Subject: Consider Approval of an Affiliation Agreement with the University of Houston-Clear Lake

Executive Summary: The University of Houston-Clear Lake (UHCL) has requested that Pearland ISD enter into an Affiliation Agreement to provide opportunities for UHCL students to participate in field practicum or internship placements within the District. The purpose of the affiliation is to provide teaching and learning opportunities that allow participating university students to meet established practicum or internship course objectives. UHCL will select students for placement, subject to District approval, and assign a faculty member to serve as the internship or practicum supervisor.

Under the agreement, Pearland ISD will accept qualified students for appropriate field practicum or internship placements and provide supervision, instruction, and appropriate resources necessary to support the placement. The agreement establishes the responsibilities of both parties related to student placement, supervision, communication, and participation. Either party may withdraw from the affiliation by providing seven (7) days' written notice.

Recommended Term:

The agreement becomes effective September 8, 2026 through July 1, 2030.

Subject: Consider Approval of Memorandum of Understanding with The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston (UTHealth Houston) for the Youth Aware of Mental Health (YAM) Program

Executive Summary: Pearland ISD seeks to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with UTHealth Houston, Department of Psychiatry, to participate in the Youth Aware of Mental Health (YAM) Program through UTHealth Houston's Risk and Resilience Network.

The YAM Program is a five-session program designed to increase knowledge and discussion about mental health among adolescents. The program uses interactive lectures and role-play activities to support problem-solving skills, emotional intelligence, self-awareness, empathy, listening skills, and perspective-taking.

Under the MOU, UTHealth Houston will provide program materials, a YAM facilitator and assistant, staff information and training, and implementation of five 45–60 minute student sessions. Pearland ISD will provide the necessary class time for implementation, coordinate with UTHealth Houston staff, and support student and family education related to the program.

Recommended Term:

The agreement is effective September 8, 2026 through June 30, 2028.

Executive Summary: Request for Proposal (RFP) 26-0121-1 for Fine Arts Contracted Services was issued to establish a multi-vendor, non-exclusive requirements contract for districtwide fine arts services. The solicitation was structured as a **rolling bid award** that supports multiple vendor awards and allows incremental vendor additions throughout the contract term.
