 - Opportunities—upon request—for regular meetings where families and stakeholders can offer suggestions and actively participate in decisions related to their children's education. We will respond to such suggestions as promptly as possible.

- Information about school programs, family and community engagement activities, and related meetings will be shared in a format that is understandable and consistent. Alternative formats will be provided upon request, and, to an extent practicable, in languages that families and caregivers can understand.

Monthly parent newsletters, translation services, bilingual services provided by the ESL teacher, parent programs, meetings, and events will be communicated via flyers, IVRs, emails, and text messages; and translated as needed.

E. DISSENSION PROCESS

Clara E. Westropp will submit any comments/concerns to the CMSD Office of Family and Community Engagement if the schoolwide plan and/or parent and family engagement policy is not satisfactory to parents and family members.

F. SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

 - Strategies for monitoring student progress
 - Ways to collaborate effectively with educators to enhance student achievement

- **Partnering with families to educate school staff**—including teachers, support personnel, principals, and leaders—on the value of family contributions. Together, we'll explore best practices for communication, collaboration, and inclusive engagement that treat families as equal partners in education.
- **Integrating family engagement efforts across programs**, including federal, state, and local initiatives such as public preschool. We'll also support family resource centers and provide materials that encourage and celebrate family participation in every aspect of their child's educational journey.

H. ACCESSIBILITY

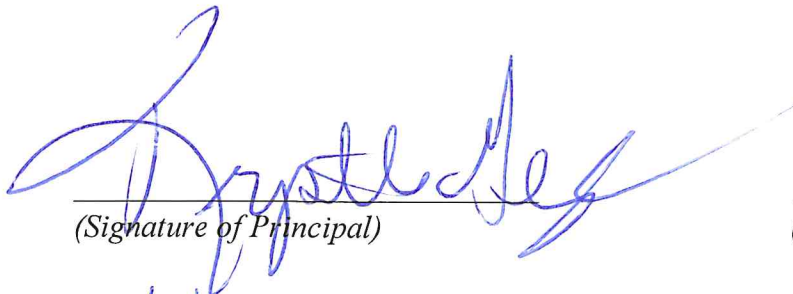

Flyers and messages will be translated into parent language.

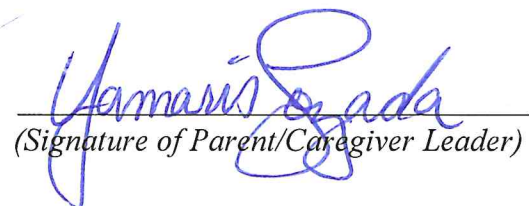
This School Parent and Family Engagement Policy has been developed jointly with, and agreed on with, parents and families of children participating in Title I, Part A programs.
