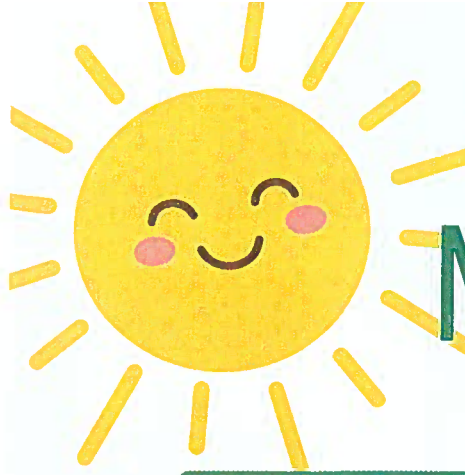

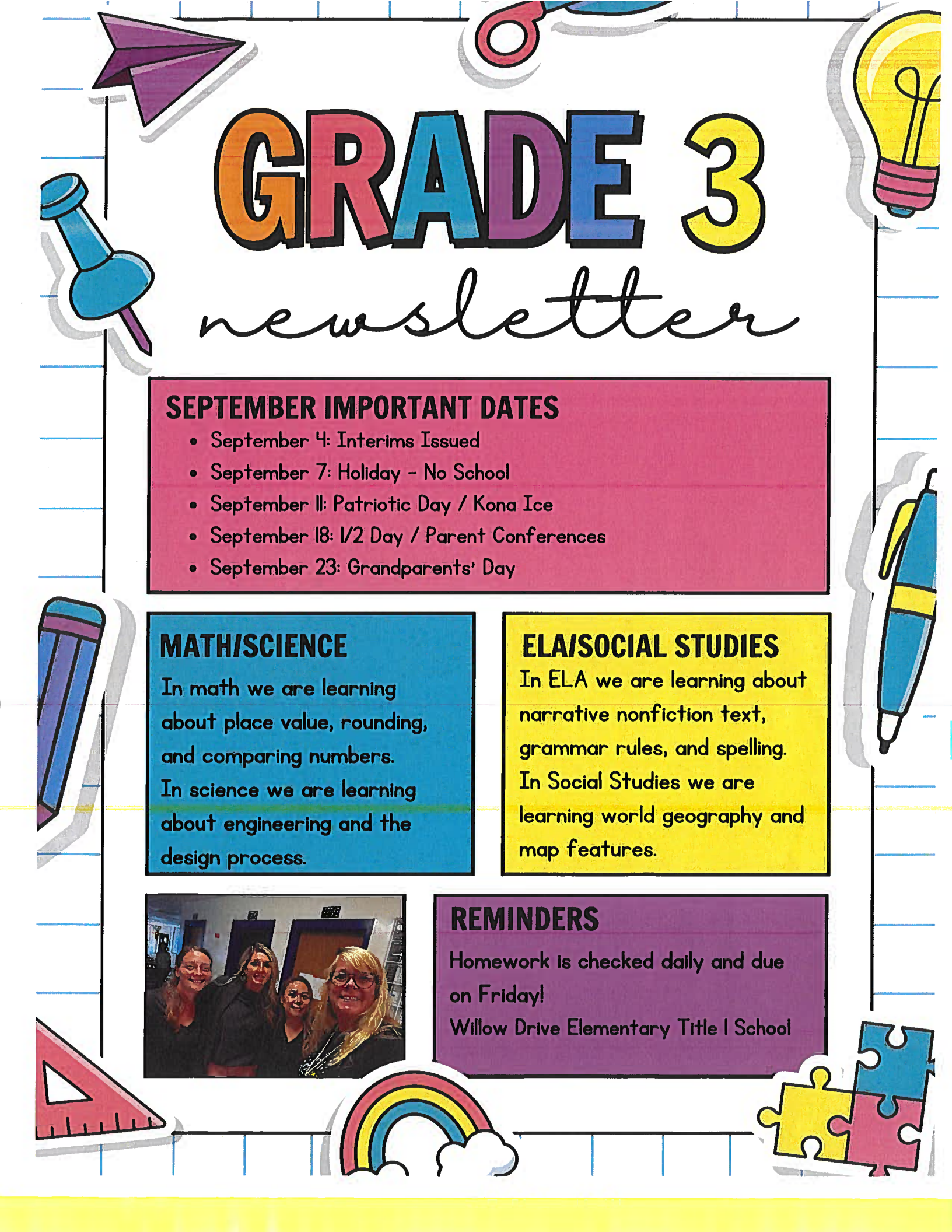

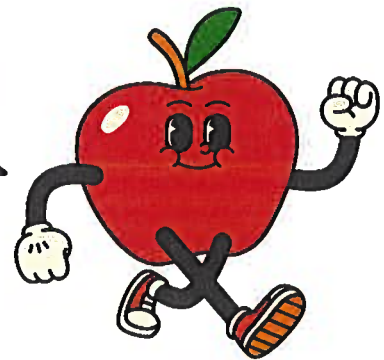

ELA

In September we will be working on learning to write strong sentences and the grammar skills necessary to do that.

We are also going to be studying story elements and how they they work together to make a strong story.



SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

SCIENCE:

In Science, we are learning how energy flows through ecosystems—from the Sun to plants and then to animals through food chains and food webs. We are also studying how organisms get and use energy, how plants make food through photosynthesis, and how matter cycles through systems such as the water and carbon cycles. Students are exploring how living and nonliving parts of an ecosystem depend on and interact with one another.

SOCIAL STUDIES:

In Social Studies, we are learning about westward expansion, immigration waves, industrialization, and frontier settlement from 1860–1910. We are also exploring Progressive Era reforms, World War I, the Great Depression, and the New Deal, including how these events expanded the federal government's role from 1910–1940.

MATH

In Math, we are learning how the position of each digit determines its value in whole numbers. Students are also building fractional reasoning by placing fractions on number lines, comparing them, identifying equivalent fractions, and understanding fractions as numbers that represent parts of a whole.
