Chamber Orchestra Club

The OPHS Chamber Orchestra explores traditional and contemporary chamber string orchestra music in an advanced setting through rehearsals and performances. The club's intent is to develop independent student musicians who participate in an advanced ensemble, while providing a worthwhile educational activity for students interested in rehearsing, then performing orchestral music at live competitive and non-competitive concert events.

Eligibility: Open to students who are proficient on NYSSMA-rated solos at levels IV, V or VI on violin, viola, cello, double bass and harp. Members are required to attend weekly rehearsal meetings on a regular basis, are expected to practice and learn their ensemble music at home, and perform with the ensemble at community or school-related concerts and competitions.

Meetings: Weekly beginning in September and ending in June. Performance events TBA.

Special Events: Fundraising, school and community concerts and competitions.

Chess Club

The OPHS Fiddlers explore traditional Irish, Canadian and American fiddling as well as other non-classical music traditions through rehearsals and performances. Eligibility: Open to students who are proficient on traditional fiddle and stringed instruments. Members are required to attend weekly rehearsal meetings on a regular basis, and are expected to perform with the ensemble at scheduled community or school concerts.

French Culture Club

The purpose of this club is to provide the opportunity for students to experience a wide range of traditions from France and the French-speaking world.

French National Honor Society

Eligibility: Students in Level 4 Honors French are invited to apply during the second semester if they have maintained a 90 average or higher in all their high school French courses, have an overall 80 average or higher and have the required teacher recommendations.

Meetings: The Society Officers and Advisor determine a program of activities which center on French language and cultural events.

Special Events: The Induction Ceremony takes place in April in conjunction with the National Latin and Spanish Honor Societies.

Freshman Class

Junior Class

The Junior Class plans and organizes activities for the Class and the entire school. The Junior Class plans the Senior Prom and serves to train student leaders. Members have many opportunities to volunteer for functions throughout the school year.

Latin National Honor Society

Eligibility: Students in Latin III are invited to apply during the second semester if they have maintained an average of 90 or higher in the first two quarters of Latin III plus the fourth quarter of Latin II and have an overall average of 90 or higher.

Meetings: The Society officers and Adviser determine a program of activities which center on the Latin language and cultural events.

Special Events: The Induction Ceremony takes place in April in conjunction with the French and Spanish National Honor Societies.

MasterMinds - Varsity

Adviser: Dr. Rominger

Knowledge-based competitive team. MasterMinds will travel to other schools, or host at OPHS, for competitions within their league. There are standings, statistics and playoffs. There is also a NYS Championship along with connections to colleges and universities that participate in College Quiz Bowl. The knowledge range is wide: pop culture, sports, history, science, literature, etc.

Eligibility: All students are welcome

Meetings: Practices are one a week (roughly) from September through April. Competitions are once a month from November through May.

MasterMinds – Junior Varsity

Knowledge-based competitive team. Questions are more geared toward the Freshman/Sophomore level. MasterMinds will travel to other schools, or host at OP, for competitions within their league. There are standings, statistics and the possibility to be moved up to Varsity. The knowledge range is wide: pop culture, sports, history, science, literature, etc.

Math Club is a member of the Niagara Frontier Math League. Its members are interested in complex arithmetic equations and their solutions. They are given the chance to test their skills against other schools at competitions throughout the area.

Media Productions Club

Media Productions Club provides the school, students, faculty/staff and community a resource for video productions. It is a group of hardworking, dedicated students interested in the planning and producing of audio and video productions. Students learn to plan, set-up, script, shoot video footage, edit and make final video productions as planned. Media Productions Club is also responsible for the pre and postproduction of our school's QTV morning show. This requires occasional time after school to shoot and edit video footage for use on the program.

III and work on the morning show daily.

Medical Career Interest Group (MCIG) is a collection of students who are pondering careers in the medical field. Future nurses, doctors, pharmacists, and anyone else who is interested in learning about opportunities that exist in the healthcare industry should plan on joining us. Representatives from local medical schools will be visiting to teach us about the educational opportunities that exist at their institutions and give us some tips for the high school years that will help with the collegiate application process

Mock Trial

The Mock Trial Club focuses on developing skills as courtroom participants. Students will be actively involved in the learning of courtroom procedures by practicing trial techniques. Members are provided with the opportunity to prepare as witnesses or attorneys for a court case and then to compete as a team against area schools in a state role-playing trial based competition.

Model United Nations

Model United Nations is committed to developing oratorical excellence in students at OPHS. Each year, club members will prepare for and participate in a national Model United Nations. Students are trained to research and write legislation. At Model Congress, students will debate proposed legislation, both in committee and in full sessions of the House and Senate with students from across the country. Fundraisers will be held to help defray trip expenses.

NHS (National Honor Society)

Adviser: Mrs. Karalus

Selection to the NHS is an honor, not a right. This honor is awarded by a faculty selection committee, which is endorsed by the principal and acts on behalf of the entire high school faculty. In the spring of each year, junior students with a five semester average of 90% or higher are notified of their initial eligibility. Students must be in attendance at Orchard Park High School for at least one full semester before the selection. Qualified students interested in being considered for membership are asked to fill out evaluation forms with information about themselves. These are given to four recommenders, two must be high school teachers with whom they are familiar. In addition, all faculty members are invited by the selection committee to make comments about eligible students. Students are selected for NHS membership by a majority vote of the five-member faculty selection committee. The following are the criteria for evaluation: **scholarship, service to school and community, leadership in school and community, and character**. This is a confidential process subject to only limited review. The NHS candidates agree to abide by the licit decisions of the selection committee. There is no quota. Inducted students are expected to be active in a peer-tutoring program sponsored by NHS and community service hours their senior year. Parents and students may request detailed copies of the national and local rules of the National Honor Society, as well as the faculty committee's selection criteria, from the appropriate House principal.

OP Impact

This club is all about “impacting” the school and community in a positive manner. We are an all-inclusive and diverse group of students that want to make people smile. We promote random acts of kindness in and outside of school. Our goal is to inspire creativity, positivity, and gratefulness. Special Events: Gratitude tree, pumpkin painting for staff, office decorating, carnation sale, food drive, wellness events, egg hunt, and much more.

Orchard Park Educational Outreach

Advisers: Ms. Adel & Mrs. Holtermann

Our mission statement is very simple. OPEO is committed to "lending a helping hand at home and in the global community." To that end, we are a student volunteer organization that has regularly served at the City Mission, Buffalo area women’s shelters and done extensive work at Vive La Casa, a halfway house and refugee center in Buffalo as well as set up homes for refugees through Journey’s End. Our Outreach members have also worked with local Orchard Park retirement homes teaching the residents technology. In addition, we make favors for special dinners for homeless shelters, soup kitchens and retirement homes and collect clothing and funds for area foster children. Our international efforts have been directed toward such projects as supporting a Bosnian orphanage, providing school supplies for students in El Salvador and schools for girls in Afghanistan. Our volunteer activities can vary from year to year depending on the needs of the community and the special interests of our members.

Eligibility: All current students in grades 9-12

Meetings: 2 meetings per month from September to June and additional meetings as needed.

Special Events: Fundraisers to support our projects throughout the school year.

Pep Club

The main purpose of Pep Club is to promote school spirit throughout activities such as the Homecoming parade, Pep Rally, Powder Puff football game and Homecoming Carnival. Pep Club supports additional special events to promote school spirit as initiated by club members.

Special Events: Organize Homecoming activities and events, sponsor school/community spirit activities.

Pulse (Literary Magazine)

Pulse is the Orchard Park High School literary magazine and is dedicated to publishing the work of talented writers and artists at Orchard Park High School. Students in **Pulse** are responsible for soliciting and selecting works to be published and doing all typing, layout, and paste-up work required to publish the magazine. **Pulse** is published under various deadlines.

Students must have good organizational skills and be able to work under pressure.

Quaker Marching Band (QMB)

The Quaker Marching Band is an organization of students who wish to further their musical capabilities. Marching Band competes in various parades and field shows. They also participate in the New York State Field Band Conference/Competition.

Eligibility: Open to all students. Wind and percussion performers must be in Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble or Orchestra. Not a requirement for Color Guard.

Meetings: Two meetings each week plus competitions

Special Events: Local parades, local competitions, and the NYS Field Band Competition.

Racial Equality Alliance Club

Our goal is not to admire social justice and human rights issues, but to effectively act to help eliminate them. We will bring in speakers that can educate our members and other students about social justice and human rights issues at home and around the globe, along with their potential solutions. We will provide students with the means to effectively advocate for the causes while also organizing demonstrations and raising funds for a variety of local and international humanitarian organizations.

Senior Class

The Senior Class unifies the twelfth grade and raises funds for functions of the class. It develops class leaders and participants for class-related activities. Representatives from this class attend various school activities.

Eligibility: All seniors are members

Meetings: Varies

Special Events: Participation in Homecoming events, Class Picture, Senior Picnic, Senior Banquet, and Graduation

Sign Language Club

Advisers: Mrs. Calder

This organization is designed to teach American Sign Language to the students of OPHS with an emphasis on an education about the ASL community as well as the creation of a more inclusive environment where communication is possible for all.

Eligibility: Open to all students

Meetings: Twice per month

Special Events: Movie screening; Guest speakers involved with the deaf community.

Society of Science Scholars (SSS)

Advisers: Mrs. Stady & Ms. King

Eligibility: A student is eligible to apply for membership if they are enrolled in a full year chemistry course, or have formerly completed a full year chemistry course. At the end of the second quarter of each academic year, students with an overall average of 90% or higher across all classes at the time of application and a cumulative average of 95% or higher in all high school science courses are notified of their initial eligibility. Eligible students must complete an application and must turn it in on or before the due date. Applications will be collected and verified by The Society advisors. Acceptance letters will be distributed with an induction ceremony to follow. Inducted students continue their membership by

- Maintaining an active role in science related activities such as:
 - Active membership in at least one science club at OPHS (Sustainability Club, STEM Club, Medical Careers Interest Club, Science Club, Math/Physics Society) which may include:
 - Attending lectures sponsored by one of the above clubs
 - Participating in an OP Elementary or Middle School “Science Nights”
- Each year members must engage in society sponsored activities including:
 - Inauguration event recognizing new members
 - Attendance at society meetings
- A member must maintain behavior that is acceptable to the guidelines as outlined by the school’s code of conduct.
- Members must maintain an overall academic average of 90% or higher

Meetings: Quarterly member meetings

Special Events: See above eligibility requirements.

Sophomore Class

Advisers: Mr. Botticelli & Mrs. Lexner

The Sophomore Class unifies the tenth grade, and raises funds for functions of the class in the present and in the future. It also develops class leaders and participants for class-related activities.

Representatives of the class attend various school activities.

Eligibility: All sophomores are members; homeroom reps are selected.

Meetings: Two per month or as needed, must attend select STAP COMM meetings.

Special Events: Participation in Homecoming events, fundraising, class and school activities, community events and community service.

Spanish Culture Club

Adviser: Mrs. Connors

The purpose of this club is to allow the members to share their knowledge and appreciation of the Spanish culture and language with each other and the general school community.

Eligibility: Open to all students

Meetings: Third Wednesday of each month

Special Events: Participation in Spanish culture activities with other clubs and community members.

Spanish National Honor Society

Adviser: Mrs. Holterman

The Spanish National Honor Society is a nationally chartered organization. Being nominated for membership is an honor and a privilege that is reserved for the very best foreign language students in the country.

Eligibility: Students are nominated by their Spanish teachers if they have earned a 90% cumulative average in Spanish III and Spanish IV Honors. Seniors are eligible for the recognition of excellence if they maintain these grades and continue on with the Spanish Language at the AP level. Upon completion of an application, must agree to become an active member in the Spanish National Honor Society Club. Induction takes place in the spring of the Level 4 Honors Spanish course. Students also participate in activities to enhance their knowledge of and celebrate the cultures of the Spanish Speaking World.

Meetings: Will be announced

Special Events: The Spanish National Honor Society Club collects money/items that are contributed to various charitable organizations.

Stage Crew

Adviser: Mrs. Russo

Stage Crew is a group of students responsible for learning to operate and run the auditorium equipment. This includes building scenery, running lights, coordinating back stage activities, and running the sound equipment. All of these activities are done during the school play and musical.

Eligibility: Open to all students

Meetings: Varies

Special Events: High School Play and Musical

STAP Comm (Students, Teachers, Administrators, Parents Committee)

Advisers: Mrs. Maciejewski, Mr. Bove & Mrs. Feldman

STAP Comm is Orchard Park High School's unique form of student government and one of the shared decision-making units at the high school. STAP Comm is a group of students, teachers, administrators, and parents, who address student

issues, serve as a forum for discussion, develop leadership skills, and promote school spirit.

Eligibility: Open to all students. Student officers are elected by their peers. Other student members include Homeroom Representatives and Extension officers. Teacher representatives are selected from the high school faculty. All high school administrators are members. Parent representatives are selected from parents of currently enrolled high school students by the high school PTO.
