(Housing, financial aid, etc.) - SJUSD files Cal Grant GPA verification for every senior unless you opt out. - Contact financial aid office at private universities to inquire about scholarship money. - FAFSA filing period Oct. 1 - Mar. 2 Apply!!	- Watch the mail for college acceptance letters. - Report in writing, ANY second semester class changes that differ from those stated on college application. - California Community College applications open Feb 1. - Check for emails from colleges and login to student portals often. Watch out for important deadlines. (Housing, financial aid, etc.) - FAFSA filing period Oct. 1 - Mar. 2 Apply!!	- Check email for the FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR). - Submit Community College applications by May 1 to get priority registration status. - Check for emails from colleges and login to student portals often. (SIR) before May 1 deadline	- Contact the financial aid office to make certain that your application is complete at your college. - Inform your counselor of your final decision.	- At senior check-out, indicate where you want your transcript sent. - Have a great summer!

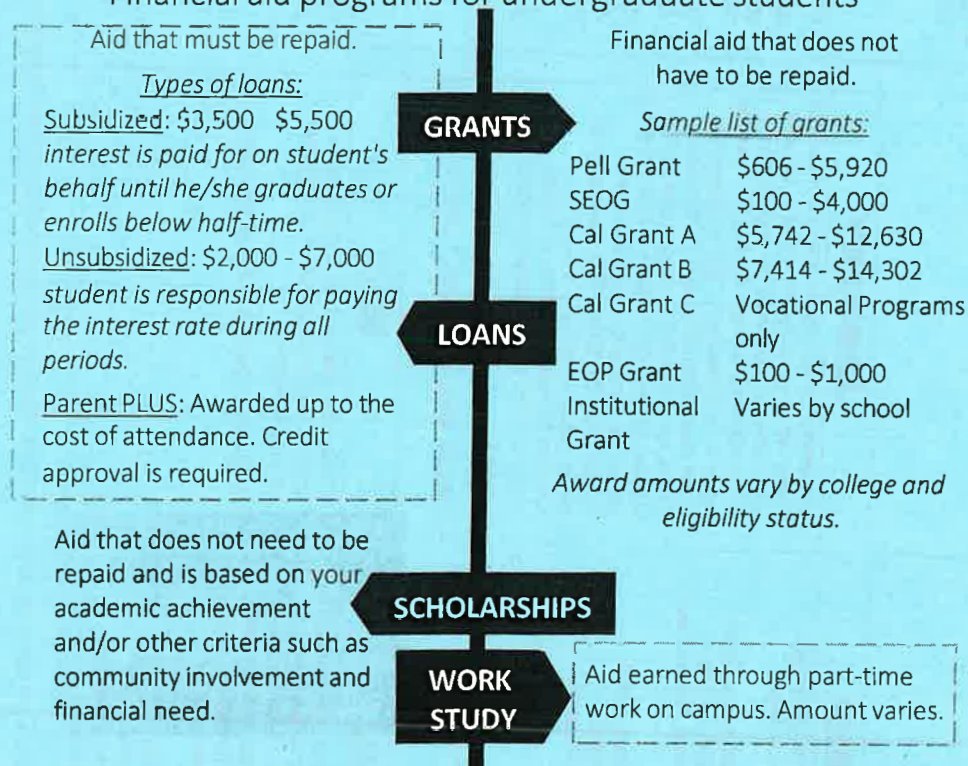
The costs of books and supplies, transportation, and personal expenses are estimates that may vary campus to campus.

3. Submit any follow-up documents that your college is asking for

Annual Priority Deadline: March 2

To receive financial aid every year...

1. RE-APPLY for aid every year (Application opens October 1st)
2. OBSERVE March 2nd deadline to be considered for all aid programs
3. MAINTAIN satisfactory academic progress toward a degree
