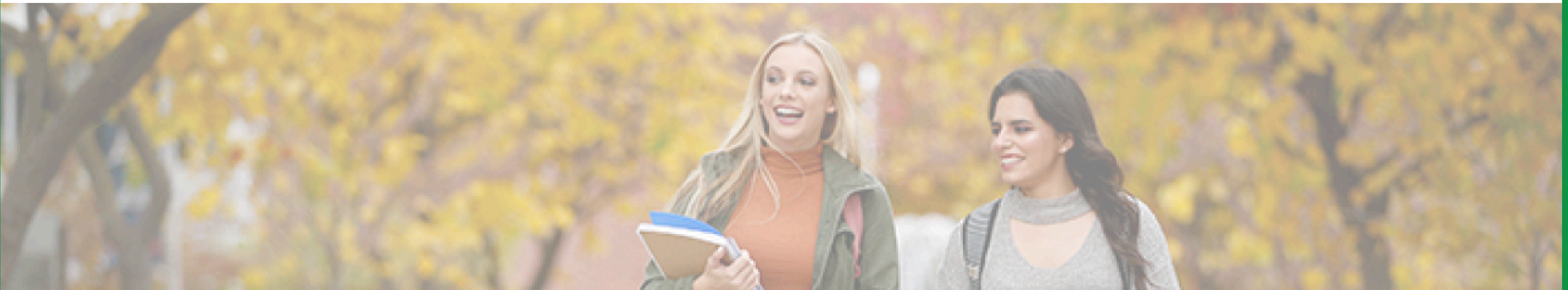

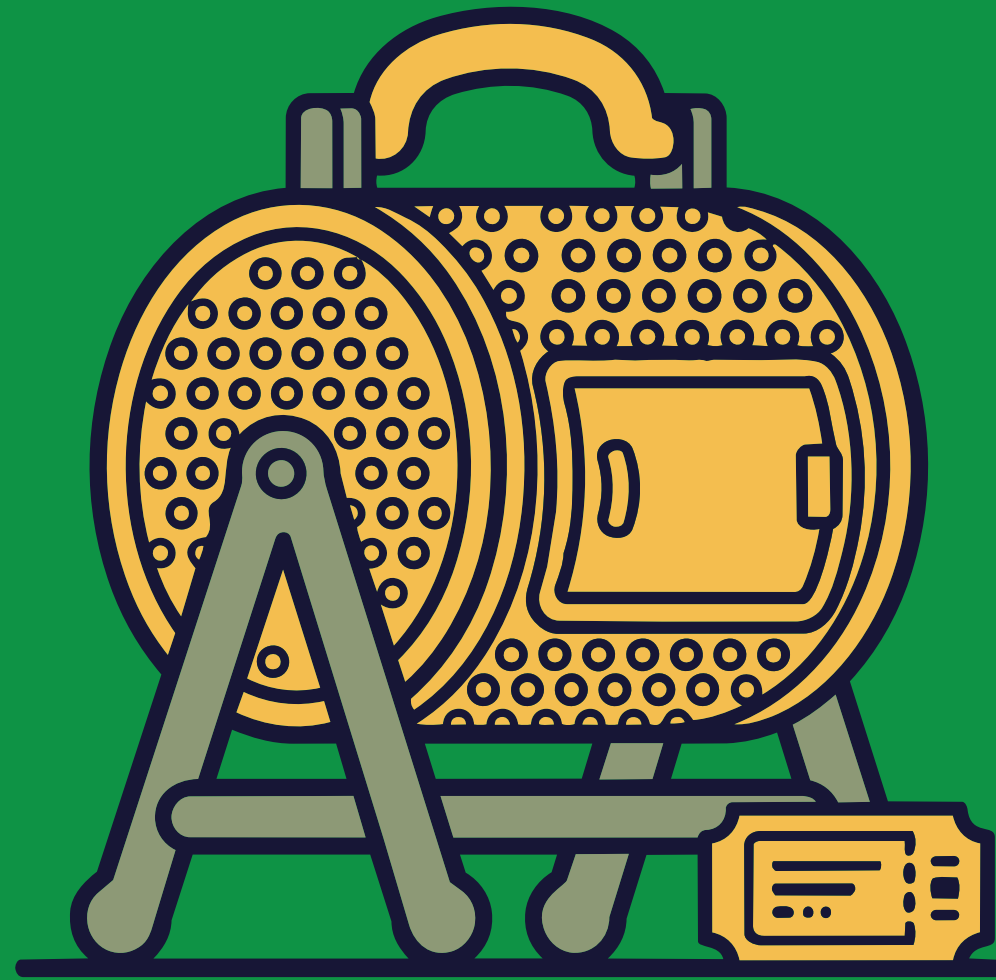
