Mission

The objective of Alexandria City Public Schools strategic plan is to provide an equitable, high quality education which is accessible and engaging to all students in a five-year strategic plan approved by the Alexandria City School Board on May 8, 2025. The plan's mission is to be a bold, student-centered roadmap that reaffirms our commitment to providing every student, regardless of background, with access to a high-quality education. The new five-year plan builds upon the work of the Equity for All Strategic Plan and reflects the voices and shared values of students, families, staff and community members. The Facilities and Operations Department (via the Office of Safety and Security Services) works diligently to remove a potential barrier, unsafe school environments, in an effort to further the strategic plan.

Overview

The Office of Safety and Security Services manages and oversees all safety-related services for the school division to include emergency management procedures and protocols, assignment of school security officers, hardened safety infrastructure and the school law enforcement partnership with Alexandria Police Department. This office also collects, reviews and reconciles data related to incidents on school campus grounds and/or school-sponsored activities. The purpose of this report is to present the data (founded and unfounded) for:

- School Incidents for specified quarter(s).
- Calls for Service/Assistance by APD data for specified quarter(s).

Data Submission and Collection Methodology

Safety data is submitted in the following ways:

- ***Incident Report:*** School administrators will submit an Incident Report at the conclusion of an incident on school grounds.
- ***ACPS Calls for Service Form:*** If the Alexandria Police Department is requested to assist during a school safety incident, the school administrator completes and submits this form to the Director of Safety and Security Services.
- ***APD Calls for Service Report:*** If the Alexandria Police Department is called to assist during a school safety incident, that call is thoroughly documented by the police department and used as a cross reference for this report.

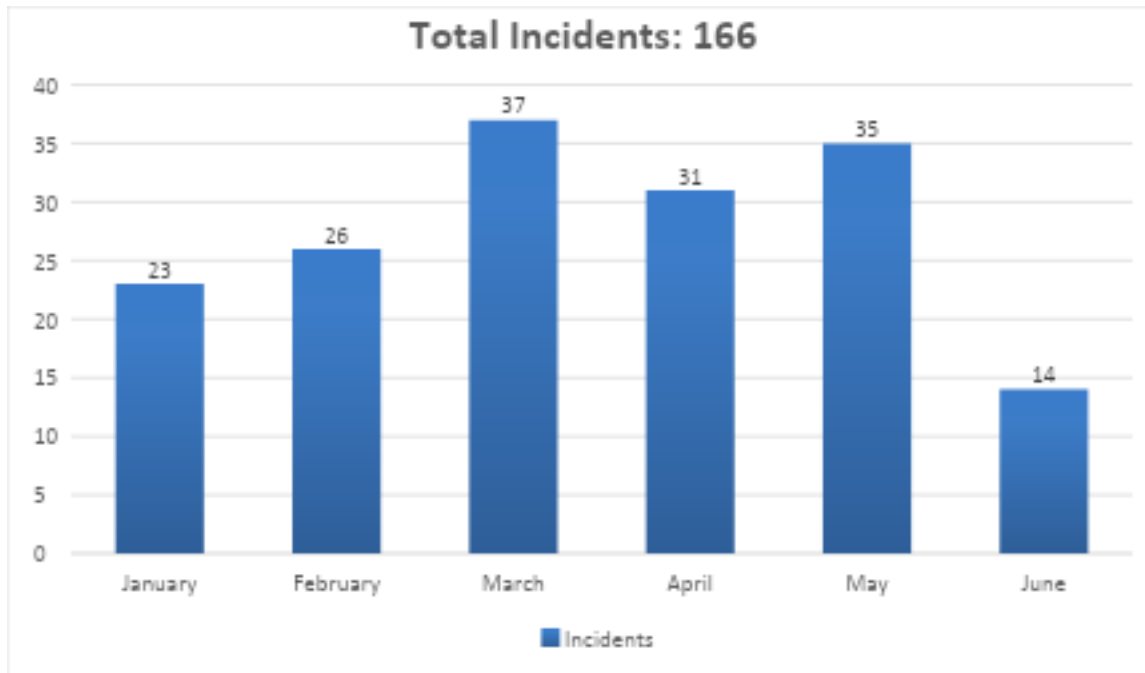
Once an incident report is submitted, the Office of Safety and Security Services collects the data into a template. This template is updated regularly and captures division-level data to include number and types of incidents per school, per day and per month. **It is important to note that all information related to student discipline data is collected and reviewed by the Department of Student Services and Equity. That data is not included in this report.**

Information that may reveal student identity will not be shared through this report. It is also understood that some statistics may change as a result of change in case status or data error.

(By Month, School Type, and Semester Comparison)

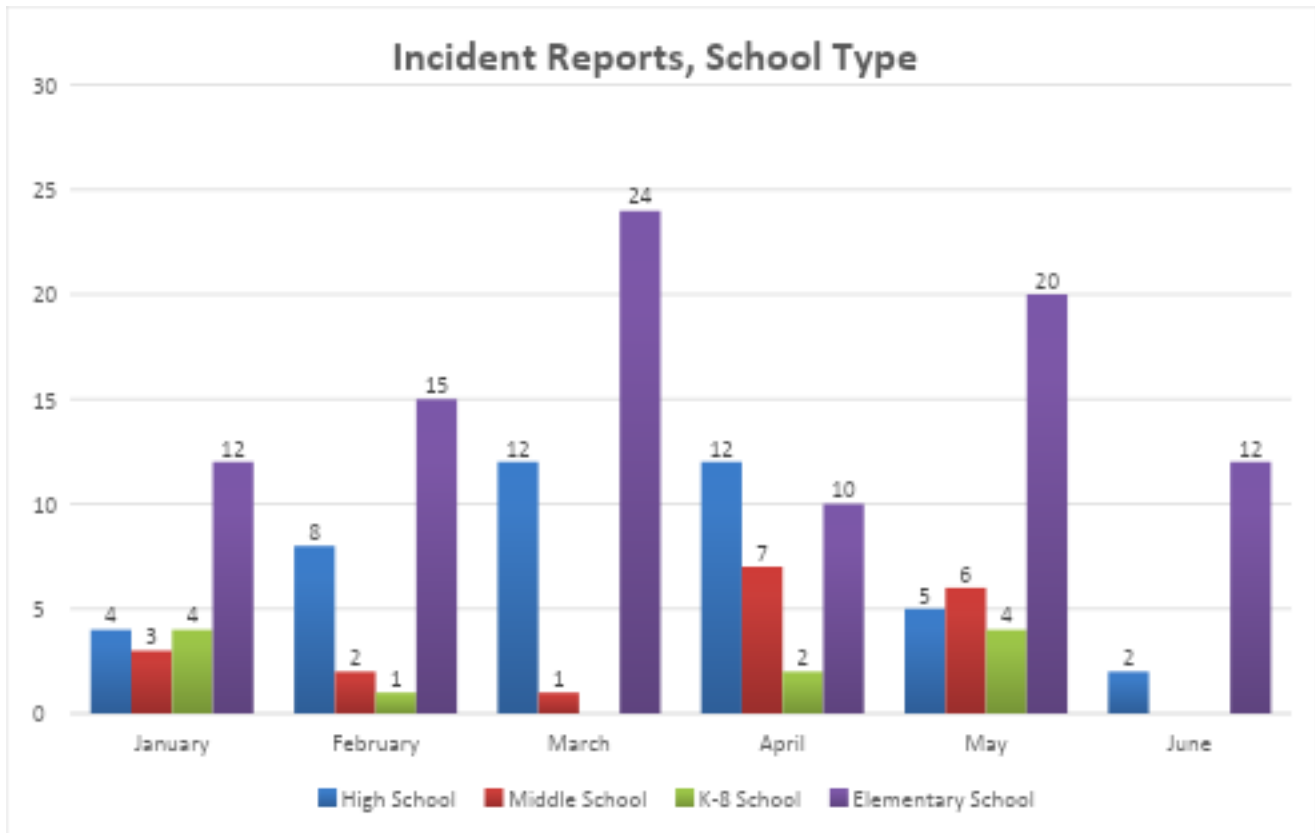
Monthly Summary



During Q3 and Q4 of SY25-26, there were a total of 166 incidents that occurred. These incidents fell into the following categories:

- EMS Assistance (Non-Fight/Assault Related) (46)
- Other (17)
- Missing Student Reports (12)
- Prohibited Items/Materials (9)
- Threats (Verbal / Cyber / Social Media) (3)
- Weapons (Founded or Unfounded) (5)
- Controlled Substances (2)
- Suspicious Activity (17)
- Sexual Assault/Misconduct (2)
- Vandalism (2)
- Dangerous Item (1)
- Robbery (1)
- Trespass (1)

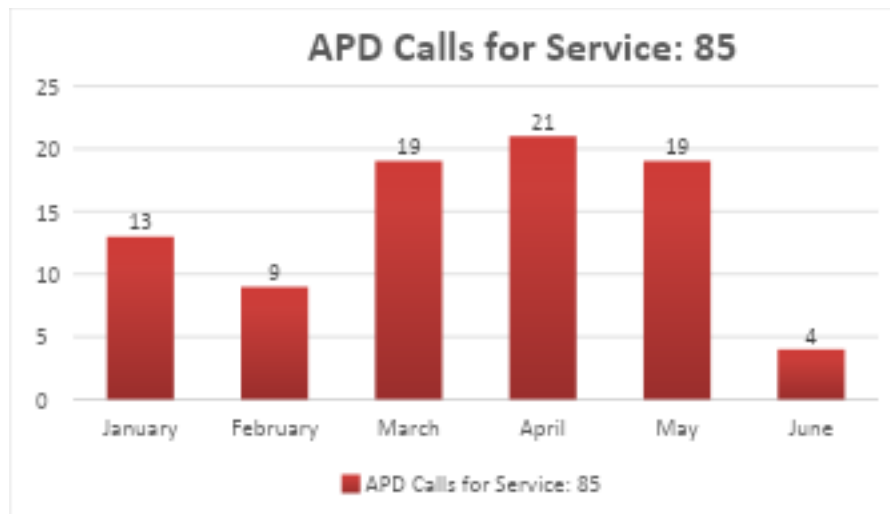

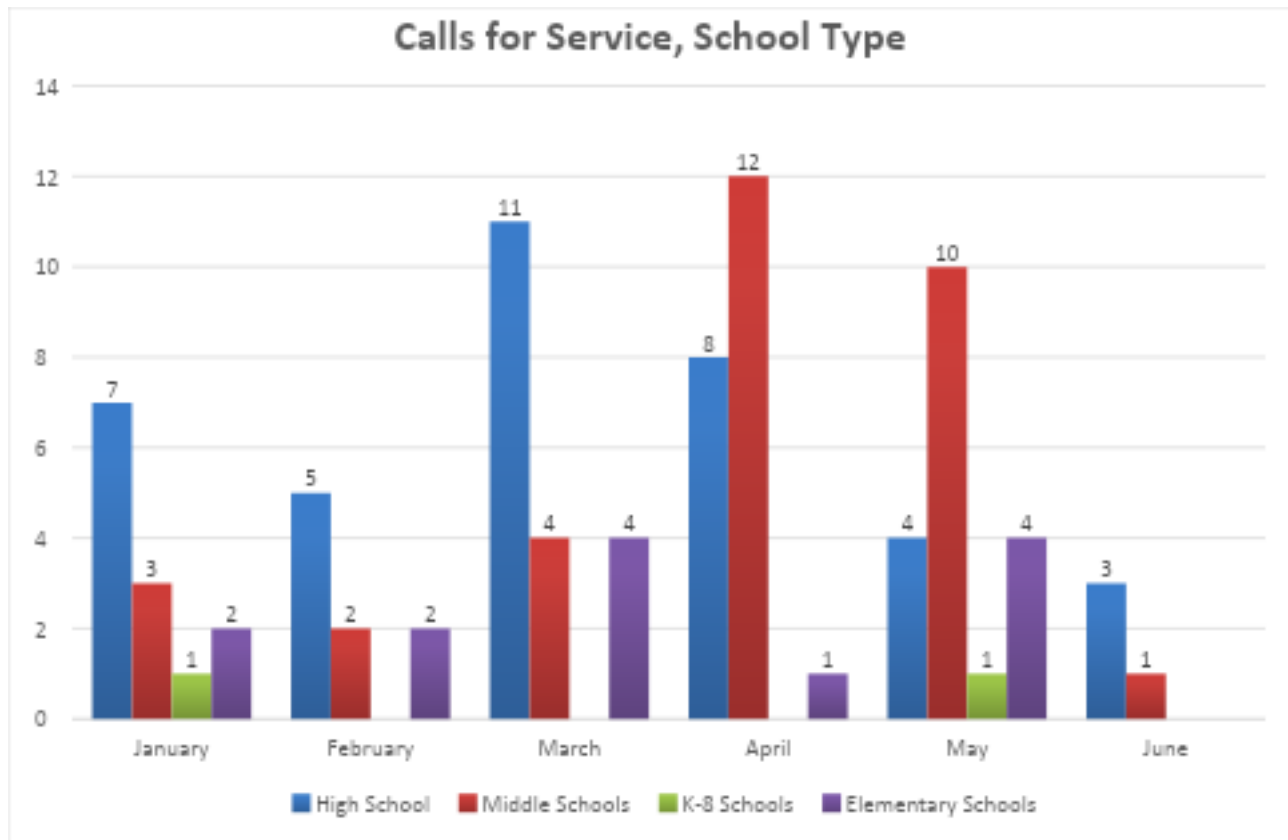
Total Calls for Service, Q3 & Q4 by Month

Total Calls for Service, Q3 & Q4 by School Type

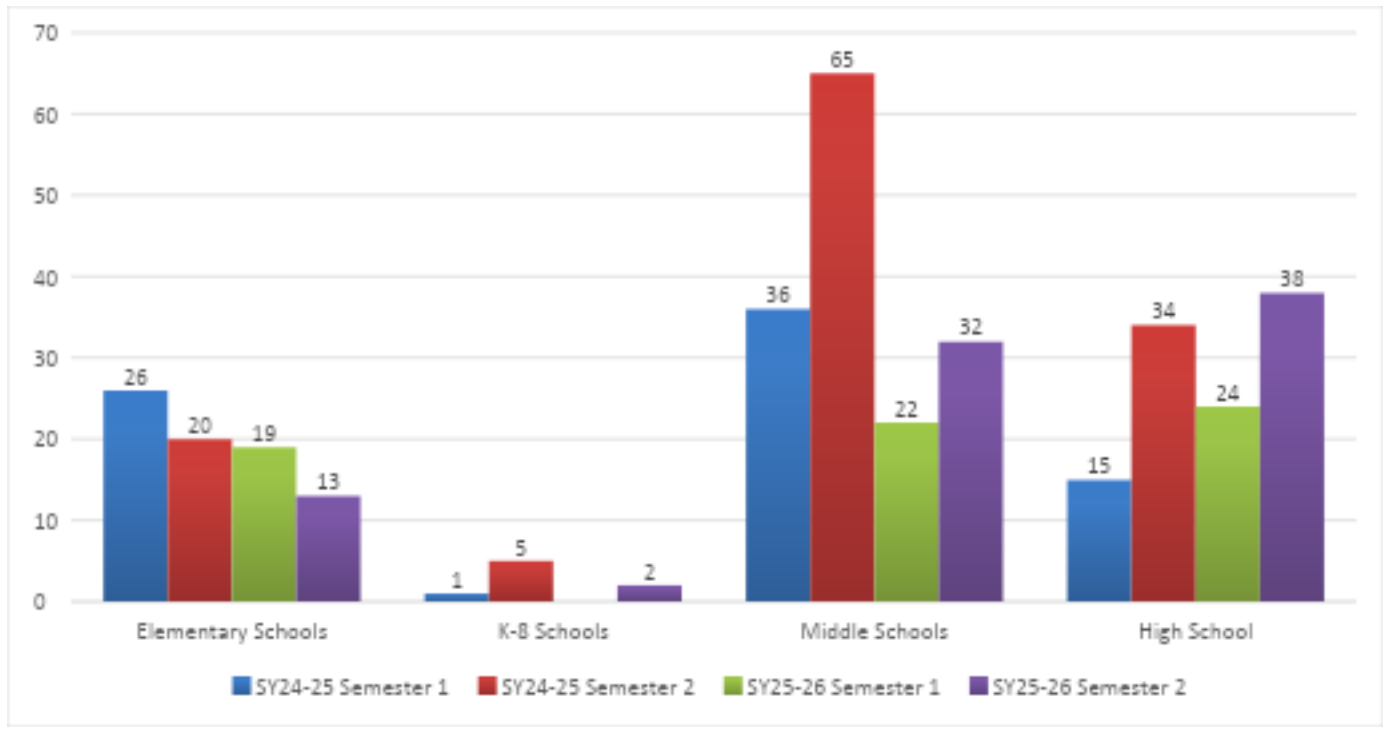

- **38** APD Calls for Service at the High School Level (*Previous Report 27*)

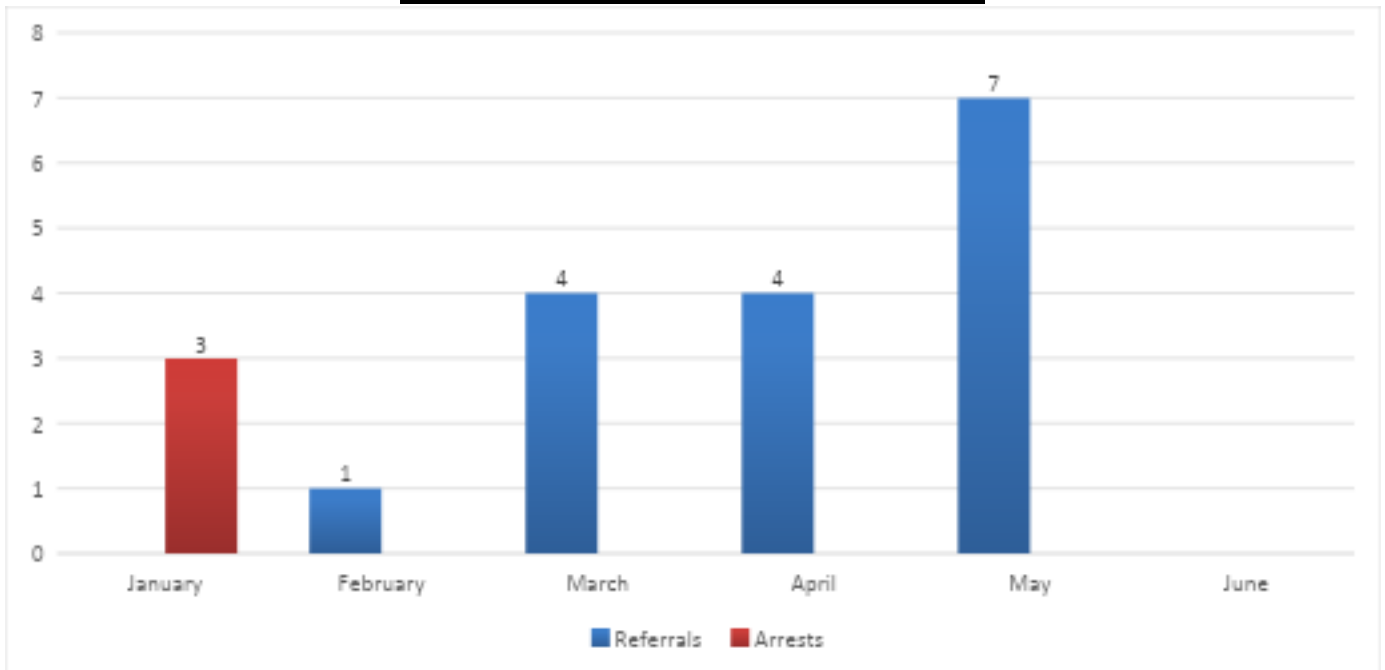

Arrests & Referrals: Monthly Comparison



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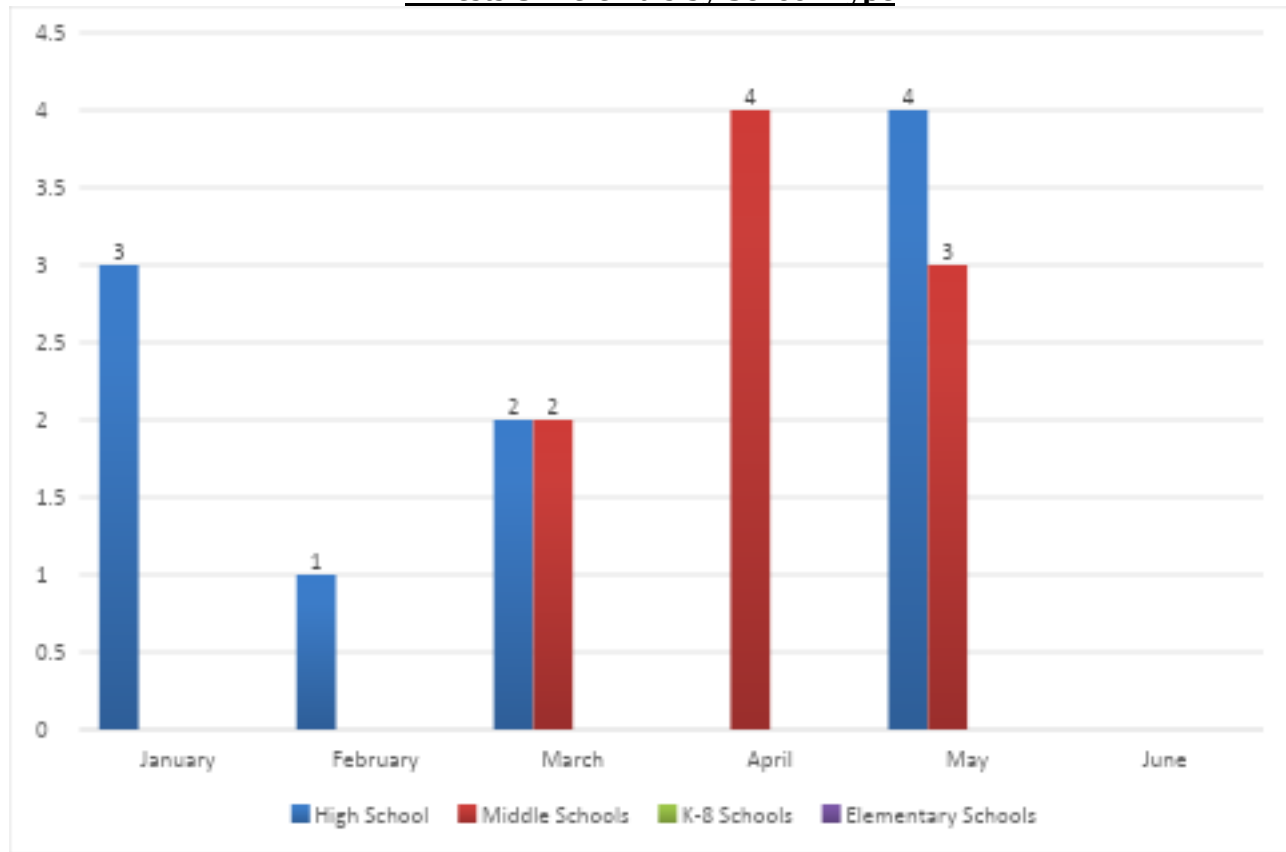
Q3 and Q4 August 2026

During Q3 and Q4 of SY2025-2026, there were a total of 16 students referred to the court and 3 students arrested.

Arrests/Referrals were made in regards to a violation of law on and off school grounds, in relation to the following categories:

- *Alcohol Possession (2) (On Campus Occurrence) (also had THC vape)
- Assault & Battery (4) (5 On Campus Occurrences, 1 Off Campus Occurrences)
- *Controlled Substance (2) (On Campus Occurrences) (also had alcohol)
- Weapons Possession: Knife (3) (On Campus Occurrence)
- Assault by Mob (4) (On Campus Occurrence)
- Robbery (3) (On Campus Occurrence)
- Trespassing (1) (On Campus Occurrence)
- Threat Over Airway (Text) (2) (Off Campus Occurrence)

Arrests & Referrals by School Type



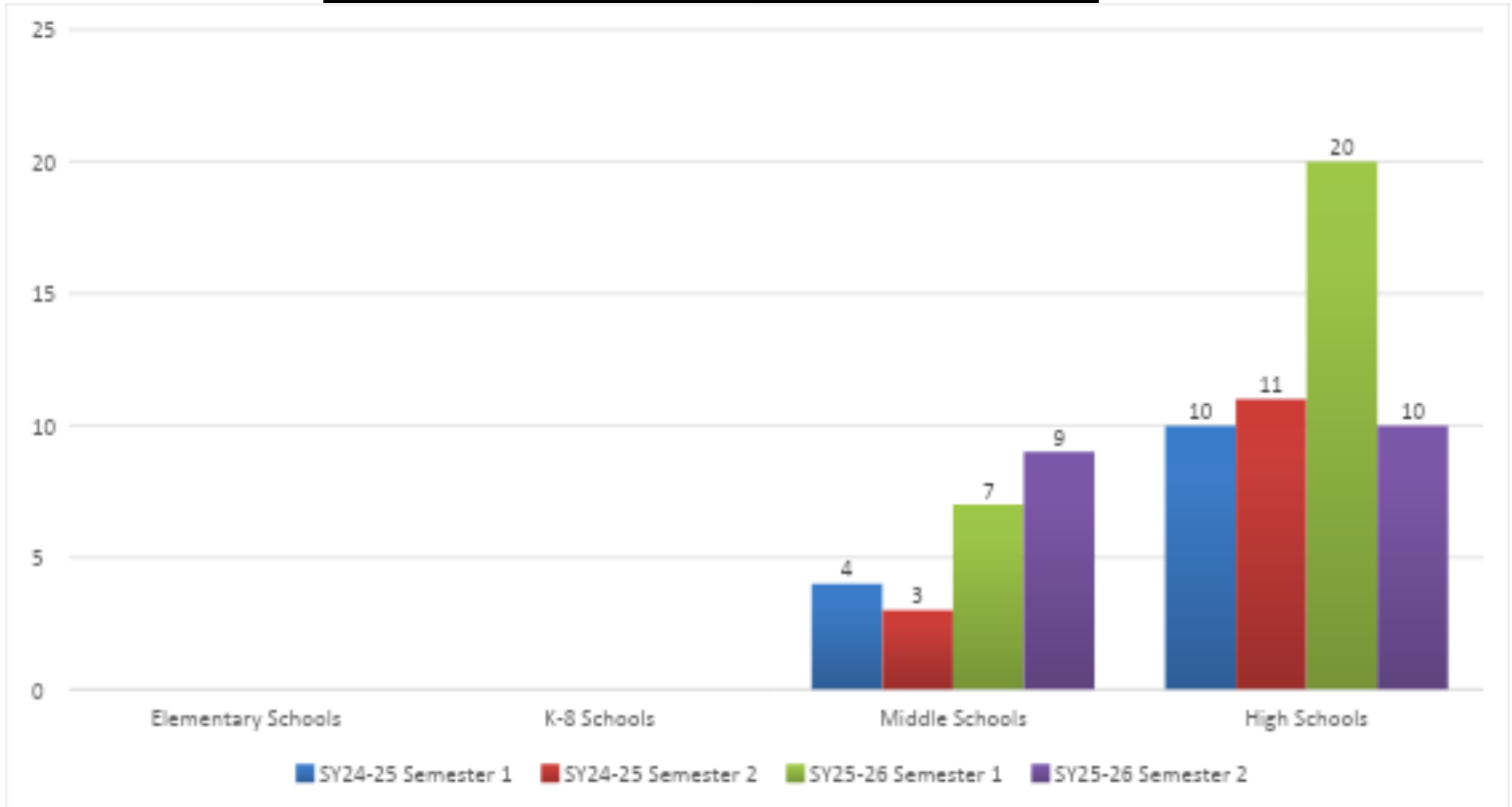
There were:
