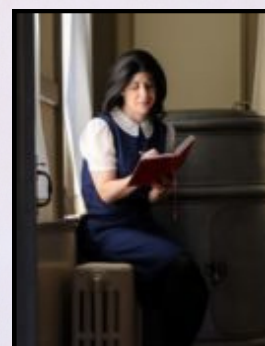
One Act of Courage:
